Ms. Sorrentino replied that she would have Chief Helinski check into the allowance of signs posted on Wilkins Avenue as it is a County road. If allowed, she would make sure they are posted. Mr. Barron stated that he has a contact within the County that may be able to assist with this request. Ms. Sorrentino asked if he could send her the contact information.

He asked Ms. Sorrentino to discuss the reasons for this Ordinance.

Ms. Sorrentino stated that over the past couple years she has received complaints about trees that are dying or encroaching on other properties. There are no current Ordinances to address trees, so the Borough cannot force the removal or maintenance of them. She added that many people complain because the Borough cannot force a property owner to remove or maintain a tree even if it becomes hazardous to neighboring properties.
