## ***Instructions for Circulating Petitions***

**Thank you for helping to get John Pcolinski on the 2020 Republican Primary Ballot. In order to make sure that every signature you collect counts, please be aware of the following considerations:**

- **Please do not number the pages.** John's campaign will number all of the petition sheets right before he files them.
- In order to circulate John's petition, you must be at least 18 years old and a citizen of the United States.
- Each person signing the petition must do so in the circulator's personal presence. A petition sheet can only have one circulator. If someone else would like to circulate a petition, please give them their own sheet. Partial sheets that contain fewer than 10 names are perfectly acceptable as long as the affidavit at the bottom is completed and notarized.
- Petition signers must sign their own name and should not print their name unless that is how they routinely sign legal documents. A petition signer may sign only for themselves and not for a spouse or other relative.
- All petition signers must be registered voters residing in DuPage County.
- A petition signer may not sign nominating petitions for candidates of any *other* political party in this election cycle.
- After you have obtained as many signatures on a petition sheet as you can, please complete the affidavit at the bottom and sign it in front of a notary public. The petition sheet is not valid unless your signature is notarized. Once a petition is notarized, you should not make any changes or allow anyone else to add their name to the petition.
- Notarized petition sheets should be completed by November 15, 2019. We can pick them up if needed.
