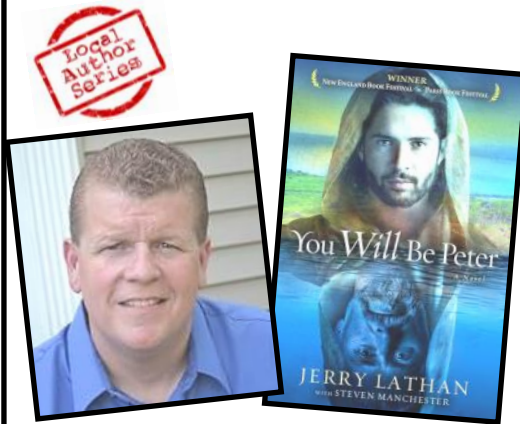

An independent demonstrator for Stampin' Up!, Tina will guide participants as they make three greeting cards to take home. Classes are limited to 10 people.



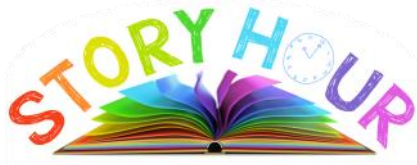

ALL winter long

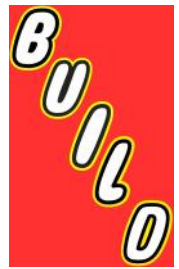

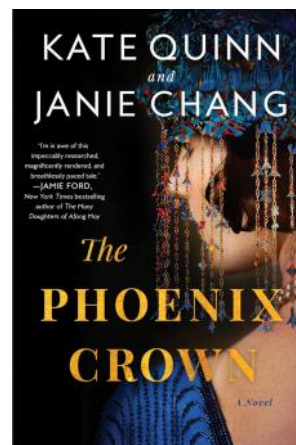
