

## Watertown Food Pantry News

It's hard to believe how fast 2018 has flown by and we sincerely thank you all for your generous donations of food, money and time. We especially thank the faithful volunteers from our church including Paul Glockhoff, Jim and Linda Bar-

ber, Chuck and Mary Lou Massa, Pat and Candy Wendt, Betsy Latko and Jen Noakes. We also have several volunteers from Gaines Chapel and the community who we constantly depend on. And thanks also go to Pastor Becky, Darlos, and the Sunday School youth for the recent and ongoing donation of Birthday Bags. FPCEM is a **very** giving congregation!!!

During the month of November we helped 96 families which were composed of 209 adults and 148 children. And it's amazing that we continue to add new families monthly as the need continues to grow. Everyone we serve is thankful for the help and usually say so. We have heard "God bless you" many, many times and want you to know that you are a part of this ministry whether you donate time, food, money, or prayers. It's always interesting at the food pantry. Our open hours are Tuesdays and Fridays from 1-4 pm. Both shifts include stocking shelves, inventorying donations, etc., as well as helping our 'clients' pick out the food they need.

Our ongoing needs aside from monetary donations are: toilet paper, 4# bags of sugar, corn bread/muffin mix, any canned fruit or vegetables, canned **tuna**/ham/chicken, boxed dinner mixes, instant mashed potatoes, **cereal** – almost anything to make a meal. All food items must be within their "fresh date" per Churches United regulations. We can also use individually packaged tooth-brushes or even those little bars of soap or bottles of shampoo and lotion you get at hotels. Nothing goes to waste!

#### PERFORMANCE OR PRAYER: CLAP OR AMEN

The Worship and Music Committee and our Session members would like the congregation to consider the following thoughts on what has become an issue to quite a few musicians, as well as others in the congregation. It has to do with clapping during the service after the anthem, for example. We hope this article will persuade all to make this requested change.

This is not to say clapping is prohibited in church! There are certainly times when it is appropriate to clap in praise of a special event or accomplishment. Events when the children are involved might be such a time. Indeed there are times when clapping spontaneously breaks out in simple joy of the moment. These times are not at all the issue.

Clapping after a performance and acknowledging with a bow are natural responses audiences and performers use to demonstrate their appreciation. However, as musicians in church, we are not "performing" for an audience and do not expect or want clapping any more than the congregation expects or wants a bow. So as not to interrupt the integrity of the service, silence or a quiet "Amen" response would be far more appropriate and allow the musicians to add to the service in the intended spirit of praising God.

Think of those parts of the service in which choirs and/or individual musicians sing or play instruments: prelude, anthem, offertory, communion, postlude. The music is sung or played as are the hymns to bring us to a place of prayerful consideration or reflection. Choirs or individuals are not "performing" in the sense of entertainment for the service. We are wholly participating in the service through music. The music is chosen to further reflect a special day, be it All Saints Day or Christmas Eve, or simply the day we set aside in the week to come together to be reminded of and celebrate God's love for us.

Each person, whether singing or playing an instrument, gives extra time to learning music for that service. We are not saying we don't enjoy sharing our musical talents, but we do so in service to God at that time. Each is grateful that the congregation shows their appreciation and seeks musicians out after the service to personally tell them how much they enjoyed the music. We hope that response will continue to grow. We simply ask that the congregation demonstrate that appreciation with an "Amen" rather than clapping. Just as we use the word "Amen" at the end of a prayer, we can also use it to express our agreement and thankfulness at the end of an anthem.

#### Direct Deposit of your Stewardship Pledge Payment

During this Stewardship season the Finance Commission thought some members may be interested in learning about electronic payment of their pledges. There are several ways to do this, but it is important for you to talk to your own bank or credit union about the exact method.

The church's General Fund is with TBK (Triumph) bank. This checking account is where all pledge payments are deposited.

If your checking account is also with TBK bank: The bank can periodically (usually monthly) transfer your pledge directly into the church's General Fund.

If your checking account is <u>not with</u> TBK bank: Your bank can advise how best to do this, but in general they can periodically either make an electronic funds transfer, or automatically generate and mail a check to the church.

There are three important things to remember on these transfers:

- The church <u>does not</u> take the money out of your account. You direct your bank to make the transfer for you and the church simply receives the donation. If you wish to change the amount or frequency of the transfer, then you must tell your bank of the change.
- 2. If the donation is made as an electronic funds transfer, we are <u>not told</u> who ordered the payment, we only know the bank. So it is essential that you let the Finance Commission know you are doing this.
- 3. If your bank <u>mails a check</u> to the church it will be processed the same as any other pledge check, and we don't need any special notice.

If you are interested in doing electronic transfers your bank will probably request a Deposit Slip from the church. This can be obtained from anyone on the Finance Commission. There should be no charge to either your account or the church.

These figures do not include 2019 per capita or 2019 pledge payments. These will be reported in January.

## Sharing in the Ministries of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A... <u>PER CAPITA = \$34.22</u>

The Finance Commission invites you to give your per capita gift soon! It's that time of year again, when your Finance Commission and your Pastor come to you to talk about per capita giving. Each year, at the beginning of the year, we pay a per capita fee for each of our members, based on the previous year's membership. This per capita giving allows for maintaining the basic operating costs of our Presbytery, the Presbytery of Great Rivers, plus the Synod of Lincoln Trails, and the offices of the General Assembly (the national church's headquarters). Per capita allows each member to share equally in the ministries of the larger church. Being connected like this is one of the gifts of being Presbyterian, we are a connectional church; we care for each other! You can put it in one of the envelopes in the pew racks and mark the outside "Per Capita".
