Biography

Warren was born December 23, 1932 to the late Clarence A. and Verne V. (Kreh) Krohn on the family farm in Oliver township. He was a 1951 graduate of Elkton High School. Warren and his high school sweetheart, Grace Jean Braun, were married June 27, 1953. Warren and Grace were dairy and crop farmers in Meade Township. Warren was also a Funks Seed Corn Dealer, Real Estate Agent, Assessor, and School Bus Driver. Warren had a lifelong interest in politics and was committed to public service. He served as Meade Township Assessor, Meade Township Supervisor, and as a member of the boards of directors for Huron County Social Services, Huron Community Fair, Central Huron Ambulance, Huron Community Mental Health, Thumb Industries, and Huron County Nature Center, as well as the Huron County Board of Commissioners, Laker School Board of Education and the Michigan Board of Veterinary Medicine. Warren was a member of the Elkton Missionary Church for more than 65 years. Warren and Grace were founding members of the Aim High Farm Bureau Group which met monthly for more than 60 years. Warren and Grace had a passion for horses. Many of their dates were spent horseback riding with friends and after they married there were always horses on the farm. Brace Beemer's (The Lone Ranger of WXYZ radio in Detroit) horse Silver was a longtime resident as was Babe, an adopted wild mustang. Warren loved to ride. He was a member of the Huron County Sheriffs Posse and rode in parades all over Huron County. Warren always had a joke to tell (usually the same one) and a project in mind. One of his favorite things was "getting a bee together" AKA all the kids helping with the job. We miss you, Dad.
