If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸But now God has arranged the members in the body, each and every one of them, as he desired. ¹⁹If they were all one member, where would the body be? ²⁰But as it is, there are many members, yet one body.

Communion Practices of this Congregation

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at St. John's every Sunday in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord Jesus gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. In addition to the members of this congregation, visitors from our sister LCMS congregations and other Lutheran denominations with whom we enjoy altar fellowship are invited to join us at the Lord's Table. Dear Friends,

During the last few years, some of the children in the Bluff neighborhood have attended our Sunday school and other children's programs. Some are very interested in attending worship and have sometimes worshiped beside Dawn at our 9:00 service. While we thank God for those whom we have reached, we recognize that there are so many more children and young people whom God has called us to connect to His Son, Jesus. To that end, Council has approved our offering a Sunday afternoon service (beginning in our parking lot and moving into the Fellowship Hall as Fall approaches) in which the music, message, and prayers are more centered upon the elementary and middle school grades. Grownups are welcome to join them. We will begin with a word puzzle (like Wheel of Fortune) on a sheet of plywood in which the children as a group solve the puzzle in order to discover the Bible story or theme that I will cover in my message. We will have prayers, reading from the Scriptures, and an age-appropriate message (sermon) - and of course, music. During a song just before the message, we will distribute to each child (who will be sitting upon blankets) a paper sack of warm popcorn, snow cone, or other treat. The idea is - instead of asking the children to sit quietly and pay attention to the message - we will give them a snack to assist them in this endeavor. Busy hands and mouths make for listening ears and hearts. We will send them home with a Bible verse that they are asked to share with someone in their household.

This will be considered a second worship service for the congregation, and those who attend will be invited to participate in the full life of St. John's, including the 9 am service. Our hope is that this service will feature some baptisms (upon parent/guardian approval) and that some of the children will begin our Confirmation ministry. The Bluff neighborhood is teeming with children and young people whom God has called the people of St. John's to reach with the saving message of the Gospel. Doing this on our own would be overwhelming, but led and equipped by the Spirit this is very much within our reach. We will need volunteers to assist us in set-up/teardown, passing out snacks, and being a welcoming presence. We envision volunteers serving one Sunday a month on a rotating basis. The services will be held on Sunday afternoons at 2:00 pm and will begin on July 11th.
