Chimney Rock's 155th Anniversary to be Held October 19

In September of 2019, a committee was formed and began meeting monthly to plan for Chimney Rock's 150th Anniversary, which was originally scheduled for September 20, 2020. Due to Covid in early 2020, we had to cancel that date, but in those few months many things on our list were accomplished:

- We chose a new theme, "By His Grace, For His Glory," based on several verses in the book of Romans.
- We began using this theme on weekly bulletin covers.
- We designed and ordered a 150th indoor banner from Supreme Graphics.
- We commissioned Bob Speltz from the Whitehall area to paint a new outdoor sign, again using our theme.
- We ordered and sold trivets with a picture of Chimney Rock Lutheran Church.
- And we also helped a family from Malawi, Africa (our companion Synod) by purchasing farm animals through ELCA Good Gifts, earning \$715 for that mission.

Now, the council has decided to complete what began over five years ago! As we mentioned in the June-July newsletter, we're still in the planning stages for our 155th Anniversary on October 19 and want to keep the celebration simple and more informal than previous anniversaries. This is what we have decided:

- Worship will be held at the usual time of 9:30am, with guest speaker Pastor Diane House, Assistant to the Bishop in the Northwest Synod.
- The Lorn & Royce Band will provide the music for the service and perhaps other musicians will be added.
- A meal in the church basement will follow the morning worship. We aren't requiring RSVPs. A free will offering will be taken for the meal instead of setting a price.
- We want this to be like a family reunion of former and current members, including those who have been baptized or confirmed at Chimney Rock and may have moved away from the area.
- There will be lots of time to mingle and visit, especially during and after the meal.
- Please help us get the word out. So far, we've been announcing the 155th in our weekly bulletins, monthly newsletter, on Facebook, on our church website (www.chimneyrockchurch.org), and via personal texts and emails. We're asking all of you to help too by telling your family members and friends who have ties to Chimney Rock. A flyer/poster is attached which you can forward to others if you receive the newsletter via email OR take a picture of the flyer with your cell phones and text to others.

We're looking forward to seeing you on October 19 to celebrate Chimney Rock Lutheran Church, which began in 1870. We have reason to celebrate all those who went before us, those who built this beautiful church building, worshipped here, and supported the congregation for 155 years, spreading God's word from generation to generation. This is a time to thank God for all His blessings!

Chimney Rock Congregational Council Minutes – June 9, 2025

Call to Order—Trustee Forrest Nutter called the June 9, 2025, meeting to order at 6:35pm. Members present: Monica Dejno, Jerry Erickson, Richard Gunderson, Barb McGee, Mary Olson, Pastor David Sands, Dan Solfest, and Barb Sylla. Don Solfest was absent.

Devotions—Monica read Romans 5:1-5 and led in discussion. Pastor Sands shared an opening prayer.

Secretary's Report was read by Barb. Mary and Barb M. motioned to accept, and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report—Dan distributed the report ending May 31, 2025. Richard made a motion to accept, Jerry seconded, and motion carried.

Old Business:

- 1) Jurowski Construction will soon submit a bid for repairing/painting small bell tower windows. Stendahl Painting has been contacted for a bid on painting storm windows.
- 2) Forrest and Monica swapped keys, so she now has a front-door key.
- 3) Summer attendance incentives—one student has been attending.
- 4) Synod Assembly—Pastor Sands reported on the April 26th Assembly. 298 voting delegates attended, all resolutions passed, including "love your neighbor."
- 5) Pastor Sands and Chimney Rock's delegate Bev Paulsen attended the annual meeting of the American Lutheran Home. The new CEO is doing a good job of managing, with a positive operating increase of \$554,000 in 2024.
- 6) No service at Chimney Rock on July 6, 2025, as we will attend the July 4th Ecumenical Worship at the Pleasantville Ballpark.
- 7) 155th Anniversary on October 19, 2025—Pastor contacted and confirmed the Lorn & Royce Band. There was more discussion about the menu, invitations, notifying people, and other details. It was suggested that we ask Jason to place information in a prominent place on our website and to post on Facebook.

New Business:

- 1) Grant—Monica reported that a \$7.4 million grant has been awarded to Wartburg Seminary (Castle Project), which will benefit SAMS (Synod Authorized Ministries) in rural, small-town parishes across the ELCA throughout the United States. This is in the very early stages.
- 2) Monica is scheduled to preach on June 29, the fifth Sunday of the month.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Sunday, August 10, immediately after worship.

Adjournment—Barb M. and Mary motioned to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:44pm.
