

EIGHT DOG FRIENDLY ATTRACTIONS IN ST. MARYS



[St. Marys History Walk](#)

This 600-foot trail is nestled among shade trees with a view of the St. Marys River. Enjoy a self-guided tour of 24 interpretive panels outlining St. Marys rich history.

[One-Hour History Tram Tour](#)

Join a golf cart tour of the historic district. Space is limited, so call in advance. This is open-air fun! See the St. Marys Welcome Center for more information.

[Tommy Casey Memorial Dog Park](#)

Fenced in fun for you and your pooch! Proof of rabies vaccination is required upon request. Tag is sufficient.

[St. Marys Waterfront Park](#)

The ideal spot from which to watch the shrimp boats come in, take a stroll along the boardwalks and piers, have a picnic, or witness a stunning sunset.

[Crooked River State Park](#)

Located on the banks of the Crooked River, this park offers several trails and offers outdoor programming on a regular basis.

[St. Marys Welcome Center](#)

Make the welcome center your first stop! Pick up a walking map of the historic district and let us direct you to restaurants, lodging, and attractions.

[Sugar Mill Tabby Ruins](#)

The mill was built in 1825 and is the largest and best preserved of all tabby remains in the Southeast. Its rooms which were devoted to the grinding, boiling and processing of cane for sugar products are still intact. Picnic areas are located on the grounds.
