Dear Innsbrook Community Member,

As a follow up to the statement the Trustees of the Village of Innsbrook released on Friday, March 13, 2020. The Village of Innsbrook would like to encourage all residents to follow the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines found on their website at <u>https://www.cdc.gov/</u> including, but not limited to, mass gatherings or large community events. Individuals and organizations should cancel or postpone in-person events that consist of 10 people or more throughout the U.S.. Village residents are urged to practice social distancing during this time to control the spread of COVID-19. **Social distancing** means remaining out of congregate settings, avoiding mass gatherings, and maintaining distance (approximately 6 feet or 2 meters) from others when possible. On Monday, March 16, 2020, the White House, in conjunction with the CDC, released The President's Coronavirus Guidelines for America -- 15 Days to Slow the Spread of COVID-19). The Village has attached these guidelines for the Innsbrook residents to review.

Adhering to these guidelines and those of the CDC, as of March 18, 2020 the Village of Innsbrook, Village Hall, will be closed until April 6, 2020. At which time we will reevaluate the situation. All meetings and gatherings of the Village of Innsbrook have been cancelled during this time. In addition, Notary services will not be offered during this time. Village Administrator and Trustees electronically or by telephone.
