Letter from the Co-Presidents

Dear PACT Members,

We hope that everyone had a relaxing and refreshing summer. As we all head into the new school year, we want to wish you all a happy and successful year.

Unfortunately or fortunately, we have had many challenges that we are working to overcome one step at a time. In late June we discovered that "PACT" had not been registered and did not have a tax ID number. Fortunately, since we did not make money or profit over the years, it did not prove to be a tax issue. We are now registered as "Potomac Association of Cooperative Teachers Inc." and have obtained a tax ID number as well as non-profit status.

Secondly, the requirements for holding Professional Developmental Days has been revised by MSDE, so we have to work on getting the rights to hold our training days. So PACT has recently formed an affiliation with Silver Spring Day School, in order to comply with MSDE regulations that require our organization to be affiliated with a recognized state or national child care association. Due also to these regulations, members attending the Fall Professional Development Day will be issued their certificates by the Silver Spring Day School Institute. SSDS's willingness to assist PACT by entering into this affiliation, and thereby facilitating the October 18 training day, is much appreciated. The PACT Board is working toward re-establishing the organization's independent status in the future.

We would like to say a very special thanks to our continuing Board members, Annette Fitzpatrick - VP of Membership, Melissa Mitchell Jordan - Secretary, Janise Allyn-Smith -Treasurer and Scott Mitchell - VP of Programs who hunkered down and helped greatly during all the changes, planning and success of these unexpected situations. Workshop Content Description and Core of Knowledge Areas

1. Innovative Story Telling Techniques - Emily Ederer Curriculum 1.5 hours

Storytelling can bring a little magic into your classroom! In this workshop, experience a variety of easy ways to integrate the arts into your stories, involve the audience and capture children's imaginations. As a result of this training, you will be able to:

- 1) Enhance your storytelling for young children with several different techniques, including prop boxes, music, drawing, drums, drama and dance.
- 2) Identify the direct connections between storytelling and early childhood literacy goals.
- 3) Design appropriate follow-up activities to extend children's enjoyment and understanding of the story.

2. Circle Time Strategies - Jill Lyons Curriculum 1.5 hours

- 1. During this workshop the participants will explore how to make circle time developmentally appropriate.
- **2.** Workshop will include how to plan circle time taking into consideration different developmental stages, ages of children and needs of the individual child.

3. Change is hard. Take a Flying Leap Anyway! - Jennifer Debernardis Professionalism 1.5 hours

How can you use your observation of children, talent as a lifelong learner and what you know about best practices and child development to inform your collaboration with children in your classroom? Where can you find resources to support your evolution? Think about how you can you support children in risk taking by being a risk taker yourself. Think about making play a priority when push down academics looms at every turn.

4. Teaching from the Heart: Creating a Habit of Happiness and Authentic Connection In and Outside the Classroom - Kaira Jewel Lingo

Child Development .5 hours, Curriculum .5 hours, Community .5 hours each

Happiness is possible for us and our students. The potential for joy, peace and understanding exist in each of us and we can nurture these qualities in ourselves and in our students every day. We can transform our very human "negativity bias" and make a habit of happiness. In this workshop, we will learn practices that can restore ease and well-being in ourselves and our students, nurture gratitude and deepen joy. We will also learn ways to understand and mindfully care for our difficulties and painful emotions and how well-being and challenges are not mutually exclusive, but can co-exist. We will explore how we can engage in authentic

communication with ourselves, our colleagues and students and create a culture of compassion and connection throughout the school community.

5. Integrating the Arts to Support the Social-Emotional Development of Young Children - Anita Weisburger Child Development 1.5 hours

Learn how integrating drama, dance, music, visual art and literature/poetry into any subject or lesson plan enhances children's social-emotional development. Discover how you can provide creative experiences that allow children to grow within themselves and in relation to others. Participants will identify ways to integrate the arts effectively into classroom curricula, with an emphasis on multicultural awareness and active engagement; gain an understanding of arts integration philosophy and the research in support of its adoption; and describe the multiple influences on children's social and emotional development and learning.

6. Welcoming Challenging Children into the Co-op Classroom - Sally Neuberger Special Needs 1.5 hours

This workshop will help educators consider how to plan for and welcome challenging and complicated children with differences into the school day.

Objectives:

- a)Participants will be able to summarize what the professional literature suggests about the educators' role in creating an inclusive preschool setting
- b) Participants will identify 5 strategies for accommodating young children with unique learning/behavioral needs

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c) Participants will identify 10 strategies for supporting co-op parents and classmates in welcoming and including peers with unique learning profiles

7. Speech and Language Development - Melissa Grosvenor and Laura Kyger Child Development 1.5 hours

This workshop will detail the development of speech and language including precursors to language, language use, language form, language content, language comprehension, and language surrounding pretend play. Participants will be able to:

- 1) identify language precursors and plan meaningful activities to support development of this area in young children;
- 2) identify the concepts of form, content, and use and further identify early developing capacities in each of these categories;
- 3) identify when language development is derailed and when a referral is necessary.

8. Music through the Day - Gail Multop Child Development .75 hours, Curriculum .75 hours each

Every day, music, rhythm, and song make learning more joyful and satisfying. But beyond that, music is an important part of every child's development and environment. Learn to be more confident in integrating music and musical concepts into all areas of a child's day.

- The student will learn how musical development has a window of opportunity, just as language has.
- The student will begin to comprehend how music can help in language arts, science, and math.
- The student will participate in a group music activity.
- The student will learn about how to bring music outdoors.
- The student will gain awareness of world music that children love.

9. Positive Discipline or Power Tools for Power Struggles- Paige Trevor Child Development 1.5 hours

* Note this workshop is in two parts – sessions 1 and 2.

Positive Discipline [First session / 9:45 - 11:15 am]

Move away from punishment and toward using encouragement, consequences, limits and agreements for an approach to discipline that stimulates cooperation and self-restraint.

Power Tools for Power Struggles [Second session / 11:45 am - 1:15 pm]

Frequent power struggles, whether between adults or between parents and children, impact relationships. Learn what happens when a conflict develops and gain some insights into redirecting that energy in ways that tend to solve problems and bring people closer.

10. Preschool is Primed for STEM - Maria Payso Curriculum 1.5 hours

STEM is an educational approach to learning where children learn and apply concepts in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. By nature, early childhood settings are primed to support STEM learning. The goals for this training are:

- 1. Understand what it means to have a STEM curriculum;
- 2. Learn how STEM can be developmentally appropriate for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers;
- 3. Learn how to plan activities that invite children to observe, explore, investigate, problem-solve, experiment, and design.
