• The Virginia Wagner Educational Award honors a woman enrolled in a university degree program, shows effort toward scholarship, has volunteered in the community and/or school, and has financial need.

**Lauren Gothro** was named this year's Virginia Wagner Educational Award winner. She attends Wayne State University and plans to complete her Master of Social Work degree by May 2024.

Lauren says she chose social work because she is "passionate about individual growth and large-scale changes." Her goal is to support people who are healing emotionally and to advocate for policies that will improve systemic issues in our country and communities.

◆ The Live Your Dream awards are given to women who provide the primary financial support for their families. It gives women the resources they need to improve their education, skills, and employment prospects.

First place awardee Jamie Pakula earned her Associate Degree in Nursing from Macomb Community College, and has been accepted at University of Michigan Flint. Her dream to go into nursing originated when she became a mother. She says, "I look forward to becoming a nurse and helping people who come in at their worst and helping them recover so they can go home feeling their best. I picture myself as an oncology nurse, as I am a cancer survivor myself."

**Second place awardee J'nai Baker** graduated from Denby High School and currently attends Wayne County Community College. J'nai is taking her pre-requisites for the nursing program. She states: "I want to show them you can still get things done with discipline, perseverance and dignity."

After facing and overcoming personal hardships to reach her goal, **Third place award-ee Desiree Perry** (photo on next page) has completed her pre-requisites and is enrolled at Macomb Community College to obtain her Associate Degree as a Nurse Practitioner. Desiree is a wife and mother of four children. ◆ The Ruby Award honors a woman who, while volunteering or working for a nonprofit organization that provides services to women and/or girls, makes an extraordinary difference in improving their lives. Not only does her work make a significant impact, but it also inspires and encourages other women. The monetary portion of the award is given in her honor to the nonprofit organization she represents.

This year SIGP's Ruby Award was given to Erin O'Mara, director of community engagement at Mercy Education Project (MEP) in Detroit. MEP provides after-school educational programs for girls from second grade through high school.

Also offered is a College and Career Readiness (CCR) program for 11th and 12th graders who are determined to be college-bound. MEP provides girls with STEAM and leadership opportunities in its summer Emerging Leaders Program.


