Our memories are not as Bad as they need to be!

In the corner of my basement is a memory game that has been in my family as long as I can remember. It is a relatively simple game. The directions for the game read like this:

- 1. Repeat what the machine does by pressing pads to activate lights in the same order.
- 2. 2. A delay of more than 3 seconds during play will terminate your score. Like I said relatively simple. One of the four colored pads will light up, and you have to push that colored pad. Each round the machine adds another pad to the pattern. As you try to remember the pattern by pushing the colored pads you earn points that ultimately give you a memory score.
- 3. The score range begins with "Fair", and goes through "Good", "Excellent", "Genius", all the way to "Too Good to be true". What score do you think your memory would earn you?

Memory, or lack thereof, is one of the leading things I hear people complain about. I hear from young and old alike statements similar to 'I can't remember what I had for breakfast'. It seems everyone is losing their memory. And while I do see many people whose mental acuity is waning, I have found that in one particular instance, memory is the last thing to go. That instance is the pain and hurt of a past sin. It can be very hard to move on from a mistake. It is hard to forgive ourselves and move forward with out lives. When it comes to painful pasts, It is actually harder for us to forgive ourselves than it is to seek God's forgiveness.

This selective memory comes in two fashions. The first is the one where we hold on to our sin and refuse to lay it down before the cross of forgiveness. The second is when we do lay our burden down at Jesus feet, only to pick it up again as we turn to go out the door. And so, since we are filled with this troublesome memory that keeps our faults and failings in a sack upon our shoulder, weighing us down, I thought it might be helpful to remind us what God does when we confess our sins and seek forgiveness. Psalm 103 says that "as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us". I'm not a professor of geography but the east seems pretty far removed from the west. 1 John tells us that "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

The LORD speaking to the prophet Isaiah says in chapter 43 "I will not remember your sins". Multiple places in the book of Hebrews God states "I will never again remember their sins". The book of Romans talks about our sins being 'cleared'. Other places in the scripture talk about our scarlet stains being washed whiter than snow. The point is that once we confess and seek reconciliation with God, God does not hold our sins against us anymore. They are forgotten, covered, removed, cleansed, gone. So why do we keep carrying them around? If God is willing to remove the blemish of your sin from your record, why aren't you? Is our memory really better than Gods?

Friends, the past will hang around our necks as long as our memory keeps hold of it. We must learn to lay the burdens we carry before God, and leave them there. We need to allow the cleansing power of true forgiveness to wash over us so that we may be truly free from all that restricts our lives in Christ. Christ died for our futures, not as judgement for our pasts.

And so today I'd like to give you permission to forget, forget all that restricts and hold you down, all regrets, all faults, and all failings. Learn from them, but do not hold onto them. Forget about the mistakes you've made, forget your sin. And remember: Through Jesus Christ you are forgiven!






