# September 2025 Tidings of Hope

Our purpose is to glorify God by worshipping, witnessing, teaching, loving and serving our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Dear Hope Family

"And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years," Genesis 1:14

As much as we may not like it, summer is ending, and autumn is coming. That's because of the 23.4 degree tilt of the earth and the elliptical – that's an elongated circle – orbit around the sun. #### **8. Brief Committee Reports:**


- 8a. Deacons: Mark M. reports: they have met with Pastor Peter regarding tracking visitation and Confirmation schedules.
