
# THINGS IN THIS NEWSLETTER

- Report Form to send in quarterly with project and general fund offerings so that we have current information on our local WMA groups.



## A Cup of Friendship



Do any of you collect cups? Or do you have a favorite cup you drink from all the time? Let's examine a cup. First, most cups have a handle. In comparison to the "handle" all of us handle things differently in our lives. There are different things that each of us have to deal with in our lives.

Some have illnesses, some maybe have wayward children, some might have a divorce to deal with, or having to handle sick parents to take care of. In John 4, the woman at the well had a lot to deal with in her life. She had been married numerous times and was living with someone that wasn't her husband. She had to deal with the other women in the town not socializing with her when she came to draw water. Jesus knew all she had been through. But when the Samaritan woman met Jesus that day, her cup was filled with living water.

Do you ever over fill your cup? Maybe too much creamer. Our lives sometimes are overfilled with sweet things or even good things but it can exhaust us. All of these things can overwhelm us and cause us to not be able to focus on the important things. Are you allowing yourself to be overwhelmed? Our State Sunbeam Project is once again, the Ukrainian people. This year we want to support a new ministry of our church in Ukraine, Water of Life, under the leadership of Sasha Grebenyuk, pastor. He is our BMA Changemaker missionary in Ukraine. This ministry is called, "Elim" (Elohim) described by Sasha as "an oasis of hope and restoration for children, families, and future ministers." Exodus 15:27. Elim will have two wings of service: 1. The Adaptation Center, for children and families in need who need protection, love and a new beginning and 2. The Missionary Center, to train and equip leaders who will carry the Gospel to the ends of the earth.
