Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk



I was recently reading an article on faith and honeybees. Such a strange combination, I wondered how small venomous creatures could be allied with faith. I know a little bit about honeybees, like we are losing them, they are necessary for pollination, and we need pollination for our food to grow, so they are very important little creatures. I knew they live in hives, have honeycombs, produce honey (which bears, and humans like to eat), and which is a natural antibiotic. Honey will never spoil. That is the extent of what I know about honeybees, other than, from childhood experience, their stingers hurt.

I've never paid any more attention to them. So, I was interested by the comments of Kristen Bell, one of the persons quoted in the article, who was raised around beehives and now has them herself. I quote her, "Bees are always teaching us something. They are a community. One honeybee cannot live by itself. I think it's a great example of humankind. Every creature in the beehive is working for the success of that colony. I think God is telling us that we are to be doing the same thing." 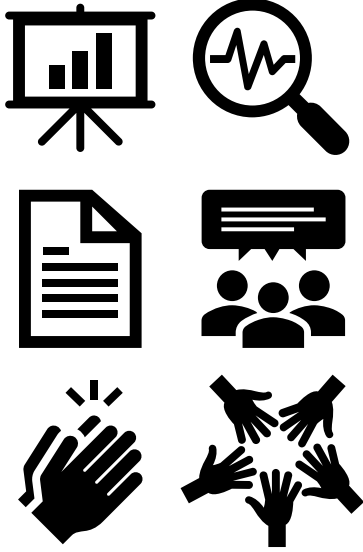

**SYNOD ASSEMBLY
REPORT BACK**



The first, and hopefully last, virtual NWPAsynod Assembly opened June 11, 2021, with prayer and worship. Bishop Lozano led the Assembly and looked well; it was his first time leading Assembly.

Thank you to Joe and Anita Byrne for also attending, and for Joe’s thoughtful questions raised during the time of voting.

First on the agenda was a motion to include the Report of the Synod Secretary that was accidentally left off the agenda. After this motion passed the next item was the restructuring of Clusters into Conferences. The motion passed...

...What this means is that there will no longer be 3 separate Clusters in Erie, all the Erie area churches will be joined in one

Conference, effective July 17. The hope of this change is to encourage better communication, to have the churches become more engaged and active in spreading the gospel by bringing more shared ministry opportunities such as pub, nursing home, restaurant, coffee shop and other areas of shared ministry. Conferences are to meet at least once per year, in the spring. Each Conference has the autonomy to structure themselves, including whether they would like to elect a Conference Dean, a dean is not a requirement, but an option. There will now be 10 people on Synod Council, Synod Council acts as the Assembly when the church is not in Assembly. This will become effective after the Synod Council Meeting that takes place on July 17, 2021.

Following this, churchwide Assembly updates were discussed. Then it was adopted that all the places where the term Cluster are found in the wording of the constitution will be changed to Conference.

The next item was that of the celebration of Holy Communion being required at every Assembly. Since this was a virtual Assembly, that would not be possible. Many options were given, however it was accepted to add the wording “you are not obligated to do that which is beyond your ability,” with a bylaw change being forwarded to Synod Council.

A video message from Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was shared. Her message spoke of life in 2020 with the pandemic. Her call is to imagine the diversity as part of what God is doing, how we have been church together for the sake of the world. She left us with the quote “God’s plan has a church.”

All the Constitutional amendments were approved, with many of them relating to the replacement of the non-word “synodical” by the word “synod”.

All the persons who were nominated to serve on Synod positions as rewritten into Conference terms were elected. The treasurer gave a report and the 2022 operating budget of \$757,391.00 and projected mission support of \$664,000.00 was adopted.

RESPONDING TO LOCAL HUNGER



The West Millcreek Food Pantry provides services for over 145 families and Immanuel is going to move forward to begin collecting items in support of this ministry. Stan Holsopple has once again volunteered to facilitate this for Immanuel. Bring non-perishable items to church and place in the collection box or contact Stan & he

has even offered to pick up from you if needed.

They serve on average: 85 children under the age of 17, 332 adults, and 95 seniors from the 16506 and 16505 zip codes (Pittsburg Ave. to Millfair Rd., W. 38th to W.18th) every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month.

Then give out mostly nonperishable foods they purchase from the Food Bank. Once a month, they are able to purchase meat (chicken, pork and beef). They also receive perishable bread, “sweets”, dairy and fresh vegetables from the Food Bank on a refrigerated trailer.

Through their Senior Box program they are able to give needy seniors over the age of 60 an extra 35 pounds of food and 2 pounds of cheese a month. Last year they ordered and distributed over 65,000 pounds of food purchased from Second Harvest Food Bank.

They currently have 9 contributing churches and 25 volunteers who help with various jobs from giving out the food, unloading the produce trailer and unloading the monthly truck.

Please note - these items are not able to be purchased with food stamps so at times are much in need: personal care items, soap, dish soap, clothing detergent, paper products, pet food, prepared foods, vitamins, over the counter medicines, first aid products, diapers and tooth care products.

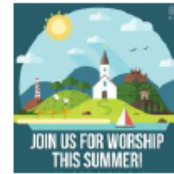
