CRS helps communities find solutions to each of these problems. Farming families learn new skills and grow stronger, healthier harvests. Communities train health care workers so children can get regular check-ups and parents can learn new nutritious recipes to make sure their families get a balanced diet. People in vulnerable areas prepare for unpredictable weather that could destroy crops. Jesus calls us to help those in need. Our Lenten prayers, fasting and sacrificial gifts help us answer this call. Pick up your families Rice bowl at the exits of the Church.
