APRIL TOURNAMENTS



The majority of fish caught in our first tournament were caught using a wacky rigged worm (bottom). Colors varied between green pumpkin, watermelon red or black. Other baits used were a salt and pepper dead ringer on a jig head and Texas rigged lizard or trick worm. Since this was a Wild Card tournament location seemed to make a big difference. Ten of the top eleven anglers fished on Lake Balboa.



The second tournament was Tuesday April 27th on Lake Ouachita. Dave Keith took first place using a drop shot rig. Other successful baits were a wacky rigged worm and a jig head worm.
