Reciprocal Agreements

Since the cruising season is just around the corner and we have acquired so many new members over the last couple of years, I thought I would remind you of one of the benefits of being a part of this yacht club. Reciprocal Agreements are established between yacht clubs to use their marinas and facilities. Basically, you may use the slip, provided by the participating marina, for up to three days with your first night being discounted or sometimes even free, except for power and water. You just need to call the harbor master to see if the slip is available as they are all on a first come first serve basis. They are not reservable. Some allow you to raft on the spot, most do not. You are also entitled to use the amenities at the yacht club if they have it open while you are moored there. For instance, Tony and I went to Port Ludlow once and the reciprocal slip was taken but we did have \$2.00 drinks in their club house. Which brings me to what is required to use this. You need a valid yacht club membership card, a boaters safety license, and a certificate of insurance for up to \$2,000,000 coverage for the Marina. This is especially true if you are cruising in Canada. And don't forget your passport if you are going to travel into Canada. By clicking on the link below, you can see a list of the participating yacht clubs we have reciprocal agreements with. Just click on the info icon of the Marina you want to visit, and it will give you all the information available for that location. May you have fair weather and calm waters!
