## ORDINANCE NO. 97-

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

## Section 1. POLICE DEPARTMENT.

There is hereby established a police department for the Village of Chapin which shall consist of such employees as may be provided for by the Board of Trustees.

#### Section 2. EMPLOYMENT.

The employees of the department shall be employed by the Village President, by and with the consent of the Board of Trustees. The Village President, by and with the consent of the Board of Trustees, may designate one such employee of the department as the Chief of Police. Employees of the department shall work such hours each week as designated by the Village President, but not to exceed the maximum number hours established by the Board of Trustees or Village President, unless previously specifically authorized in writing by the Village President. The corporate authorities may establish such hiring and employment standards, rules and regulations as determined necessary from time to time.

#### Section 3. RESIDENCY.

Employees of the department shall not be required to be residents of the Village.

### Section 4. SUPERVISION.

Employees of the department shall be under the supervision and control of the Village President, pursuant to authority granted herein; provided that if a Chief of Police is designated, the Chief shall be responsible for the supervision of the other employees of the department.

## Section 5. GENERAL DUTIES.

It shall be the duty of the employees of the department to see to the enforcement of all of the Ordinances of the Village and all statutes applicable therein, and to preserve order and prevent infractions of the law and arrest violators thereof and to perform such other duties as the President and Board of Trustees shall prescribe for the preservation of the peace and the observance and enforcement of the ordinances and laws.

## Section 6. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The President and Board of Trustees may prescribe such rules and regulations as shall be deemed advisable for the operation of the department.

Section 7. CONDUCT.

It shall be the duty and obligation of every employee of the department to conduct himself or herself in a proper and law abiding manner, at all times, to obey the directions of his or her supervisor and to avoid the use of unnecessary force.

Section 8. COMPENSATION.

Employees of the department shall be paid such compensation as determined by the President and Board of Trustees.

Section 9. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication in pamphlet form.
