

Post-Fire Update — November 30

The link to the County's recovery website is posted below, which covers all aspects of fire recovery.

Clean-up:

Phase 1—The Ventura County Environmental Health Division and two teams from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will begin Phase 1 of the consolidated debris removal program starting on Monday, December 3, 2018. Each parcel that had structural damage from the Woolsey Fire will be assessed and hazardous waste removed. The teams will work six days per week and the assessment is expected to take about three weeks.

Phase Two—debris removal and property clean-up is expected to begin in January. Two options are available to property owners who had structures damaged or destroyed by the fire:

- ◆ Option 1: CalOES Fire Damage Debris Clearance Program (State Program)
- ◆ Option 2: Local Fire Debris Removal Program (Local Program).

Workshop—the Ventura County Environmental Health Division will be holding a workshop for owners who lost their homes or sustained damage to their property from the fire the week of December 10. The workshop will be held in Bell Canyon and explain the clean-up process and options and answer owners' clean-up and demolition questions.
