Exhibitors are expected to read these rules and not enter any horse or pony unless they are prepared to abide by these rules. Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry or request the removal of any entry or person on the grounds without being liable.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules & Specifications of this show. Any discrepancies are the sole decision of management.

PRE-ENTRIES CLOSE -postmarked by September 10, 2022

* *Entry Fees: (all payments in US funds only)*

Regular class \$21.00 \$ or Championship Class or Stake \$26.00

Maine Event Stakes \$50.00 Office Fee \$25.00 / horse

Bandit Fee \$20.00 (in ring but not entered in office)

Post Fee: \$25.00 per horse for entries postmarked after September 10, 2022

Flat Fee 1: \$450 Includes Stall, Office & Fees, Unlimited Regular classes and up to 3 Championship Classes. You can enter more championships by simply adding the class fee. **This fee does not include any money classes.**

Flat Fee 2: \$305 includes Stall, Office & Fees, 5 Regular Classes & 2 Championships (money classes excluded in this option). You can enter money classes and more championships by simply adding the class fee. **This fee does not include any money classes.** NOTE: **Flat Fee Rate is per horse/rider combination;** add a second rider (5 classes/up to 2 championships) for \$120.

blank/signed check acceptable.

Special Classes entry cost per spec section.

*\$50.00 fee will be charged for NSF checks in addition to bank fees!

*Requests for a hold for an equipment change must be approved by show manager and must be done outside the ring. **There are forms in the office for this!** Holds will be the EXCEPTION to the show, not the normal routine. If you request it during the session, you must bring the hold form to the announcer's booth.

IMPORTANT

~You must enter/scratch all classes at least 30 minutes before the session it is in, or you will be charged a \$10 fee for the nuisance/hassle it causes our staff.

*Bedding, mats, stall dividers, hay, etc. will be available for purchase directly from the vendor. You must contact McCarthy Enterprises for hay and bedding. No Exceptions. **McCarthy Enterprises, 207-474-8952**

STABLING

Available after 9am on Thursday, 9/22 until Sunday, 9/25, 7pm.

All stalls are \$130each (Thursday-Sunday). Stalls are available on Wednesday for an additional charge of \$40 per horse stall. Truck in fee for showing out of trailer, \$20 for day, \$50 for show. Day stalls \$45. Stall fees do not include bedding.

Show Office Hours

Thursday, September 22, 11:00am Show office will open 45 minutes before the first class of the day and close 15 minutes after the last

Campers & Trailers with living quarters

Cost is \$130.00 for the show. Fill out requests for camper registrations on the entry form. Trailers with living/sleeping quarters using electricity or water are considered campers and will be charged the camper fee. (See Stabling section for arrival and departure times). Camper passes issued by the show office must be displayed near the camper door or camper may be charged as "unpaid". All campers must be parked in designated areas. Camper spaces near the coliseum in gate are reserved for show officials only. Absolutely no dumping of gray water on the ground. A dumping station is available. **Campers used but not using water or electricity will be charged a tent fee.**

Tents

Cost is \$75 for the show. This is for all tents.

NOTE:

If you plug in your trailer, you are responsible to pay for a camper fee. If you do so and do not have a camper pass from the office, you will be charged double! If you sleep in your horse trailer but do not plug in, you still must have a tent pass.

Prize Money & Ribbons

All classes labeled Championships (non-money) will award a Maine State Championship Jacket to the winner as long as there are 3 entries or more in the Championship class (if only 1 or 2 in a class, an alternate trophy will be presented) **Winners of the championship money class may choose a jacket in lieu of the Money.** The jacket includes State Champion Show Logo on back. Irene from Signet Embroidery will be on the grounds and you can add names, division, etc to the jacket at your cost, she will take any and all information and ship them to you. Anyone winning more than one jacket may take the extras or use as credit on extra embroidery on initial jacket. Some jackets will be mailed after the show as we may run out of sizes. Jackets will be presented in the ring for pictures. Six ribbons with Trophy/ Prize Money will be awarded in all classes. Premium cards will be presented in the ring & are the sole responsibility of the exhibitor once presented. Premium cards must be presented/used toward your show bill when settling your show bill in the office. Checks for prize money in excess of show bill will be issued only after show bill has been paid. Premium cards have no value after show office closes on final day of show.

Additional Information

- Arena lights will be off at 10:00pm or after the last class of the evening.
- No strollers in the chute area and near the in/out gate.
- NO SMOKING in the barns.
- Hauler parking – no parking in front of barns 1, 3 or 4. Parking between barns 1 & 2 must be
- **Bicycles & scooters are not allowed within 100 feet of ring (Except bike parade)**
- **Fire & Emergency lanes must be kept open at all times**
- **Dogs are NOT permitted on the rail or near the in-gate. All dogs must be on leashes or there will be a \$100 fine added to show bill!.**
- **Management reserves the right to refuse any entry or any person on the showgrounds without liability.**
- **Vaccinations.** Please include a copy of vaccination records for your horse(s) (EEE, WEE, West Nile, etc.) with your entries. It is strongly recommended that **all animals** on the show grounds be vaccinated for RABIES within one year from this show.
- **Proof of Negative Coggins** within the last three years is required for horses stabled in the State of Maine and within the last six months is required for out of state horses. Please include Coggins date (month/year) on your entry blank.
- **Registration Papers** are not required for entries in breed classes. Please include registration number(s) on your entry blank and include a copy of the papers with your entry form.
- **Checks must be received with entries made payable to DnL, and signed. The amount may be left blank. Entries received without the check being signed will be assessed a late fee.**

Please note: At this show we will follow the general rules for tack and regulations according to the general guidelines of the breed. If you are not following these guidelines, it may result in DQ. Ask permission 1st. When a class says Limit, it means 6 blues or less.

54. \$\$\$\$ Maine Event Pleasure Stake Stock Horse Qualifier

55. \$\$\$\$ Maine Event Pleasure Stake Saddle Horse Qualifier

101. \$1500 Maine Event Pleasure Stake

Top 6 in classes 54 & 55 are required to show back in class 101

Class entry fee is \$50 for qualifiers. No monies awarded in qualifiers. Championship class is free. All 3 classes to be judged both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/jog/alt gait, canter/lope both ways of the ring. Exhibitors may show any discipline (Saddle seat, hunt seat, western, dressage, etc) Judge may ask for extended gaits, and may require backing in the lineup. To be judged on pleasure, way of going, with slight consideration to conformation, with consideration given to type of horse/breed as represented by turnout. Definition for this show purposes: Saddle Horses are American Saddlebreds, Morgans, Friesians, Arabians, Plantation, Standardbreds. Stock Horses are Quarter Horses, Appaloosas, Thoroughbreds. Mustangs. If your breed is not listed, see show management for a determination.

52. \$\$ Maine Event Pleasure WT Stake Stock Horse Qualifier

53. \$\$ Maine Event Pleasure WT Stake Saddle Horse Qualifier

102. \$750 Maine Event WT Pleasure Stake

Top 6 in classes 52 & 53 are required to show back in class 102

Class entry fee is \$50 for qualifiers. No monies awarded in qualifiers. Championship class is free. All 3 classes to be judged both ways of the ring at a walk and trot/jog/alt gait. Exhibitors may show any discipline (Saddle seat, hunt seat, western, dressage, etc) Judge may ask for extended gaits, and may require halting on the rail. To be judged on pleasure, way of going, with slight consideration to conformation, with consideration given to type of horse/breed as represented by turnout. Definition for this show purposes: Saddle Horses are American Saddlebreds, Morgans, Friesians, Arabians, Plantation, Standardbreds. Stock Horses are Quarter Horses, Appaloosas, Thoroughbreds, Mustangs. If your breed is not listed, see show management for a determination.

SPECIALTY CLASSES:

58. Masters Pleasure Class Open

Open to horses 16 & over, &/or riders 40 & over!. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot or jog or alternate gait, and canter or lope. To be halted on the rail one way of the ring. Highest placing masters horse (based on 16 & over) receives The Waling Perpetual Trophy! Judged 40% on manners and 40% pleasure of ride, 20% conformation.

84. Non-Horse Halter /In-Hand Class (no entry fee)

This class is a halter class for anything but horses! To be judged on fun, originality, and whatever the judge wants to judge it on.

37. Maine Event Versatility Class

Horse shown Western first way of the ring (walk, jog/alternate gait/lope), then English second way (walk, trot/jog/alternate gait, canter/lope). One rider. Judged on pleasure of ride 50%, way of going 40%, Conformation 10%. After first way of the ring exhibitors will line up in center ring, when instructed, 2 people may come in and perform a pit crew action while swapping tack & changing clothes. Entries may not leave the ring during the swap.

59. \$100 Maine Event Freestyle Class

1 to 5 horses may be shown together. A skit or exhibition of style, comedy, costume with a story, precision riding, pas de deux musical freestyle, etc. Music to accompany is encouraged and will be supplied by competitor to the show staff prior to class. It's up to the competitor's imagination. Time for each skit/exhibition should be up to 90 seconds. To be judged on overall performance, creativity, attire &/or costume. Crowd participation is encouraged! Only winner is determined, no other placings will be awarded. Music will be turned off and skit ended at 90 seconds,

25. \$100 Maine Event Parade Class

This class is open to all breeds. We want a great parade of all breeds! We will do a walk only for the parade. Then we will do a judging of the class: To be shown at an animated walk and the parade gait, speed not to exceed 5 miles per hour. Horses to halt and stand quietly from both the walk and parade gait. To be judged 50% on performance, manners and conformation; 50% on appointments.

Other Pleasure Classes

6. Bridle Path Horse

130. Bridle Path Horse Championship (6)

To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein without loss of contact with horse's mouth. To be shown at a flat footed walk, collected trot, and easy canter. Must stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 50% on manners; 25% on performance and 25% on quality.

89. Family & Friends Pleasure Stake

Open to two family members or friends. One exhibitor to show one way of the ring and the second exhibitor to show the second way of the ring. To be shown at a walk and trot/jog. Excessive speed will be penalized. To be judged on manners, performance and quality. Full show clothes are not required. Shirt, pants and boots are required. Stake class entry. Jackets to winners.

42. Hunter Pleasure Horse Open

133. Hunter Pleasure Horse Championship (42)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring maintaining light contact with horse's mouth. To be judged on manners, performance, quality, presence, substance and soundness

20. Ladies Pleasure Horse

142. Ladies Pleasure Horse Championship (20)

To be shown at a walk, trot/jog/alt gait and canter/lope depending on seat, on a reasonably loose rein. Must be asked to back. To be judged on manners, performance and suitability.

33. Road Hack Horse, Open

107. Road Hack Championship (33)

To be shown with a reasonably loose rein at a flat-footed walk, trot, extended trot, canter, and hand gallop. The number of horses to hand gallop [at one time] is at the discretion of the judge. Excessive speed at the hand gallop will be penalized. Shall stand quietly and back readily. To be judged on performance, substance and manners.

14. Junior Pleasure Horse, Open (Horses 6 & Under)

126. Junior Pleasure Horse Championship (14)

To be shown at a walk, trot/jog/alternate gait, and canter or lope both ways of the ring. Reasonably loose rein but without loss of contact, on command of judge only. Must be asked to back. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability and quality.

39. Limit Rider Pleasure Horse/Pony

143. Limit Rider Pleas Horse/Pony CH (39)

Open to riders of any age, who have not won six blue ribbons at any Shows under saddle. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability and quality.

12. Limit Pleasure Horse

50. Walk Trot Pleasure Horse/Pony (riders 11 & under)

134. WT Pleasure H/P Riders 11 U Championship (50)

To be shown at a walk and trot or jog, only, both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse or pony to rider, and performance. Headers Welcomed.

91. Walk-Trot Equitation Horses, Riders 11 & Under

114. Walk-Trot Equitation Horses 11 & U Championship (91)

To be shown at a walk and trot/ jog, both ways of the ring. Judged on Equitation specs. Reverse at the walk only. Headers invited in at lineup.

Walk Trot Division 12-17

87. Walk-Trot Pleasure Horses, Riders 12-17

123. Walk Trot Pleasure, 12-17 Championship (87)

To be shown at a walk and trot/jog/alternate gait only both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse/pony to rider, and performance. Must reverse at a walk.

51. Walk Trot Equitation 12-17

106. Walk Trot Equitation 12-17 Championship (51)

To be shown at a walk, trot/jog/alternate gait both ways of the ring. Will be asked to reverse at the walk. To be judged on basic principles of horsemanship/equitation. Rider may not enter any wtc classes at the show.

Walk-Trot Pleasure Division Adult

11. Walk-Trot/Jog Pleasure, Adult to Show

115. Walk Trot/Jog Pleasure Adult to Show Championship (11)

To be shown at a walk and trot/jog/alternate gait only both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse/pony to rider, and performance. Must reverse at a walk.

Walk-Trot Equitation Division Adult

15. Walk-Trot/Jog Equitation, Adult

110. Walk Trot/Jog Pleasure Adult Championship (15)

To be shown at a walk, trot/jog/alternate gait both ways of the ring.

Will be asked to reverse at the walk. To be judged on basic principles of horsemanship/equitation. Rider may not enter wtc classes at the show.

13. Walk Trot Limit Pleasure Horse

118. Walk Trot Limit Pleasure Horse Championship (13)

Open to horses who have not won six blue ribbons at any shows under saddle. To be shown at a walk & trot/jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability and quality.

Equitation Classes

23. Adult Equitation, Open

150. Adult Equitation Championship (23)

Riders enter the ring turning to the right and proceed counter clockwise. All riders shall be asked to work both ways of the ring at the walk, trot –jog-alt gait , and canter or lope as directed by the judge. The order to reverse can be executed by turning either towards or away from the rail. Judged on Equitation specs.

Green Horse Classes

21. Stock Green Horse Walk-Trot Pleasure

22. Saddle Green Horse Walk-Trot Pleasure

Open to horses or ponies in their first, second or third year of showing in their respective discipline. To be conducted at a Walk & Trot/Jog both ways of the ring, no backing. To be judged on manners, way of going, suitability as a pleasure mount and performance.

16. Stock Green Horse WTC Pleasure

17. Saddle Green Horse WTC Pleasure

138. Green Horse WTC Pleasure Championship (16,17)

Open to horses or ponies in their first, second or third year of showing in their respective discipline. To be conducted at a Walk, Trot/Jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring, No backing. To be judged on manners, way of going, suitability as a pleasure mount and performance.

Pony Classes

75. Pony in Hand

Open to all ponies 14.2 hands and under. To be judged individually standing and then at a walk and trot on the line. To be judged on breed type conformation, quality, substance, way of going, disposition and manners.

Two Gait Plantation Horse

41. Two Gait Plantation Horse

136. Two Gait Plantation Horse Championship (41)

Horses shall enter the ring at a flat walk and when the gate is closed, the judge shall call for gaits in the order of flat walk, running walk, flat walk. Horses shall be worked both ways of the ring. Entries will back readily on command. The English horse should exhibit animation, style and brilliance of movement at all three gaits. The judge should look for boldness in the movement of this horse with emphasis on a longer overstride and a more pronounced action in the forelimbs. To be judged on true pleasure quality, performance of the horse, neatness and appearance. The Western horse should reflect the suitability as a western working horse, while working quietly on a loose rein, exhibiting an exceptionally smooth, comfortable ride without excessive action or animation while performing the four beat walking gait with a cadenced head nod and natural head carriage and be judged on these qualities as a good western working pleasure, and performance of the horse silver mounted equipment shall not count over good working equipment.

American Saddlebred Divison

103. ASB Fine Harness Open Stake

To be shown at an animated walk, park trot and ‘show your horse’ both ways of the ring. Extreme speed at the trot shall be penalized. At the command, ‘show your horse’, the entry shall be permitted faster speed than require for a park trot, but excessive speed will be penalized. Must stand quietly. Qualifier to be judged on performance, presence, quality, manners and conformation. Championship To be judged on performance, presence, quality, manners, 75%: total conformation, 25%.

111.ASB Five Gaited Stake

To be shown at an animated walk, trot, slow gait, rack and canter, both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, presence, quality, manners and conformation.

104.ASB 3 Gaited Park Horse Open

146.ASB 3 Gaited Park Horse Championship (104)

To be shown at an animated walk or flat walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners, presence, quality and conformation.

72. Saddlebred in Hand, Open

To be shown individually standing, then at a walk and trot on the line. To be judged 50% on conformation and finish; 50% on way of going and natural action.

35. ASB 3 Gaited Open

125. ASB 3 Gaited Open Championship (35)

To be shown at an animated walk, park trot and canter, both ways of the ring. To be judged 75% on performance, presence, quality and manners; 25% on total conformation.

5. ASB Country Pleasure Hunter Open

122. ASB Country Pleasure Hunter Championship (5)

To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter and hand gallop both ways of the ring. Horses are required to stop on the rail. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability as a hunter, quality and conformation. In the line, horses must stand quietly with all four legs perpendicular to the ground. Horse shall be required to back readily in the line

95. ASB Country Pleasure Western Open

148. ASB Country Pleasure Western Championship (95)

To be shown at a flat walk, jog trot and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint (ridden with one hand on reins) both ways of the ring. Entries must be asked both ways of the ring to halt and stand quietly on the rail. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line up. To be judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality, 25% on total conformation.

38. ASB Country Pleasure English Horse, Open

144. ASB Country Pleasure English Championship (38)

To be shown at a flat walk, trot, extended trot and canter both ways of the ring. Special emphasis is on a true, flat walk. Entries must be asked, both ways of the ring, to halt and stand quietly on the rail. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line up. To be judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality; 25% on total conformation.

109. ASB English Show Pleasure Open

131. ASB English Show Pleasure Championship (109)

To be shown at a flat walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring, with special emphasis placed on a true flat walk. Must stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 75% on manners and performance; 25% on total

Color Breed Division

69. Color Breed Model Horse

Entry to wear suitable halter or bridle. Not to be moved. To be judged on conformation and characteristics of its color breed

28. Color Breed Pleasure Horse

116. Color Breed Pleasure Horse Championship (28)

May be shown under English (Saddle Seat or Hunter) or Western tack. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog/alternate gait and canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners and best color example of that breed in that order.

Feathered Horse Classes

29. Feathered Pleasure

124. Feathered Pleasure Championship (29)

Open to 'Feathered Horses' (Friesian, Gypsy, etc) All horses shall be worked at the walk, trot or jog trot both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. Must stand quietly. Each horse should be judged on the discipline they are presenting. Rider should maintain light hand contact. To be judged on performance, manners, type, quality, and conformation. Horses that show in open WTC classes ARE allowed in this class.

Other Classes:

31. Reining - Judges the horse on movements, mastery of a prescribed maneuver and attitude as he is guided through a patterns. The horse is required to perform a number of stops, spins, rollbacks, lead changes and circles at a lope. The horse should be willing to be guided with little or no resistance. Pattern to be posted before at the show.

1. Longe Line Class (horse 2 yrs & U, all breeds, eng or west)

The demonstration will last one and one-half minutes (90 seconds).

The Exhibitor will be given a "start" signal and they will have one and one-half minutes to present the horse at all three gaits (walk, jog, lope or walk, trot, canter) in both directions. At the end of the 1½ minutes, the signal will be given to signify the end of the demonstration.

Miscellaneous Classes

86. Open Costume Class

To be shown at a walk only, ridden or in hand, both ways of the ring, then to line up in the middle for final judging. To be judged 50% originality of costume, 25% quality and 25 % presentation

Morgan Classes

92. Morgan Pleasure Horse Junior Exhibitor

140. Morgan Pleasure Horse Jr Ex Championship (92)

The junior exhibitor pleasure horse must be safe, pleasant and mild mannered individual showing complete cooperation. All signs of resistance, resentment or aggression must be severely penalized. Suitability of horse to rider is of particular importance. Stallions are prohibited. To be shown at a walk, pleasure trot, road trot and canter, with light rein, but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. To be judged on manners, suitability, performance with proper cadence and balance, quality, presence and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride, 60%; type and conformation, 40%. Championship Class will be 50%-50%.

32. Morgan Hunter Pleasure Horse

129. Morgan Hunter Pleasure Horse Championship (32)

To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter and extended canter, with light rein but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. May be asked to back. To be judged on manners, performance with proper cadence and balance, quality, presence and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride, 60%; type and conformation, 40%. Championship will be 50%-50%.

71. Morgan in Hand, Open

To be shown individually, standing, then at a walk and a trot on the line. Entries must be serviceably sound. Horses must stand squarely on all four feet with front legs perpendicular to the ground. Rear legs may be placed slightly back, but the horse must also be judged at some time in the class not stretched. To be judged on type and conformation w/ consideration given to horse's ability to move correctly on the lead.

57. Morgan Pleasure Horse, Western

149. Morgan Pleasure Horse Western Championship (46)

To be shown at a walk, jog trot, and lope with light rein, but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. The judge may ask for an extension of any gait. Horses must back willingly. To be judged on manners, performance with proper cadence and balance, quality, presence and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride, 60%; type and conformation, 40%. Championship will be equal.

24. Morgan Pleasure Horse, English

141. Morgan Pleasure Horse English Championship (24)

To be shown at a walk, pleasure trot, road trot and canter, with light rein, but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. May be asked to back. To be judged on manners, performance with proper cadence and balance, quality, presence and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride, 60%; type and conformation, 40%.

Quarter Horse Classes

67. Quarter Horse Halter, Open

Exhibitor may show in English or Western Attired. Entries to be shown in a suitable halter or bridle. To be shown in-hand at a walk or trot/jog. To be judged on type, conformation, quality, substance, and soundness. Hereditary or transmissible unsoundness shall disqualify a horse.

30. Quarter Horse Hunter Under Saddle

132. Quarter Horse Hunter under Saddle Champion (30)

Horses are to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Horses are required to back. This can be on the rail or lineup. Emphasis shall be placed on performance, conformation and actual suitability to purpose.

9. Quarter Horse Western Pleasure

121. Quarter Horse Western Pleasure Championship (9)

To be shown at a walk, jog trot and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Horses shall be shown one way of the ring at an extended jog and lope with a slight increase in forward motion. Horses may be required to reverse at a walk or jog trot at the discretion of the judge. Judge may ask that the horses be backed. To be judged on performance, conformation at the discretion of judge.

31. Open Reining

Reining is a judged event designed to show the athletic ability of a ranch type horse in the confines of a show arena. In reining competition, contestants are required to run one of several approved patterns. Each pattern includes small slow circles, large fast circles, flying lead changes, rollbacks over the hocks, a series of 360 degree spins done in place, and the exciting sliding stops that are the hallmark of the reining horse. To rein a horse is not only to guide him, but also to control his every movement. The best reined horse should

be willingly guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance and dictated to completely. Any movement on his own must be considered a lack of control. Any one of the AQHA15 approved reining patterns may be used and will be posted in the office Friday. Each contestant will perform the required pattern individually and separately. All horses will be judged immediately upon entering the arena. Any fault incurred prior to the commencement of a pattern will be scored accordingly. All deviations from the exact written pattern must be considered a lack of or temporary loss of control, and therefore faulted according to severity of deviation. Credit will be given for smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority in performing the various maneuvers while using controlled speed.

Other Halter Classes

60. Open Grooming Class

Line up in the ring: Finish and grooming to count 100%. Entries must stand quietly to be inspected.

65. Open Horse Colts & Fillies, 2 years old & younger

To be shown in a suitable bridle or halter & required to move at a walk & trot or alternate gait. To be judged on quality, conformation, way of going & soundness.

70 Open Halter Horse/Pony

Entries shall be judged individually standing and at a walk and trot/jog/alternate gait on the line. To be judged on conformation, quality, type/breed standard as represented by turnout, & manners.

68. Western Horse in Hand

Entries shall be judged individually standing, and then at a walk and jog on the line. Emphasis shall be placed on type, conformation, substance, quality and manners.

64. Open Halter Horse/Pony Jr Handler

Open to handlers 17 years and under. Entries to be shown in a suitable halter or bridle with no more than two junior handlers per entry. To be judged individually standing and then at a walk and trot/jog/alternate gait on the line. Emphasis shall be placed on type, conformation, substance, quality and manners with consideration to the handlers' abilities to effectively present entry.

74. English Horse in Hand

Open to hunter and saddle-type horses, using an appropriate halter or bridle. Entries shall be judged individually standing, and then at a walk and trot on the line. Emphasis shall be placed on type, conformation, substance, quality and manners

83. \$500 Open Halter Maine State Championship (64-82)

To be shown in a suitable bridle or halter & required to move at a walk & trot or alternate gait. To be judged on quality, conformation, way of going & soundness.

Dressage Division

40. Dressage Suitability

151. Dressage Suitability Championship

Open to all. Horses to enter at a working trot, rising. To be shown at a working trot, working canter, working walk, and lengthened trot. Free walk and working walk on a long rein. Trot work to be ridden rising. To be judged 70% on performance of gaits and transitions, with attention to impulsion and submission; 30% on riders position, seat and effective use of aids.

Showmanship Classes

61. Adult Showmanship, Open

62. Youth Activity Showmanship, Open

63. Open Showmanship Championship (61 or 62)

Entries shall be led into the show ring and perform a pattern chosen by the show. Judged on appearance of animal, execution of pattern.

Standardbred Classes

96. Standardbred Two Gait Pleasure

135. Standardbred Two Gait Pleasure Championship (96) To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot or alternate gait. Backing may be requested. To be judged on way of going and manners.

Horsemanship Division

Western horsemanship is designed to evaluate the rider's ability to execute, in concert with their horse, a set of maneuvers prescribed by the judge with precision and smoothness while exhibiting poise and confidence and maintaining a balanced, functional and fundamentally correct body position. The ideal horsemanship pattern is extremely precise with the rider and horse working in complete unison, executing each maneuver with subtle aids and cues. The horse's head and neck should be carried in a relaxed, natural position, with the poll level with or slightly above the withers. The head should not be carried behind the vertical, giving the appearance of intimidation, or be excessively nosed out, giving a resistant appearance.

99. Open WT Horsemanship

Pattern class worked individually and then all put on the rail for a short class showing walk and jog, one way of the ring.

100. Open Horsemanship

Pattern class worked individually and then all put on the rail for a short class showing walk, jog & lope, one way of the ring.

Appaloosa Division

7. Appaloosa Pleasure Open

108 .Appaloosa Pleasure Championship (7)

To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope both ways of the ring. It is the judge's option to require an exhibitor to extend any gait. Horse must back easily and stand quietly. Emphasis shall be placed on actual suitability to purpose.

Lead Line Classes (Riders 8 Yrs & U)

93. Lead Line Equitation, Open

94. Lead Line Equitation Championship (93)

To be shown/judged on an attached lead at the walk and trot/ jog or alternate gait. Judged on rail individually as they come in the gate, and then reversed as group/individually. Judged as an equitation class.

97. Lead Line Pleasure Horse/Pony, Open

98. Lead Line Pleasure Horse/Pony Championship (97)

To be shown/judged on an attached lead at the walk and trot/ jog or alternate gait. To be judged on the horse or pony as a pleasure class with manners and the suitability of the mount emphasized. Judged on first rail individually as they come in the gate, and then reversed as group or individually.

Youth Activity ~ Junior Exhibitor Classes

36. Youth Activity Pleasure Horse/Pony

145. Youth Activity Pleasure Horse Championship (36)

To be shown at a walk, trot or jog, and canter or lope on a reasonably loose rein without loss of contact with horse's mouth. Must be asked to back. To be judged on manners, performance and conformation, in that order.

49. Junior Exhibitor Hack Horse/Pony

105. Junior Exhibitor Hack Horse/Pony Championship (49)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter on a reasonably loose rein without loss of contact with horse's mouth. To be judged on manners, performance and suitability

Miniature Horse Classes

76. Miniature Horse in Hand, Stallions & Geldings

77. Miniature Horse in Hand Mares

78. Miniature Horse in Hand 2 & Under

To be shown in hand at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. To be judged on conformation, type, soundness, quality and presence, manners and size.

79. Miniature Horse Model Best Multi Color ~

To be shown as a model class at a lineup.. To be judged on conformation and best color.

80. Miniature Horse Model Best Solid Color ~

To be shown as a model class at a lineup.. To be judged on conformation and best color.

81. Miniature Horse in Hand Stock

To be shown in hand at a walk and jog both ways of the ring. Gaits are smooth and purposeful. To be judged on balance, structure and characteristics. To stand at ease with a balanced stance and stand at the corners of the body, as opposed to the stretch.

82. Miniature Horse in Hand Championship (76-81)

To be shown in hand at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. To be judged on characteristics of type and turnout.

85. Miniature Horse Obstacles

To be shown over and through obstacle. Course will be posted before the first class of the show. Judged as a trail class.

Ranch Horse Division

This division is to provide a competition that would simulate what a horse might perform on a ranch, moving and working cattle, navigating gates and moving things, and also show the horse/rider connection by performing a simple pattern. A horse that is a pleasure to lope out to check cattle and is pleasing to the eye, using minimal tack. The discipline is western but not breed specific. Good solid working gear for both rider and horse is the only dress and tack requirement, so long as they are in keeping with minimal tack rules.

10. Ranch Horse Obstacles Versatility

11. Ranch Horse WT Obstacles Versatility

To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, trot/jog,(Class 1 only: canter/lope and back). Judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response to the rider, and

quality of movement with attention given to the merits of a working ranch horse.

66. Ranch Horse in Hand/ Conformation

Designed to showcase the conformation necessary for a ranch horse to do his job under saddle. Horses are ridden into the ring for judging. After walking to the judge and jogging past, horses are unsaddled for inspection just off the rail at lineup. May exit ring after results lead or ridden.

43. Ranch Horse Walk Trot/Jog Pleasure

44. Limit Ranch Horse Walk Trot Pleasure

119. Ranch Horse WT/J Pleasure Championship (43 or 44)

Designed to show a horse that is a pleasure to ride. Horses are required to work both ways in the arena at the walk and trot with purpose to their strides. The walk is intended to cover ground, the trot should be faster than the walk, the extended trot is truly extended. Judged accordingly.

46. Limit Ranch Horse Pleasure

47. Youth Ranch Horse Pleasure (17 & U)

48. Ranch Horse Pleasure

120. Ranch Horse Pleasure Championship (46, 47, 48)

Entries in class 46 & 47 are allowed to enter class 48 (designed to show a horse that is a pleasure to ride. Horses are required to work both ways in the arena at the walk, trot and lope with purpose to their strides. The walk is intended to cover ground, the trot should be faster than the walk, the extended trot is truly extended and the lope is a true 3-beat gait. Judged accordingly.

3. Ranch Riding WT

112. Ranch Riding WT Championship (3)

2. Ranch Riding

4. Youth Ranch Riding

113. Ranch Riding Championship (2, 4)

Designed to show a horse with the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse, with good manners and responsiveness. There is no rail work. A pattern will be posted in the office.

Driving Classes

27. Open Pleasure Driving

139. Open Pleasure Driving Championship (27)

To be shown in a two-wheeled vehicle appropriate for pleasure driving. Martingales permitted. No miniature horses. One attendant without whip may be allowed in the lineup. To be shown at a walk, pleasure trot and extended trot both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance and quality. Winner of the Championship receive the Nonni Daley Memorial Championship Trophy (donated by Judith Catchpole).

Arabian/Half-Arabian Classes

18. Arabian/Half Arabian Western Pleasure

127. Arabian/Half Arabian Western Pleasure Championship (10)

To be shown at a walk, jog-trot, lope and hand gallop. Extreme speed to be penalized. To be judged on manners, performance, substance, quality, attitude & conformation.

56. Arab/Half-Arab Hunter Pleasure

147. Arab/Half-Arab Hunter Pleasure Championship

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop both directions of the ring. To stand quietly and back readily. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability as a Hunter, quality and conformation

34. Half-Arabian Pleasure Horse, Open

To be shown at a flat-footed walk, a normal trot/jog trot, canter/lope and hand gallop (extreme speed to be penalized) both ways of the ring. Light contact with horse's mouth must be maintained at all gaits. Martingales or tie downs are prohibited. Hackamores are permitted. Horses may be asked to back at the discretion of the judge. To be judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation.

90. Arabian/Half Arabian Horse Lady to Ride

To be shown at a walk, normal trot or jog, and canter or lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation.

73. Arabian/Half-Arabian Halter

Horses to be shown at a walk and a trot. Emphasis to be placed on type, conformation, substance and quality. Transmissible weakness to be counted strongly against breed stock and horses must be serviceably sound.
