PASTOR LEANNE'S MESSAGE:


"Standin' In the Need of Prayer"

February takes us to the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday arrives early in the month (the 14th!) with a soup supper provided by our youth at 5:30 p.m. and Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 p.m. Then, for the next five weeks, it is traditional to emphasize spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, abstinence and almsgiving. Many people will choose something to "give up" as a sign of their willingness to endure self-denial for the sake of Christ. Lent has followed this pattern for centuries; millions of souls have found meaning and nurture in the Lenten traditions.

For this year's observance of Lent, I intend to focus on the act of prayer. Prayer is so central to the Christian life, and is one of the topics that Jesus repeatedly taught and emphasized. Without prayer, any other discipline we undertake risks becoming empty action or void ritual. Prayer connects us with the agency of the Spirit which makes us alive to greater possibilities in the life of the Divine.

On Sundays, I will be preaching a series about "Praying the Psalms" and we will walk with the Psalmist through various emotional states and expressions of faith. Sometimes, we will find the Psalmist in exuberance that God is listening to those prayers, other times, we will join the Psalmist in fear or discouragement and share in the meaning of prayers of need. In prayer, our voice will connect with the voice of God; we will be reminded that God is in control and we are not alone in this world.

On Tuesdays at noon, Feb 27th, Mar 5th and 19th, we will gather for a soup luncheon, then hear from special speakers (TBA)





on prayer in their own traditions. Following that, we will, of course, pray.

Then, on the Saturday of the Great Vigil, March 30th, those who desire to pray will meet

will me in the chapel, as we will pray for the needs of our congregation.

Prayer is especially important in a world where we sense that so many things are out of our control. The scripture teaches us that prayer changes us, yes, but it also asserts that "prayer changes things." God listens, God answers and God acts. Through a Lenten season of prayer, we will give ourselves to the presence of God and anticipate divine answers. Let us pray.


CCC Needs List for February: Kleenex tissues

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS TUESDAY, JANUARY 23, 2024



CLERK'S REPORT

The death of Marjorie Kahl, January 2, 2024 was noted. Membership is 310. Session approved the Statistical Report for 2023.

A letter from PCUSA Ministry Engagement and Support was shared, thanking FPC for the \$962.40 for the Peace and Global Witness offering.

FINANCIAL REPORT (end of 2023)

Total Income YTD Actual	\$540,216	Budget	\$525,651
Total Expense YTD Actual	\$540,668	Budget	\$590,921
NET Income	-\$452	Budget	-\$65,270

Jim Skaret explained that lower expenses than budgeted were due to lower personnel costs with no full-time custodian for much of 2023.

MODERATOR'S REPORT

Pastor Leanne thanked the Hospitality Committee for arranging the meal at the Annual Congregational Meeting and the staff for compiling the booklet.

Session approved the baptism request for Remi Lang, niece of Rusty Bender. Date set for March 16. The baptism of Koa and Iris Falcon occurred on Sunday, January 21, 2024.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—The church will likely need to change the IT provider.

Hospitality—The committee will have a planning session on January 27 to discern the best ways to serve the church family.

Proclamation-Worship and Music—The committee has prepared a list of Elders and Deacons assigned to serve communion for the whole year. The current Hymnals could be purchased on Amazon.

Proclamation-Christian Education—The youth will serve soup before the Ash Wednesday service on February 14. The Christmas project yielded enough money to purchase 15 families of chickens and 15 piglets for mission families.

Property and Equipment—A pew has been removed in the back in preparation for the streaming equipment. New lighting in the balcony is being investigated.

Resource Management—Christmas Joy special offering was \$2,773 and the Christmas Eve offering for the CCC was \$826.

Board of Deacons—Dennis Rosenkranz and Vic Sonneman were chosen as Co-Moderators. Karmen Svihovec is Secretary.

Child Care Center Board—The CCC staff members will be treated to a dinner January 25. The Net Income end of year was deficit due to fewer children enrolled.

Nominating—Session approved Marete Farver as a Deacon to replace Heather Davis who was unable to serve. There will be a congregational meeting after worship on February 4 to approve this change.

150th **Anniversary**—The booklet with photos and family histories is being prepared.
