

March For Life

Why March for Life in our nation's capital?

The end of Roe doesn't mean the end of our national pro-life efforts. Radicals in Congress are pushing extreme pro-abortion legislation, such as H.R. 12- Women's Health Protection Act of 2025, that would codify abortion rights into federal law (more info at [congress.gov](https://www.congress.gov)). This would eliminate virtually all pro-life laws both federally and in the states.

Therefore, we must continue our efforts to fight abortion on the national level, and encourage our elected officials to pass life-affirming laws.

In the words of the late Fr. Benedict Groeschel "Even when we do not choose evil, we choose good so half heartedly and with so many qualifications, that mediocrity becomes our canonized status quo."

Jesus's baptism is a story we've heard before, so it is easy to lose sight of just how incredible it is - that Jesus wished to be baptized in the Jordan River by His cousin, John. We just spent the last two weeks marveling at the fact that this Savior of ours was born as a baby in a crude stable for our sake, and now this! Stop and contemplate our Lord, in all His perfection, waiting quietly and patiently in line with a bunch of sinners (like us) in order to "lead by example." His love and humility in serving and self-giving are beyond all telling.

And just in case there was any doubt about the extraordinary actions of Jesus that day at the Jordan River, we learn of the powerful affirmation of the Father. Who, immediately after the baptism, opens the heavens and sends the Holy Spirit upon Jesus in bodily form and says audibly, "This is My beloved Son with whom I am well pleased!" Wow!
