Thank you for the opportunity to serve your student(s) balanced and nutritious meals.

Unfortunately, the U.S.D.A., whom administers the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs, has announced that meals will return to pre-Covid pricing next fall. Meals will no longer be free for all students beginning with the 22/23 academic year.

Deer Valley Unified School District understands that our students and families still face many, many economic challenges. We highly encourage parents/guardians to complete a Free and Reduced Meal Application for their household this summer. Please note that the USDA has not yet released the applications for the 2022/23 academic year. All families that have updated email contacts in PowerSchools will receive notification from DVUSD in July, as soon as the applications are released.

We know your time is valuable. Please note that the few minutes required to complete a meal application can also offer additional opportunities to support and assist your family. Students eligible for free/reduced meals can also qualify for additional benefits – It's More Than a Meal Application!

End of the Year Information

Dear Parents.

In order to keep you informed and to prepare for the end of the school year, please see the information below.

Grades will be final on Monday, May 16th for all 7th and 8th grade students.

<u>Library Materials</u> - All library materials must be returned by May 6th. Detention for overdue books and fines will start on Monday, May 9th. Students may return books before and after school.

<u>Backpacks</u> - The last day for backpacks will be Friday, May 13th. Beginning Monday, May 16th, middle school students may not bring a backpack to school.

<u>Chromebooks</u> must be turned in on Thursday May 12th for 4-6th Grade and Monday, May 16th for 7-8th Grade. Please follow the protocol below for turning in Chromebooks:

- Prior to turning in Chromebooks and charging chords:
 - All stickers, tape, etc. must be removed
 - PowerWash the Chromebook. Students will be given instructions on how to PowerWash their Chromebook.
- Fees
 - Lost charging cords = \$20 fee, with or without the device protection plan.
 - o If the Chromebook has a cracked screen or other damage, the fees will be as follows
 - \$50 if you signed up for the protection plan at the beginning of the year and this is your first claim this year
 - \$100 -if you signed up for the protection plan at the beginning of the year and this is NOT your first claim this year
- \$125 if you did NOT sign up for the protection plan at the beginning of the year These fees will be charged to the student's account. If not paid, these fines will follow them through their time in DVUSD. You can pay your fees online at:

- If students are taking a summer school class, they will still turn in their Chromebook. The summer school will issue devices.
- **Promotion Dance** The 8th grade promotion dance will be held on May 13th from 5:30 7:00 p.m. The dance is free for all promoting students heading to high school. Your child may get a permission slip from their ELA teacher. Permission slips are due in the front office on May 12th by 3:30 p.m.

8TH GRADE PROMOTION INFO

Dear 8th Grade Parents;

The following information is presented to assist you in planning for the eighth grade promotion ceremony.

When? Eighth grade promotion night is Wednesday, May 18th, at 5:00 p.m. in our gymnasium. Students will rehearse on Wednesday morning and will be dismissed to go home as soon as rehearsal is completed at 12:05 p.m. Bus transportation will be made available for regular bus riders following the rehearsal. Non-bus riders are responsible for their own transportation arrangements.

When should my child arrive for the ceremony? All eighth graders should arrive at school by 4:30 p.m. and report to the library for the promotion ceremony. It is very important to be on time.

What if my child is late? Students arriving after their class is seated will be unable to participate in the ceremony.

When does the ceremony start and where? The ceremony will be in the gym and will start at 5:00 p.m. The program will last approximately 45 minutes.

Tickets: In order to insure our promotion ceremony is safe for our students and families, we will be limiting the number of guests attending to 3 guests per promoting student. Your tickets are being mailed to you. Because we understand that many families have more than 3 family members that would like to attend the ceremony, we have made accommodations to broadcast a "live feed" of the ceremony in our multipurpose room. This will insure that every family member may still be a part of the ceremony without creating an unsafe situation.

Student Dress:

Girls- Dresses, skirts and blouses, or pants outfits. Skirt length must be respectable; no mini-skirts or floor length skirts. No backless, strapless, midriffs or spaghetti strap dresses or blouses. Please avoid high heels for safety reasons.

Boys- Dress slacks or dress jeans, dress shirts. Suits/sport jackets and ties are optional.

Parking: Both parking lots will be open. Please do not block driveways in the neighborhood. At the end of the ceremony, Glendale Police Officers will direct traffic. All cars parked in the north lot will be directed north towards Utopia; all cars in the south lot will be directed south towards Union Hills. The police have full authority over the direction of the traffic. Highland Lakes has hired three Glendale Police Officers to direct traffic and to take any action necessary to ensure the safety of the students and guests. Limousines will not be allowed in the parking lots at any time.

Cheering: We ask that you save any cheering until after your child's class crosses the stage. This will allow all parents to hear their child's name read.

Should my child attend school on Thursday? Eighth graders complete requirements for promotion on Wednesday. They are permitted to attend classes on Thursday, if desired.

Please help us in honoring our eighth graders by following the above guidelines. Thank you for your cooperation.




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
For this year's Glow Week in Art, each grade level was assigned an artwork that follows the theme Glow Garden.






Mrs. Martin's 2nd Graders celebrated Earth Day by picking up garbage and then doing STEM experiments with the recycled materials.








