## From the Minister's Mac

### “Worship”

While Brian and I were in California visiting my brother, we worshipped at Rolling Hills UMC (RHUMC), where many of our friends attend. I like worshipping at other churches and seeing how they do things and I thought you might enjoy hearing about a style of worship a little different from ours.

One thing very different at RHUMC is that they no longer pass the offering plate during worship. They have an offertory, which provides time for folks to do their giving online, but no plates were passed. I wondered if this is the future of Offering Time in worship, as more and more people get used to electronic giving. I know some churches give out slips of paper that read, “I give electronically,” just so folks have something to put in the plate as it goes by. It occurred to me that there are people who are so strapped financially that the offering plate becomes a painful reminder that they have nothing to give. How do we keep our gift-giving from becoming a point of division or a source of pain?

At RHUMC, the pastor did not ask for joys or concerns, although he did read many of them from a list before beginning the pastoral prayer. It felt a bit impersonal, but probably saved time. I have handled joys and concerns in different ways at different churches, with the worship team fielding comments that the prayer requests go on too long, or that they get too detailed with people’s problems, or that it is the same five people who always have prayer requests, or that we shouldn’t be praying for someone’s brother’s friend’s aunt’s sister’s coworker. I like how we do prayer requests at Rinn and notice many of you take notes while joys and concerns are being shared. What a blessing to be in a congregation of pray-ers.

Of particular note at RHUMC, there was a time of silent prayer during the service. It was in the bulletin and I was grateful for it, especially that weekend. We arrived at that point in the service and I took a deep breath, relaxed my shoulders, bowed my head and began my silent prayer: “Thank you, gracious God, for bringing us safely to this place. I ask that you be with my brother...” and before I could finish my request, the silent prayer time was over, which is precisely the problem with “A Time of Silent Prayer.” Thirty seconds is not enough time for some folks and is way too long for others.

The same can be said for the time of “Passing the Peace of Christ.” When the pastor invited the good folks at RHUMC to turn and greet their neighbor, they did exactly that. Everyone turned to a neighbor, said hello and introduced themselves. And that was it. While the task-oriented part of me liked the efficiency of it,

my overall opinion was that it felt impersonal, like the joys and concerns. But where do you find the happy medium? Do we encourage a little small talk? Do we draw a line at crossing the aisle? How do we create a “Welcome and Friendship Time” that allows us to greet one another warmly and personally without becoming a distraction unto itself?

Perhaps most surprising is that there was no slide show, no screen, no flat screen TV that so many churches use these days to project the words to hymns and liturgical responses so the faithful may enjoy hands-free worship. They still have bulletins but modern media is almost completely absent. The service is recorded but not live-streamed, which means the homebound can still watch the service later in the day, but cannot be part of the morning congregation.

I know what I like in worship, but I recognize that what I like might not be what everyone else likes. My own husband prefers a contemporary worship service that is mostly praise music and message with not a lot of anything else. I prefer a more traditional worship service, but with a mixture of music styles ranging from organ to banjo to bagpipes.

Maybe it's simply a matter of what you're used to. All I know is that if felt good to be back at Rinn, worshipping with our faith family in our familiar and friendly way. Brian and I love you all so much and look forward to another year of worship and fun together.

Using Rev. Jeremy Scott's book, "Gifted & Talented: Discover and Use Your Spiritual Gifts," we will explore using the gifts we know we possess and developing gifts we might not have discovered yet! - Mary gives thanks that son Chris found a home in Dacono.

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
