

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Beloved,

As the summer begins to wind down, I thought it was important to take a moment to remind us about who we are in Christ. It's easy to forget sometimes with everything that life throws at us but it is crucial that we remember. We are God's children. He loves us so much that He sent His only begotten Son into the world to die on a cross for us. His death indeed saves us. But even more than that, He claims us. We are His. And nothing can ever separate us from the love of God!



Sometimes, we as Christians encounter the lie that we should be baptized a second time under the guise, "Now that you're choosing for yourself to be baptized, it will mean more to you." But don't be fooled by this clever temptation. By being re-baptized, you don't make baptism mean more to you, you actually make baptism mean less to you. Instead of trusting in baptism as the rock-solid promise of God by which He chose you and made you His own child (see Matthew 28:18-20, Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38-39, Romans 6:3-5, Titus 3:4-7, and 1 Peter 3:21, etc.), by being re-baptized you turn baptism into your choice and commitment toward God. But what certainty is there in your commitment? What confidence is there in your choice? Where is your foundation if your love for God becomes shaky? No longer can you look to your baptism for confidence, because in being re-baptized, you've made it mean less. Far better to stick to the teaching of Holy Scripture. God's promise made to you in baptism is sure and certain, no matter how old you were when God made that promise to you. Don't make your baptism less by going into the water a second time. In baptism, you're still all wet. Hold fast to the promise that Christ has made to you in the water and the Word.

So as your summer begins to wind down, remember your baptism dear saints. Know that God is with you and that as His child, you have certainty of your salvation (in a world where it seems like nothing is certain anymore) and you have hope (that the world needs). God bless you!

Trustee Rick Clendaniel and his small team of helpers have recently demolished sections of sidewalk and had new replacement concrete poured. This was a much needed safety improvement for the walkway into Geiger Hall. The Trustee facilitated the move of the Geiger Hall Library contents to the second floor so that planning for the new Nursery School classroom can begin. The new Library looks great so far – with some additional organizing and new materials planned for the near future. Rick continues to monitor the completion of stained-glass repairs; we are currently waiting for materials to arrive.







Vacation Bible School (VBS) was recently hosted by Immanuel under the leadership of Board of Education chairperson, Rene Langwost. Rene and her VBS team of over 15 adults and youth presented a program from Concordia Publishing House called "Celebrate Jesus". This team shared the good news of Jesus with the stories of the Wisemen, feeding the 5,000, and the Crucifixion and Resurrection. 




