Real Love By Amanda Wolfe

Psalm 68:5-6 TPT To the fatherless he is a father. To the widow he is a champion friend. To the lonely he gives a family. To the prisoners he leads into prosperity until they sing for joy. This is our Holy God in his Holy Place!

Have you ever experienced what it's like to be truly loved? I'm not talking about the mushy gushy make out session Hollywood calls love, but I mean the kind of love where someone stretches their hand into your deepest, darkest pit and pulls you out – the kind of love where someone sees you at your worst, in your most guilty, undeserving position and pays the price to get you out with their own life. What kind of man or woman would do that? What kind of love is this where a sinner is saved at the expense of the innocent? What kind of love is this where someone calls the very one who betrayed them, "friend"? (*Matthew 26:50*) Can you even imagine what it would be like for the one you've hurt the most to offer to lay down their life for you? Maybe you've cheated someone, lied to someone, stolen from someone … maybe you've even killed someone. Imagine that very person or their father, mother or child saying they forgive you and then giving their life in place of yours to pay the price for your sin? This is what real love is and looks like.

"Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's triands." (John 15:13) Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34)

You may think, "No, I knew what I was doing" or "No, they knew what they were doing," but God says this because He understands the truth is that all sin at the root is simply unbelief. The failure to recognize God Himself as love or to accept ourselves as His beloved child (not believing either of these truths) is the root to every evil behavior. It's really that simple. Man often complicates things, but God has given us a very simple way to live the life and life more abundantly He promises in His Word. Through revelation and understanding of who God really is – LOVE – and receiving His love for us personally and intimately as the very root of our identity, we live DAILY in the effects of that believed and received love. His Spirit (the Spirit of love) fills us with God's very own love which is the source of miraculous power that enabled Jesus to go to the Cross for us and die for a people who wanted to kill Him.

No man can love like that on his own. No person can forgive the offenses of another that has abused him or his family, except that the love of God floods his soul!!! No child can forgive their father for having abandoned them or beat them, and no father can forgive himself for having done those things, lest the love of God fills his soul!! God's very love enables us to do what we could never do on our own, and to live in a joy and peace and freedom on the other side of those situations that no one in their natural mind could ever fathom would be possible. And this love – GOD'S love – all powerful, miraculous love – has been POURED OUT into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us! (*Romans 5:5*)

God's supply for us NEVER runs out!! (2 Corinthians 9:8-12) Sometimes man just stops running into it and taking from what is already His in Christ. Whether because a person feels they are unworthy to receive, that God is mad at them, they feel guilt and condemnation, or whatever the lie may be, every day the blood of Jesus that has been poured out for us is constantly spilling over and goes to waste if we aren't drinking from it. The greatest crime truly is when the abundant provisions of grace Jesus gave His life for us to be made worthy to receive flow freely and man does not partake of them. Forgiveness, healing, peace, joy, freedom, truth, acceptance, etc. are flowing freely and abundantly from heaven's throne. Yet, every time we believe a lie about God (thinking He is anything other than the image of love being poured out to us), every time we believe a lie that we aren't worthy to receive, that we aren't good enough, or that our sin is too great, what we are really saying is that what Jesus did for us wasn't enough!! An innocent, perfect man (who was also 100% God) gave up His life for us, so the greatest gift we can give back to Him is to live in it.

Welcome God's love to overflow in your soul!

Personalize the scripture:

The Scripture below in *Ephesians* is a prayer Paul prayed for the church at that time and for all of us who would come after him to deeply and intimately KNOW God's love. Before you adopt the prayer as your own, I encourage you to read it first one time, and as you are reading the Scripture, personalize it by marking an X on every "you" and instead write in "me" so that when you pray, you are reminded the promise is yours personally. If you don't have a pen or a pencil, you can just say, "me" instead of "you" when you get there ... I encourage you to do this often when you read the Bible. Every promise in God's Word is for you personally and is already yours in Christ! (*2 Corinthians 1:20*)

Prepare your heart to see God's love doing a mighty work in you:

As you pray, see God's love overflowing in your soul and doing a miraculous work any place you need it! Let His love into those deep, dark places in your soul that you've kept closed off to everyone, and see His love doing a mighty work in you. See that Jesus chose to give His life for you while you were a sinner, and that God has proven His love, not only in word, but in deed. Let go of all resentment, bitter thoughts, unforgiveness, guilt, condemnation, and every lie that has been a heavy weight in your soul. Make an exchange as you let love in. Receive the abundance of grace and peace as it is flowing into your sou!!

Prayer:

Ephesians 3:14:21 TPT - (14) So I kneel humbly in awe before the Father of our Lord Jesus, the Messiah, (15) the perfect Father of every father and child in heaven and on the earth. (16) And I pray that he would unveil within you the unlimited riches of his glory and favor until supernatural strength floods your innermost being with his divine might and explosive power. (17) Then, by constantly using your faith, the life of Christ will be released deep inside you, and the resting place of his love will become the very source and root of your life. I love reading how God is working in my brothers and sisters lives. God has put it on my heart to share what He's doing in my own life. So I'd like to share my testimony.

I'm a fairly new Christian. I'm in my mid 30's and as of 2016, saved and accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior.

HALLELUJAY! I got out of prison in 2014 and unfortunately relapsed on heroin about a month before coming back to prison. I found myself back in the mess I was in before going to prison. I started using meth with the heroin and ended up shooting them together. I was AGAIN getting arrested and before long had a handful of felony charges.

I was in the Durango jail for a couple of months trying to convince my mother to bond me out, after numerous phone calls, she agreed. With the exception that I would check myself into a rehab of my choice. I made bond and started searching for rehabs in my area. I found one but committing to thirteen months sounded crazy. This time was different because I actually wanted to change, but for myself and not what everyone else was telling me.

I ended up choosing Teen Challenge, who welcomed me with open arms. That was the best decision I'd ever made. I was there from August 2016, until the day before my sentencing, February 2017. I was also baptized on November 2016. God called me there, it wasn't a coincidence that I picked the longest rehab around. I learned so much about Jesus' finished work on the Cross, and am so thankful for that.

As of the time I'm sending this testimony I'm 540 days clean and sober. I now turn to the Lord for the strength to stay sober. AMEN! Today I'm taking advantage of the programs available and will have my Associates degree in Applied Science in HVAC Technologies by the time I'm released at the end of the year. I look at this time as a blessing in disguise. Like I was sent off to college so that I have a career path when I get out. I am doing great, I feel great and do my best to let others see the Christ through me. Thank you for letting me share this with everyone. God IS good, ALL of the time! - K.S.

Well, my plans for when I am released are not at this time completely mapped out. I've sort of got myself an idea I'm playing around with in my head. But I've still got some time to form a more concrete plan. So I've been praying about my future and handing my life and future over to the Lord and allowing Him to work His will in my life. I do know in my heart that I can't just get out and return to my old stomping grounds or homeless and depending on my parole officer to house me. Please keep me in your prayers on this particular matter. Please pray for my new celli and his family and that they reunite very soon and have a good loving future. Pray for all of the inmates and CO's everywhere who are still not yet living in the Lord's truth. Pray for all of our safety while we're incarcerated and for the safe travels and well being of all our families as they travel back and forth to visit us ... J.M.

Last August 1st, I had a younger inmate attack me because I refused to give him a cigarette. I lost my left eye in the attack. Since that time, I have had numerous operations to restore my eyesight. I was taken to a medical clinic in Phoenix and given a cadaver eye. The surgeon worked on my new eye installation for 2 1/2 hours. I'm happy to say it was successful. My muscle tissue on the bottom of my eye was so damaged that I lost movement in my eye to look down and up. When I look straight ahead, I can see perfectly. Praise the Lord for His blessing bestowed upon me. The surgeon, in answer to my question if I can get a motorcycle license, said, "Yes." I know it sounds crazy, but I just wanted to ride my Harley again in freedom. God is good ... A.M.

Why are you, or why were you in prison, is one of the most challenging questions a prisoner or former prisoner must face. It is a question which is asked not only by others, but one which each prisoner must ask - and answer - themselves. Simplistically, each question may easily be answered by stating the nature of the offense for which they are imprisoned; however, life changing events are rarely as simple as they appear. Therefore, to obtain a better understanding of why someone is in prison, perhaps we should consider a different view, by looking through the eyes of a prisoner. Welcome to my world.

In the Chronicles of Namia, C. S. Lewis wrote, "What you see and hear depends a great deal on where you stand, and what sort of person you are." In other words, how we view things in this life depends on who we are and where we stand in our present circumstances.

For example, once the natural and legal consequences of our sins and criminal acts led us to prison, how do we then view such things? Is imprisonment purely an act of man, or a scheme of the enemy, or are we being rescued and delivered by the mighty hand of a loving and merciful God? Do we view prison as punishment, as discipline and correction, or as an opportunity to grow and serve?

Prison is naturally viewed as a place of punishment, and for those who choose to see and believe they are being punished, prison remains a difficult and dreadful place. However, for a child of God, who has been saved through faith in Jesus Christ, (*Ephesians 2:8*) prison is not a place of such punishment. For Jesus took the punishment which was due us upon himself when He died upon the cross for our sins. So for the believer, since prison is not a place of punishment, there must be a greater purpose.

Believers and even unbelievers may view prison as a place of discipline and as an opportunity for correction. There is great value and blessing for those who learn to patiently receive and endure such discipline; for the purpose of discipline is to help conform the one being disciplined into the image of Christ and to help fulfill God's purpose in their lives. (Romans 8:28-29)

Prisoners who see their circumstances only as a place of punishment, or even just as our Father's loving discipline may yet miss out on God's intended purpose. Those who choose to believe they are being punished often have unbroken hearts and are clinging to worthless idols. Without brokenness, humility, or worshipping the One True God, prison may well appear to be a place of punishment from which one may seek to escape. However, those who choose to believe they are being disciplined have a better, yet incomplete view. For while discipline may be painful in the present, it produces in the one being disciplined, "the peaceable fruit of righteousness." (*Hebrews 2:11*)

Why would God use loving discipline to bring forth "peaceable fruit of righteousness?" What more is prison than just punishment in a worldly view, and more than discipline and correction in a spiritual view? What if prison is a place beyond punishment, or discipline or correction, but a place of deliverance where God is working all things together for good for those who love Him and are called according to His purpose? (*Romans 8:28*) What if prison - which the world sees as a wilderness of punishment - is actually a place where God has brought us - just as He brought Israel out of Egypt, and where Jesus Christ is calling us; just. He called His disciples - not to surrender, but to submit our lives to His authority and to follow Him wherever He leads?

For when we choose to follow Him, instead of seeking our own desires, we are given authority; we are given power; we are given grace; and we are given peace. David recognized the authority, power, grace, and peace of God in spite of his circumstances when he wrote, "I would have lost heart, unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait on the Lord. Be of good courage and He shall strengthen your heart. Wait, I say, on the Lord" (Psalm 27:13-14 NKJV) But of Israel in the wilderness, the Psalmist wrote, "They (Israel) soon forgot His works. They did not wait for His counsel, but lusted exceedingly in the desert, and He gave them their requests, but He sent leanness to their souls." (Psalm 106:13-15 NKJV)

So the question becomes, is prison a place a punishment, of discipline, or a place of deliverance? Prisoners who love



God above all else, and are the called according to His purpose are being conformed to the image of our Savior, Jesus Christ, for His purpose and for His glory. Therefore, prison is not always a place of punishment, not even a place of discipline and correction, but a place where one is given an opportunity to grow and serve.

For what you see and hear and believe depends a great deal on where you stand; and whether you believe prison is a place of punishment; or discipline and correction, or deliverance and opportunity - it is exactly what you say. The way to freedom in prison is not through the gate, but through learning from the **Psalms** to:

"Trust in the Lord and do good, dwell in the land and feed on His faithfulness, delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass. He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light And your justice as the noon day. Rest in the Lord and wait patiently for Him, do not fret because of the man who prospers in his way, because of the man who brings wicked schemes to pass, Cease from anger and forsake wrath, do not fret, it only causes harm." (Psalm 37:3-8 NKJV)

I have been in the system since 2005. There were times I thought prison was a place of punishment; and it was. There were times I thought it was a place of discipline and it was and still is. However, I am learning to see prison differently, as a place where all who believe the gospel of Jesus Christ, and who love God are the chosen and called according to His purpose. In some cases we are being disciplined and corrected; however, such discipline is not without purpose, but that we shall be delivered from the power of sin even as we have been delivered from the penalty of sin, so that through the Holy Spirit we shall be witnesses to Jesus Christ in prison and unto the world.

Brother, never feel discouraged because I feel so grateful for your words. Believe me, they help me and they encourage me. They've opened my eyes and softened what once was a hardened heart! Remember this, God used you and the SC+C family to do this. But it took five years for me to realize and be able to write and tell you all of my gratitude. Foot's Bible Study Rotes

Nehemiah 9:22-10:39

Israel was devastated by times of intense rebellion and sin. Yet when the people repented and returned to God, He delivered them. God puts no limits on the number of times that we can come to Him to obtain mercy, but we must come to obtain it, recognizing our need and asking Him for help. This miracle of grace should inspire us to say, "What a gracious and merciful God You are!" If there is a reoccurring problem or difficulty in your life, continue to ask God for His help. And be willing and ready to make changes in your attitude and behavior that will help correct that situation. (9:28-31)

Our culture often makes us choose between convenience and profit on one hand, and putting God first on the other. Take a look at your work and worship habits, is God really first? (10:31)

1 Corinthians 9:19-10:13

The Christian life includes both freedom and discipline. The goals of Paul's life were to glorify God and bring his people to Christ. Thus he stayed free of any philosophical position or material entanglement that might side track him, while he strictly disciplined himself to carry out his goal. For Paul, both freedom and discipline were important tools to be used in God's service. (9:19-27)

Psalm 33:12-34:22

God can, and often does, miraculously deliver His followers from pain and death. Although sometimes, for purposes known only to Him, He chooses not to. When faced with these harsh realities, we must focus on the wise judgments of God. The writer was pleading for God's watchful care and protection. In times of crisis, we can place our hope in God.

Remember, God knows what we need, and our deepest needs are spiritual. Many Christians, even though they face unbearable poverty and hardship, still have enough spiritual nourishment to live for God. David was saying here that if you have God, you have all you really need. God is enough. (34:9-10)

David said that a person who fears the Lord doesn't lie, turns from evil, does good, and promotes peace. Reverence is much more than sitting quietly in church. It includes obeying God in the way we speak and the way we treat others. (34:11-14)

Proverbs 21:13-16

We should work to meet the needs of the poor and protect their rights for someday we too may be in need of such services ourselves. (21:13)

Justice is not a heavy obligation that weighs a person down. For the righteous, promoting justice is a joy. For the wicked, there is no joy in justice, nor will there be joy in their final end. (21:14)

You can ask Him to help you get to know Him better and why are you here? What is your destiny and purpose for being placed on this earth? We all have one you know. Have a conversation about how you want to know Him more. We live and have joy through Him and Him alone. Life happens, people mean well but often disappoint or push us away and that gets old. He is faithful and always waiting with open arms for us ... especially, for you.
