Bloomfield Police Department Monthly Report for March 2017

This is the monthly report for the Month of March 2017 from the Bloomfield Police Department. It is the police department's goal to keep the citizens of Bloomfield Township/Village informed as to the police department's activities, statistics, and community projects. It is very important that the citizens be aware of the various concerns that have and are occurring within our community.

On Wednesday, March 1st at approximately 12:10pm officers received a battery complaint which had occurred on Clover Road. At the conclusion of the investigation charges of battery and disorderly conduct have been referred to the Walworth County District Attorney's office for a 19-year-old male. Additionally, he will also be issued traffic citations for reckless driving, operating after suspension and operating a motor vehicle without insurance.

On Sunday, March 12th at approximately 3:53am officers responded to a residence on Ivy Drive for a disorderly person complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 37-year-old female was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. Charges of disorderly conduct, resisting/obstructing a police officer and possession of marijuana have been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Sunday, March 19th, at approximately 1:26am officers executed a traffic stop on Daisy Drive for a speeding violation. At the conclusion of the traffic stop a 55-year-old female was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated 1st offense. Additionally, she was issued a traffic citation for the speeding violation.

On Sunday, March 19th, at approximately 2:49pm officers received a bail jumping complaint. While investigating this complaint, officers located 36-year-old female consuming alcoholic beverages at Spoon Doggers while under conditions of bond prohibiting her from consuming alcohol. The female was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. Charges of misdemeanor bail jumping and felony bail jumping have been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Monday, March 20th, at approximately 5:00pm officers responded to a residence on Catalpa Road for a burglary complaint. During the course of the investigation it was determined that two shotguns, one rifle and other sport related items had been taken during the burglary. Additional information surrounding this incident has been intentionally withheld as this is an ongoing investigation.

On Sunday, March 26th, at approximately 6:00pm officers responded to a residence on Laurel Road for a theft of motor vehicle complaint. During the course of the investigation it was determined that a dark green Honda all-terrain vehicle had been stolen. The vehicle has been entered as stolen. This case remains under investigation.

On Tuesday, March 28th, at approximately 4:19pm officers responded to a residence on Beech Drive for a burglary complaint. During the course of the investigation it was determined the only items taken from a detached garage were two items related to bow hunting. Additional information surrounding this incident has been intentionally withheld as this is an ongoing investigation.

On Thursday, March 30th at approximately 10:13pm officers responded to the parking lot of Chris's Steel Horse Saloon for a theft from automobile complaint. During the course of the investigation it was determined that a .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun was taken from an automobile. Additional information surrounding this incident has been intentionally withheld as this is an ongoing investigation.

During the month of March 2017 officers from the Bloomfield Police Department affected 3 arrests for warrants issued by the Bloomfield Municipal Court satisfying approximately \$1,017.00 in outstanding forfeitures.

During the month of March 2017 the Bloomfield Police Department responded to 732 calls for service compared to 982 calls for service during the month of March 2016. During the month of March 2017 the police department affected 94 arrests for various violations of Bloomfield Municipal Ordinances and Wisconsin State Statutes compared to 162 arrests during the month of March 2016.
