Hello Members.! Some great happenings this month.

In January, the Road Run Committee was busy. We visited McMinnville and found a very nice RV park to be our headquarters. Olde Stone Village RV Park on Highway 18. It has 71 RV sites, we reserved some for the rally. The RV park is next to the Evergreen Aviation Museum, which will have added camping spaces for tents and RVs (dry camp). Nearness to the Aviation museum will also be a draw for attendees. The RV park has free showers/restrooms, a laundry, a nice clubhouse, a heated pool, and free Wi-FI.

We have three themes for rides at the rally: a shake down ride on Thursday; Tom K will work out a route around Hagg Lake. On Friday, a ride to the coast, also planned by Tom K. On Saturday, a wine-country tour planned by Tom R. A tentative plan for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday is to have dinner at the clubhouse or the outdoor gazebo at the RV park.

A budget for the rally was set based on the costs incurred in 2016. We will need OTC members to contact local bike shops for door prizes. Likely candidates include Paradise HD, Cascade Moto, Portland HD Speed Shop, and See-See Coffee. We will also need OTC members with contacts at the local BMW dealer and Bob Lanphere to ask those dealers for a donation. "SWAG" bags (free goodies) will be given to riders at registration: examples include a string backpack with a magnet advertising our 2018 National Rally, a hat or tee shirt, and stickers from local dealers.

Our club had a great showing at the One Moto Show. Six members displayed their bikes. Thanks so much to Nils Olson, Tom Ruttan, Michael Tilson, Terry Wolbert, and Chuck Hodson. You guys are awesome! For those that asked and did not get in, thanks and I have your names for next year. Tom and I helped again with registration and am quite sure Thor and Tori Drake will again use our services. We heard Thor, an avid racer and all around crazy bike rider, was thoroughly impressed when our own Chuck Hodson rode his 1914 Indian up the ramp to the second floor where bikes were displayed. He was the *only one* to do so.

The One Moto Show, February 10-12 By Tom Nielsen

This year's show started at 8 AM for Jen and me. We helped with checking in the participants and handing out the goodie bag to builders. As in the past, it was a lot of fun to meet the variety of builders from all over the country and all manner of machines, from strictly stock to outlandish customs. Café racers were probably the most common, fewer choppers this year, and many more stock bikes.

As builders checked in, we confirmed the details on their machine, filled out an aluminum ID label for each bike, and gave them a Santa-worthy SWAG bag that contained a powerful LED light, a Leatherman tool, dry fit tee shirt, long sleeve tee, Red Cloud Key Chain, a HD beanie, numerous stickers, and some contained an insulated drink mug; all inside a heavy duty string back pack. Builders then rolled their bikes to a line to get photographed. They then made their way around the building and up the ramp to the second floor to be placed for display. Our own Chuck Hodson has the distinction of bringing what I believe was the oldest motorcycle. He was also distinguished in that he rode his 1914 Indian up the ramp to the second story, much to the delight of Thor Drake, the event organizer. Chuck related that Thor was at the top of the ramp and was all grins and clapping as Chuck charged up the ramp.

This year's event was in a new location, a two story warehouse on Columbia Boulevard called the Pickle Factory. It previously was a foundry and OTC's own Michael Tillson worked their when he was in high school. The layout had multiple food purveyors, motorcycle accessory vendors, and artists spread throughout the facility. Sponsors included Harley-Davidson, BMW, Danner boots, ICON, See-See Coffee, Pabst, Union Wine, Alta Motors, Red Cloud Collective, Bell, American Flat Track Racers, and Iron and Air Magazine.

Motorcycle brands included Ariel, Honda, Velocette, Triumph, Buell, Honda, Norton, Indian, Husqvarna, Saracen, Alta, Bultaco, Cappra Montesa, Maico, Vespa, Suzuki, Hodoka, Yamaha, Harley-Davidson, Indian, Moto Guzzi, Kawasaki, BSA, BMW, Ducati, and Flying Merkel. We have a copy of the working list of registered bikes, and easily half of them qualify as antiques. Besides OTC, OVM and the Mount Scott club also had bikes on display.

Once the bikes were placed, and the art and vendors set up, the old foundry was transformed into a Moto-art gallery. The bikes were placed on raised white platforms and spread in different wings and floors of the building. There were over 15,000 attendees viewing the approximately 180 motorcycles. I understand from people who attended that the line to enter moved quickly. The feeling of the event was very upbeat and even with all the participants, it did not feel crowded. At the display of OTC bikes, members took shifts through the three days of the show. We had seventeen individuals sign up for information about the club!
