

Farmers may diversify into using land for camping and caravan sites. And holiday accomodation such as Bunk Barns, and holiday cottages

Farmers and landowners may set up adventure holiday centres specialising in climbing, cycling, horse riding

Traditional crafts such as Blacksmiths may be maintained by tourists

Historic buildings and sites like Chatsworth House may be preserved and paid for by tourist revenues

Farmers may supply local produce to Hotels and Cafes.

PEAK DISTRICT NATIONAL PARK BENEFITS TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES

Sales of locally made produce such as Blue John and woollen goods bring in extra revenue

Jobs in tourist related areas. Hotels, Guest houses, Cafes, Shops. est. 14 000 in total 500 full time jobs in the Park Increase affluence of locals which may be spent locally

Income into local economy by tourists using Hotels, Guest houses, Cafes; paying to enter attractions eg Blue John Mine, Chatsworth House. Boost to local economy. Total revenue from tourism over £500m per annum.

Council revenue from rents/rates from local business premises may allow them to reinvest in infrastructure and services to improve and increase tourism
