From the Principal, Mark Anderson...

Highland Lakes School has been working hard to prepare your children for the AzMERIT assessment that began April 2nd. We feel that we have done a great job and know that your children are very prepared to show what they have learned.

Elementary students completed their testing on April 12.

Middle school students will be testing April 3, 15, 16, 17 and 18.


Fourth grade and eighth grade students completed their AIMS testing on April 8. Tests will be administered between 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. If a student has not completed their test by 11:00 they are given additional time. Please see our website for additional testing information: <u>highlandlakes.dvusd.org</u>

Along with the test taking tips below, it is very important that during testing **all students come to school every day, arrive on time, and not be signed out for appointments**. If your child leaves during the middle of a test, according to state guidelines, they will not be able to make it up.

Helpful test taking tips:

- Make sure that your children get enough sleep. Remember that old saying about eight to ten hours of sleep a night? Being well rested is perhaps the most important and unfortunately most overlooked aspect of health when trying to stay focused.
- Make sure that your children eat healthy. Often times in our busy schedules we
 forget to take time out for our most obvious needs. If your children are not eating
 well, we cannot possibly expect them to perform well in school, or anything else. Try
 and avoid heavy foods that may make him/her groggy and avoid high sugar food.
 Make sure they are eating right.
- Encourage your child to stay relaxed on the test.
- Keep a positive attitude about tests.
- Make sure that your child gets up early enough so that he/she will be on time to school.
- Please do not schedule appointments during testing. Students who leave school before completing a particular test are ineligible to continue the test for that session.
 - Talking about the test with your child can relieve stress about test taking.

By following these suggestions, your child will have an even better chance of showing their true ability. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to ask. Thank you for all that you do. Being a parent is the most important job there is.




The Arizona Science and Engineering Fair (AzSEF) is the state science fair for Arizona. Managed by Arizona Science Center, AzSEF brings together first-place winners from school, homeschool, district, county and regional science fairs across Arizona to compete for thousands of dollars in prizes and scholarships.

Highland Lakes sent (3) teams to the Jr. Division (open to 5th-8th).

Congratulations to 7th Grader, Claire Xu, who took first place in her division of Computer Science. She is invited to compete on the National Level at the 2019 Broadcom Masters.

Claire's projects asked the question, "Does Social Media Have a Positive Impact?". Claire wrote a python code which tracked the most recent posts of 15 accounts, the number of retweets, likes, and number of followers. She then went through and found the top 1000 out of all 15 accounts and categorized them as positive, negative, or neutral. Then she made a formula to calculate a number value for positive and negative and discovered that positive was larger. Here conclusion, social media can have a positive impact.

Scoliosis: Scoliosis is defined as a lateral curvature of the spine. In 80% of cases, the scoliosis is idiopathic, meaning that it is not known what has caused the curvature. This type of scoliosis **may not cause pain and can go undetected.** However, if detected early, it can usually be treated so it will not cause any permanent problems or disabilities.



6th Grade Scoliosis Screening

The purpose of school screening is primarily to identify the child at risk of scoliosis, not to actually diagnose a spinal deformity. Please keep in mind that a more thorough spinal exam should be performed by your child's doctor during their annual physical.

Here is how I screen for scoliosis: Students will remain fully clothed. The student will be asked to bend forward at the waist with knees straightened and their arms hanging toward the floor (as if they are ready to dive into a pool). I will look up their back and check for any deviation. Any questionable results from this initial screening will be rechecked, and then parents will be notified if a follow-up evaluation is indicated.

If you have a child in the 6th grade and you do <u>not</u> want your child to be screened, please provide a note (with your signature) to the school nurse. If I do not receive a note from you declining scoliosis screening by April 23rd, I will assume that I have your permission to screen your child in the manner described above. If you have any questions or concerns, please call me, Karen Hurst, RN, BSN, at 623-376-4310.

Lice: We have had a couple cases of lice in the middle school. Six to twelve million children age 3 to 11 get lice every year in the United States alone. They're little but they're a big nuisance and don't be surprised if they bring out emotions that you didn't know you could have. In reality, lice don't care how often your child washes their hair. Here is how to check your child for lice: http://pediatrics.about.com/od/headlice/ht/808_findng_lice.htm. If you have any questions or need help identifying particles you see in your child's hair, please let me know and I will check. If your child does have lice, please let me know! Open communication is the key to preventing the spread of lice.

As far as products to use if your child has lice, here is an expert's opinion: <u>http://www.mayoclinic.org/diseases-conditions/head-lice/expert-answers/super-lice/faq-20193486</u> I guess we **should** be reassured that head lice haven't been implicated in the transmission of any diseases – other than head lice, that is.

For the 2017-2018 school year the deadline for re-applications is **September 19, 2018**. If no re-application is received by September 19th your student(s) will pay the full meal price starting September 20, 2018 until an application is received.

Policy on Unpaid Meal Charges

The Food & Nutrition Department understands that sometimes a student's meal account will run low or go into the negative. To ensure that all students are being treated equally as well as to ensure that we are being fiscally responsible with our limited resources, we want to make our meal charge policy known to all parents.

Grades Pre-K Thru 8

It is the policy of the Deer Valley Unified School District to provide a complete meal to all students. In the event a student's account has insufficient funds to pay for the meal, the account is charged. Parents/guardians shall be contacted for payment through phone calls and written notification.

À la carte purchases are not permitted when the account is in a negative balance. For more information, please read our K-8 parent letter.



Parents must sign in at the front office **and show ID** before entering campus at any time. This includes before school.

VISITING

Parents are encouraged to visit the school. All visitors to the school must report to the school office upon arrival including **before and after school**. **Picture ID is required**. You must sign in and show ID to receive a visitor's badge. For those who wish to visit a classroom during the school day, it is expected that the teacher and the principal be contacted in advance to arrange a day and time for such visit to avoid any conflicts with the school schedule.



The procedure to not allow pre-school children on the school campus for parties has been in place for some years.

Whether pre-school children or siblings attend class parties is a school decision until a districtwide procedure is developed. Highland Lakes does not allow pre-school children or siblings to attend class parties.

School Function

A 'School Function' is defined as being an activity to which all parents are invited. Location of the function is anywhere on or off your campus. If all parents are invited to the special event, siblings are also allowed to attend school special events (concerts, spelling bees, plays, kindergarten end of year graduations, etc.). The siblings must be under the direct supervision of a parent/ guardian during their visit to the school campus.

PARENTS & Siblings ON CAMPUS

- Parents who walk their children to the classroom before school must sign-in in the front office and show ID.
- Parents may eat lunch with their children in the cafeteria after signing in and showing ID.
- Pre-school children may accompany parents to lunch in the cafeteria.
- Parents are not allowed on the playground.

Volunteering

Parents who volunteer on a regular or reoccurring basis will need to attend a basic volunteer training. Trainings last approximately 30 minutes and you will receive all necessary volunteer materials.

Overnight field trip chaperones must be fingerprinted. You MUST attend a training PRIOR to being fingerprinted. Fingerprints take 8 weeks for results to be returned to us; allow plenty of time for this to be done.

CUTS Program: (<u>Court Unified Truancy Suppression</u>)

To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students. SIGNING OUT

To ensure that our academic time is respected, we are asking that parents <u>do not sign out</u> their children between 3:15 and 3:30. Fifteen minutes a day, added up over a month represents almost a full day of classes missed.
