AT FEATHER LAKE

Once again, with no recent rainfall and the irrigation season ended, water levels at Feather Lake are dropping steadily. Without timely rains, the lake will likely be dry, or nearly so, by mid-December.

For the moment, conditions are good. Numbers of ducks, shorebirds and wading birds are climbing. The cottonwoods are still golden. Now is a great time to visit. Even without water, we plan to keep Feather Lake open at least through mid-December so visitors can enjoy the cottonwoods in fall color. We still have a few December dates for which we need volunteers to staff our sanctuary. Interested? Please contact John Sproul (747-8663, jsproul@utep.edu).

We also have a couple of workdays coming up, on Sat., December 6, and Sat., January 31, both starting at 2 p.m. At the December workday, we'll deploy the new secret weapon in our campaign to knock back the kochia and Palmer amaranth that thrived in the uplands around the lake this year. Join us to learn its identity!

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave. Hours are 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays and 2 p.m. to dusk on Sundays.

Admission is free.


Audubon at RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK




Rio Bosque Wetlands

Park began receiving water November 2. Duck numbers have been increasing ever since. Meanwhile, construction of the border fence is poised to begin along the Park's western edge, effectively severing, for terrestrial wildlife and people, the current open connection between the Park and the Rio Grande. If you enjoyed viewing the wetland cells from the river levee in the past, you likely won't have that opportunity in the future. News from the Trail

DOWN TO THE RESERVOIRS

On Saturday 15 November, 5 members left Feather Lake about 7:45 AM. After a 50 mile drive we exited I-10 at exit 81 and started birding the fields below McNary Reservoir. Quite a few Great Egrets and Great Blue Herons were along the ditches. Highlight of that area was a flock of about 80 Sandhill Cranes foraging in a field.

At McNary Reservoir over 40 species were identified, the best was about 40 Snow Geese, and close-up views of **Western Grebes**, also Eared Grebes, Canvasbacks, and a flock of McCown's Longspurs across the road.

At Fort Hancock, White Pelicans and a close flyby of a **Prairie Falcon.** We stopped for lunch at the rest area and had Western Bluebirds and Yellowrumped Warblers. The last stop at Tornillo Reservoir yielded a Forster's Tern, more Eared Grebes and the BIRDS of the trip, 2 **Common Loons**.
