WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY

MINUTES August 17, 2021

Chairwoman Napolitani called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration Building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

Also, in attendance: Brian Tipton, Esq., Authority Legal Counsel; Kim Francisco, Authority CFO; and Susan Wright, Administrative Assistant.

Chairwoman Napolitani led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance and then read the Introductory Statement.

MINUTES

Mr. Kennedy moved, and Mr. Roth seconded to approve the minutes of the July 20, 2021 regular meeting, as presented. All in favor, except one abstention by Mr. Niece. The motion passed.

Mr. Kennedy moved, and Mr. Roth seconded to approve the Executive Session minutes from July 20, 2021, as presented. All in favor, except one abstention by Mr. Niece. The motion passed.

CORRESPONDENCE

There was no correspondence; however, Chairwoman Napolitani read a letter from Drew Kiszonak to the Board of Commissioners formally resigning from the Warren County (PR) MUA effective August 16, 2021.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Francisco summarized his monthly financial report.

Mr. Francisco advised that he spoke with our Auditor and was told that they are still waiting for the Division of Pensions to release the information to finish up their report.

Mr. Francisco reminded the Board that it is time to start thinking about the FY2022 Budget. He would like to schedule a meeting with the Finance Committee about this matter before the September regular meeting. He will check with Mr. Donati as to what needs to be included for capital.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Tipton had nothing to report.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati was not in attendance; however, his report was included in the agenda packets.

Chairwoman Napolitani advised that she spoke with Mr. Donati and presented a Change Order from the contractor in connection with the Belvidere Clarifier project to add the alternate bid item for supplying and installing the worm gears that operate the scum skimmers for the clarifiers in the amount of \$60,000.00 (\$10,000.00 per worm gear). After much discussion among the Board and questions to Mr. Tipton, Mr. Niece moved to approve Resolution #21-37 authorizing the execution of Change Order No. 1 for Contract 21-02, the Belvidere Clarifier Rehabilitation project. Mr. Roth seconded. The motion passed; roll call was as follows:

Chairwoman Napolitani advised the Board that at the last month's meeting, information was provided by Operator M. Codis for Russell Reid to come in and remove the sludge from the tank with a vacuum truck. Unfortunately, Russell Reid was not able to provide their service within the time that was necessary and therefore, Operator M. Codis contacted Spectraserv to come and provide the service for approximately \$1,000.00 more than what was quoted by Russell Reid. The job was completed to the satisfaction of the Operators.

Oxford Spill Prevention: Mr. Donati advised Chairwoman Napolitani that Raw Power was ready to go, however, the vendor sold the tanks due to another facility's emergent need for the tanks. They have been reordered and as soon as they come in, we will be ready to go.

FINANCE

Mr. Roth moved that Resolution #21-38 (Certificate No. OP 420: \$45,459.96) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund, as presented. Mr. Niece seconded. All in favor, motion passed.

Ms. O'Connor moved that Resolution #21-39 (Certificate No. CI 426: \$24,313.47) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund, as presented. Mr. Niece seconded. All in favor, motion passed.

Ms. Wright advised the Board that normally she requests checks for the operating and capital funds the week before the meeting; however, this month the finance department was testing out their upgraded program that week and requested that she submit her check requests the week before. Ms. Wright contacted the vendors and was able to obtain most of their invoices early. There were a few that Ms. Wright was unable to obtain but did receive them a few days after the checks were requested. Ms. Wright wanted to make the Board aware that she will be requesting payment for those few invoices at the end of the month with her utility check requests. This will be a one time only issue, as the program is now up and running so the schedule for next month will return to normal.

AUTHORITY CHAIRWOMAN

Chairwoman Napolitani advised that the Personnel Committee met on Monday, August 16, 2021, with Mr. Tipton in attendance, to discuss replacement of the Authority Consultant.

Chairwoman Napolitani requested a motion authorizing the operators, namely Mr. Berger for the Oxford plant and Mr. M. Codis for the Belvidere plant, to purchase "as needed" but not to exceed \$1,500.00, without needing prior authorization. It was requested that the Operators provide a monthly expenditure report prior to the meetings. Mr. Kennedy moved to adopt said motion and Ms. O'Connor seconded. All in favor, motion passed.

ADT: Chairwoman Napolitani advised the Board that we are tied into a maintenance contract with ADT for \$20.00 a month and there are 39 months left on the contract. To cancel the contract, we would have to pay them \$780.00, so she suggested that we just finish out the contract with them. The door is now working properly as Ms. Wright did have someone come in and take a look at it and was advised that the problem seems to be with the push bar and that if the door starts to act up again, a locksmith should most likely be called.

Computers: Jean Paul Reece is scheduled to be at the Belvidere plant to install the new automation system on Wednesday, August 25, 2021.

All Max: In 2019, the former Consultant purchased the All-Max software for approximately \$6,225.00. Chairwoman Napolitani's recollection was that the software was for both plants. Apparently, this was not the case and in fact, the software is just for Belvidere and only on the laptop. She advised that she spoke with a representative from All Max and was told that the necessary software for both plants to be able to communicate with each other will cost an

additional \$7,120.00. She further explained the necessity of this software for both plants. Chairwoman Napolitani called for a motion to update the All-Max software for \$7,120.00 and the yearly support of \$2,200.00. Mr. Niece moved to adopt said motion and Mr. Roth seconded. All in favor, motion passed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Kennedy updated the Board with regard to the finalization of the Summit Project in Belvidere. There are still some residents in Belvidere that have septic and wells (i.e., Race Street, Pequest Road and Stadelman Drive), approximately two dozen homes, that may want to hook up to that collection system and the authority would deal with whatever the additional flow would be.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Ms. O'Connor moved, and Mr. Chamberlain seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:13 p.m.

AUTHORIZATION FOR EXECUTION OF CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 1 TO WC(PR)MUA CONTRACT NO. 21-02: Belvidere Clarifier Rehabilitation Project

WHEREAS, the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority and Scaturro Brothers, Inc. t/a Alpine Painting and Sandblasting Contractors entered into a Contract, with said Contract having a Notice to Proceed date of July 21, 2021, for the rehabilitation of the Belvidere WWTF Clarifiers - Contract No. 21-02; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that additional work to replace some inoperable and difficult to maintain worm gear assemblies within the clarifiers being rehabilitated is necessary. That work consists of:

- 1. Removal of six existing scum trough worm gear assemblies.
- 2. Supply and installation by the Contractor of six new worm gear assemblies.

WHEREAS, the bid for Contract No. 21-02 included an alternate bid item for worm gear replacement in the amount of sixty thousand dollars and zero cents (\$60,000.00); and

WHEREAS, Change Order Number 1 has been prepared by the Authority's Engineer, which results in a net increase in the Contract Price of sixty thousand dollars and zero cents (\$60,000.00), and no change in Contract Time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority that the Chairwoman is hereby authorized and directed to execute Change Order Number 1 to Contract No. 21-02, which reflects the work outlined above and contained in Change Order Number 1, at an increase in Contract Price of sixty thousand dollars and zero cents (\$60,000.00), and no change in Contract Time.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that executed copies of Change Order Number 1 to Contract No. 21-02 shall be distributed by the Authority's Engineer, to all appropriate parties.
