

Unionville Man Dies Of Cycle Accident Injuries

Barry Todd Kuhl, 24, Unionville, died around 11:30 a.m. Wednesday of injuries suffered 11 hours earlier when the motorcycle he was driving ran off a curve on M-25, four and a half miles northeast of Sebawaing.

Kuhl was thrown off the southbound cycle which skidded 261 feet after leaving the road.

His death, at Mercy Memorial Hospital in Bay City, was attributed to multiple head injuries.

Kuhl was the 13th person to die in a Huron County traffic accident this year.

Barry Todd Kuhl was born August 26, 1948 at Pigeon.

He was graduated from Watertord Township High School in 1966.

Kuhl was employed at Saginaw Steering Gear, a division of General Motors Corporation, at the time of his death.

Surviving are his wife; a son, William Arnold Kuhl, and a daughter, Tomi Lynn Kuhl, both living with their parents; his mother, Mrs. Goldie Wescott, Bay Port; his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Lydia Cullin, also of Bay Port; a brother, David Kuhl, Union Lake; a half brother, Max Morey, Bay Port, and a step-brother, Mendon Wescott, Milford, and a step-sister, Mrs. William Mudd, Bancroft.

His father, Arnold Kuhl, Sebawaing, preceded him in death.

Remains are at the Dinkel funeral home, Sebawaing, where funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Saturday. Rev. E.W. Scheek, assistant pastor of Immanuel Lutheran church, Sebawaing.
