Statewide FYSPRT meeting notes -	2. Youth and Young Adult Continuum of Care Update: YYACC is a subgroup of the Children and Youth
<u>December 10, 2024</u>	Behavioral Health Work Group (CYBHWG) and voted in October on overarching priorities agreed on
	by the group. YYACC has identified 6 priorities – expanding access to peer support services, support
	expansion of recovery high schools, fund administration for CAPS (Centralized Assessment of
	Psychosis Services), expand the Bridge Housing Program, increase and sustain funding for Youth
	Wellness Zone, and supporting the autism spectrum and intellectual disability (ASD/IDD) workforce
	serving youth and young adults. For more information, see <u>the recommendations for 2025 from the</u>
	Children and Youth Behavioral Health Work Group (provided in a report to the Governor's Office and the Legislature).
	 Youth Only Space Update: The Youth Network Development Team is currently building, growing,
	and developing the Youth Network structure and activities. Young people are leading this project
	and determining what the Youth Network and youth only spaces will look like. In 2025, the Youth
	Network is wanting to reach out to offer support and assistance to Youth Tri-leads.
	4. Respite Update: Respite care for youth and families was first identified as a need by the
	Regional/Statewide FYSPRTs in 2017 and further discussed in 2020 with legislative groups. In 2021,
	the Health Care Authority (HCA) was tasked with exploring Medicaid waiver options for respite
	services for youth with behavioral health needs, culminating in the 2022 report on potential
	implementation options.
	In 2024, caregiver respite was approved under Washington's Medicaid Transformation Project
	(MTP) waiver, which focuses on improving healthcare for Medicaid recipients. A cross-agency
	workgroup is being developed, and service eligibility and details are being negotiated with the
	Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Proposed services aim to provide non-medical,
	short-term supervision to prevent caregiver burnout and avoid institutional placements. Eligible
	providers could include behavioral health agencies, crisis support services, and respite facilities.
	Public comments on the proposed rates for in-home and facility respite care were invited through
	December 2024. Continued engagement with individuals with lived experience is shaping the design
	of the respite program, which is still under development.

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Standing Items	 Crisis: FYSPRT team had questions around Joel's Law. Team shared some information and gave each other feedback around Joel's Law. There was a recommendation to have someone from Crisis Team come and provide more information on Joel's Law at a future regional meeting. Behavioral Health Providers: Kassey Garcia shares about New Journeys program. She reports that the program is now accepting other diagnosis that in the past did not take. She would like to present at a future FYSPRT meeting and FYSPRT members are interested in this as well. MCOs: No updates WISe: Team had a brief discussion around need for WISE like services. A FYSPRT member shared that Three Rivers Therapy in Tri Cities is taking non-Medicaid referral for WISe services. YARP: Accepting referrals, in all 9 counties, continue to build community relationships and open to table in your area. Schools/ESD: No updates DSHS/DCYF/DDA: No updates Other: Cyndy Adams shares some of the confusion with the Certified Peer Specialist title and work being done to get this possibly changed.
