CHSUC continues to focus on diabetes and it's related complications; however the new partnership will allow CHSUC to realize the dream of becoming a full service free clinic, beginning in September 2017. CHSUC targets uninsured, unemployed, Union and Anson County residents (ages 18+) who are without a primary care physician. Eligibility guidelines requires annual income at or below 200% of FPL.

Thanks to Heart to Heart International, CHSUC now offers point-of-care testing for our free clinic patients. This multi-year grant will eliminate the delays in care due to inability to contact patients to provide test results. CHSUC serves a significant number of undocumented immigrants, unemployed residents and those with many health complications due to a lack of funds and access to free healthcare. The immediate intervention made possible by POC laboratory testing will decrease the number of emergency room visits by patients who are non-emergent; thus, driving down overall healthcare costs.
