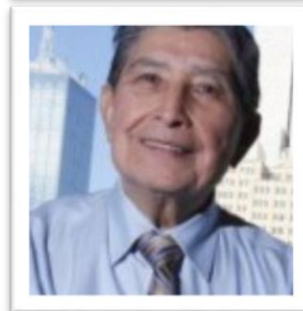

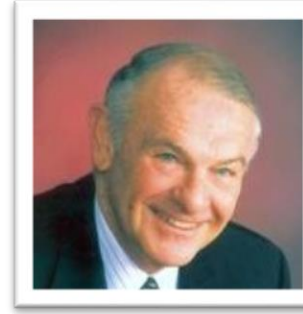
GILES DAVIDSON

- Retired as Deputy Regional Director of U.S. Department of Education in President Clinton's Administration

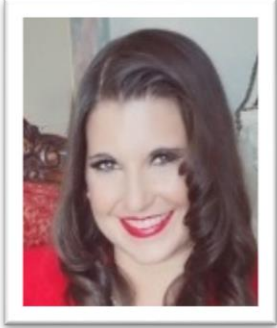

- Member, university advisory boards, Urban League of Greater Dallas, and Dallas Holocaust and Human Rights Museum

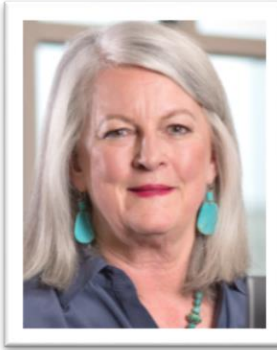

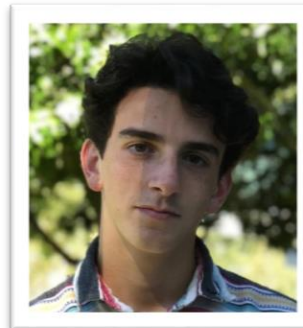
- Senior, Allen High School; will attend Texas A&M majoring in public health in the honors program
