She was offering me advice since I was then president; and if you knew her, you know that advice was always available, on-point, and helpful. After a while into our exchange, I asked her what she had done in her career. She replied with a wry smile, "I was a cop". I stood in silence, stunned by the information that I never would have guessed. She was not just a cop, she was the first female detective to serve on San Antonio's police force. She served admirably as a detective, a job that requires distinct qualities and intelligence. More than that, she worked at the State Hospital as a psychologist and worked with the Volunteer Services Council, a group started by members of The Woman's Club. Barbara was an Eleanor of the best kind: serious, determined, loving, and not bound by what society told her she should be.

I loved her and admired her.....End of Watch...may you rest in peace."
