

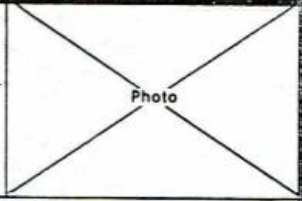

John Monaghan, born in Ireland c.1800, emigrated to Kelleys Island in 1848 with his large family. The 1850 Census data indicates that he was living next to Adaline Estes. \*a house on the north end of the Estes property. This would be the house originally occupied by the Monaghans. He was listed as a farmer, and he was probably engaged in managing the widow Estes' farm as we know was later done by L. Smith c.1880, (See ERI-1550). In 1859 Monaghan purchased the 88 ac. tract directly north of the Estes land, bounded by Woodford Rd. and what was later to be known as Monaghan's Rd. from Charles and Edward Kelley. He built his house the next year near the Woodford Rd. and almost opposite the house in which he had been living. According to Hills History it was surrounded by cedar woods with access through a large gate in the fence which enclosed the land.

His daughter, Mary, married Michael Hughes, another Irishman who had come to the United States in 1868, living first with his brother-in-law, John Reinheimer, and working as a fisherman. After his marriage he made his home with the Monaghan family, where his children were raised.

C.1910, the house was purchased by Henry Trieschman, Sr., and used to house his slaughter house employees. The northern 35 ac. of Monaghan land had been previously acquired by the Trieschmans.

In the early 1920's Fr. V. Chuloupka bought the house for his "Villa" volunteers (ERI-1663). C.1956, when the State purchased the land for Park purposes, the house was moved to its present location.

44. (Cont'd.) with summer cottages, it once was lined with vineyards and used by the several farmers in the area to drive their cattle back and forth to water and to pastures north of Woodford Rd.
