## Touring Adventures in Virginia's Northern Neck with Charles & Barbara Emery

Rather than do a full restoration, it is being stabilized for education purposes and architectural glass will enclose the various parts so that one can observe the attention to detail and the sound building of old homes, not just cars. In the afternoon, while car owners were taking a walking tour of Tappahannock and soaking up its history, the cars were on display in the center square which the locals got to appreciate.

Friday evening's closing dinner was a fun-filled time as everyone gathered with new friends and old. Awards were given for the youngest, oldest, and traveled the furthest drivers. The Emerys received the "tough luck" award. Good fun was had by all. Much appreciation and many thanks to Wayne and Gloria Burgess, Tour Chairpersons, and all the members of the Northern neck Region AACA for the hospitality and smoothness of a wonderfully constructed tour.
