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When we truly view God's love as being the transformative force that it is and truly embrace the fact that we are the conductors of that great force, it's enough to be breathtaking. We are planted in an area of such incredible need, it is truly a modern day mission filed like no other. We have so much as a society and yet we are spiritually bankrupt. There is an abundance of food, clothing and shelter, but children and families still going without. There is technology like we have never seen before since the dawn of mankind, but very little skill or aptitude in the way of day to day existence and survival. I am not intending to make a blanket statement, so please know that I am aware that there are exceptions to the rule, but I truly believe that in communities such as the one we serve in (and there are hundreds of very similar communities across our state, thousands nationwide), we are seeing a cultural landslide that is beyond disturbing. It's as though there is a "Recipe for Societal Disaster Cookbook" somewhere and it is being followed precisely. Faith and family are eroded into non-existence and we have a drug epidemic that is growing teeth, gaining traction every hour of every day and never sleeps. Here at our center, we had a young woman come in right before Christmas who literally dropped her kids off with a relative and disappeared into the drug underworld for about 8 months. Three little boys. No mom. Eight months. To be honest with you, prior to this, she was one of our "better" moms who attend our center in that her children seemed to be a higher priority than that of others and yet this evil got a hold of her. Thank God she had relatives who stepped in and did the best they could, but still there was something that took this mother's heart and twisted it in such a way that the love for her sons couldn't hold a candle to the allure of the addiction. Thankfully, she came back. Thankfully, we have her back in our fold and hopefully she will stay safe and well. I can't promise you those three boys were well cared for, or are even now. I can't promise you they weren't victimized as abuse of all kinds is so rampant. I can however promise

you that there are scores of kids just like them who were either not fortunate enough to have a family member or friend to step in to care for them or fortunate enough to be spared being put in the care of someone who would continue the pattern of abuse and neglect and were placed in foster care instead

where they await a home that will provide & care for them.

In closing, a key element of our mission here at Life Saver Ministries is prevention—preventing the choices that lead to the devastating lifestyles and continued patterns of domestic violence substance abuse, unplanned pregnancies, and every other issue of life that God's Word has the remedy for. Part of prevention is truly reaching lives in a proactive manner BEFORE horrible decisions are made, BEFORE consequences heap difficulty on a young life, BEFORE a life is derailed from unlimited potential to unending despair. Please consider, prayerfully and fervently, how God is calling you to get involved in conducting His love into a profoundly broken system that is striving to rescue kids who are truly trapped in situations that they have no control over and no escape from apart from another human being's sacrificial love. There are opportunities forthcoming to become a certified foster parent. There are opportunities for us to shine with blinding brilliance into a dark and hurting community with the kind of light that can only be conducted from the Light of the world through the hearts of His people. If ever there was a time to dive in with reckless abandon, the time is now.

His love never fails. His strength renews us daily. His love knows no limits. His love casts out fear.

Facts & Figures...

In 2015, there were 5,172 children in Foster Care awaiting adoption. (The numbers continue to climb.)

In 2015, the healthcare costs of the opiod addiction epidemic were over \$1,255,668,294

There are over 26,000 children currently in foster care with nearly 700 awaiting adoption and over 3,000 likely to be freed for adoption within the year.

## Home to Home & Heart to Heart

Having spoken to some families who have adopted children from foster care locally, here's what they have to say:

"I honestly can't imagine where my daughter would be if she wasn't with me. She was set to age out of the system, had life threatening health issues and no one to advocate for her. God truly worked a miracle in her life when He brought us together. My daughter is a healthy young woman now, who, despite some physical disabilities, works full time, drives, has her own apartment and loves the Lord. It's no exaggeration to say that God saved her life and it's a privilege to have been part of Him doing that."

"Looking back, I almost wish we had adopted while our older biological kids were younger so that this is all they know. I think it would have been a greater service to our older children to have known nothing else but an open home and caring for others through foster care from the very beginning. I know God's timing is perfect, but I would really encourage families who are hesitant to get involved to know that the best gift they can give their children is training in the faith and molding their hearts to look like God's. When that is the reality from day one, it becomes their "normal", so anything short of not helping others and having an open home seems weird to them. I think it can be perceived as taking something away from kids to expect them to share all that God has given them — home, parents, toys, space, life, in general, when really, it's the absolute best thing for them."
