lowa County, lowa by the Numbers

Digging through the US Census Bureau numbers for 2023 and their findings for 2024 here's lowa County, lowa by the numbers.

Population of Iowa County as of July 1, 2024: 16,381. That's a decrease of 1.7 percent compared to 2020 when the population of Iowa County was 16,662.

Population by age: 20.7 percent of the county's population is 65 or over. 23 percent is under 18 years of age; 5 percent is under 5 years of age.

There are 990 veterans living in Iowa County. Less than 1 percent of the population of this county was born in another country.

The median value of a home in lowa County is \$189,800.

There are 7,300 housing units in Iowa County. 76 percent of Iowa County residents live in houses they own or are paying a lender to own. Gross rent is \$722 per month in Iowa County.

lowa County residents have a per capita income

on average is \$39,363. Median household income is \$72,185. That compares to the lowa state numbers" median household income in lowa is \$73,147 and the per capita income is \$39,728.

Over 7 percent of Iowa County residents are living in poverty. 11 percent of Iowans, statewide live in poverty.

In 2022 there were 481 establishments in Iowa County that provided employment. The total employment – total number of jobs provided in 2022 was 7.513

lowa County, as defined by population per square mile is rural with a population per square mile of 28 persons. The entire State of lowa has a population density of 57 persons per square mile.







OBITUARY

Duane Allen Priebe, 90, of Dubuque, IA, passed away on January 22, 2025 in the company of family and friends.

Visitation will be from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Friday, January 31, 2025 at Wartburg Seminary, 333 Wartburg Pl, Dubuque, IA 52003.

An additional visitation will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday February 1, 2025 at St. John's Lutheran Church in St. Donatus with a Funeral Service following at 10:30 a.m. with Pastor Will Layton officiating. The Funeral Service will be livestreamed via the church's FaceBook page. Leonard Funeral Home is assisting the family.

Duane was born on June 29th, 1934, in Rhinelander, WI, to Christlieb and Lila Priebe, Duane grew up in Rhinelander and St. Paul before his family finally settled in Seattle, WA. He attended the University of Washington where his passion for aviation motivated him to become a private pilot. His deep curiosity about the workings of the universe led him to earn his BS in physics and sparked a love for the natural world, hiking in the mountains of the Pacific Northwest and working as a fire lookout for the forest service.

After a year working as an Aero Research Engineer for NASA, he felt called to serve in the church earning his B.D. in 1961 from Luther Seminary and his Doctor of Theology in 1965 from the School of Theology at Claremont.

After a brief stint as pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Garrison, North Dakota, and Director of the Great Plains Institute of Theology, Western North Dakota District, American Lutheran Church, he began what would become a 47-year term of service to Wartburg Seminary, and the global Christian community.

Duane Traveled to Germany where he studied under Wolfhart Pannenberg (later translating Pannenberg's Jesus: God and Man). He ventured to Namibia, Asia, South America and his favorite, Papua New Guinea exploring the value of Christian theology in different cultural contexts. He developed a reputation among his colleagues as a Christ-centered mystic who taught by surgically querying his students. The light and love of God always shown through him, bringing grace to everyone he knew.

On August 07,1960, Duane married his true love, Kathleen McKillop, who shared his adventures (sometimes more willingly than others) for 57 years. He was a caring father to Christopher and David, as well as their respective wives, Jerri and Amy. He was a loving grandfather to Andrew, Christopher (Meghan), Kytana (Katie), and Alyssa (Craig). He even met his great-grandchildren, Sophie and Avery.
