## I430 Key Card Blackwood

Is an excellent tool for investigating slam after our side agrees on a trump suit.

Let's review the auction on this hand:
I. 2 Hearts was game forcing ( 2 over I)
2. 3 Spades established the trump suit.
3. 4 Clubs showed $I^{\text {st }}$ round control in the club suit (an Ace or a Void)

At this point in the auction, we really need to determine the quality of our trump suit to judge slam possibilities. Luckily 1430 Key Card is designed for this purpose.


LearnBridge.nyc tip:
Before we can begin to show controls, we must be in a game forcing auction and have an agreed upon trump suit.

## The Basics:

After we agree on a trump suit we can bid 4 No - Trump to ask our partner how many key cards she has.

There are 5 Key Cards our side can possibly have. They are as follows:

- The Ace of Spades
- The Ace of Hearts
- The Ace of Diamonds
- The Ace of Clubs
- The King or our agreed upon trump suit

The Responses to 4NT:
5 C = I or 4 Key Cards (14)
5 D = 3 or 0 Key Cards (30)
5 H = 2 Key Cards without the Queen
5 S = 2 Key Cards with the Queen
Note: 5H and 5S give us information about the Queen of our trump suit. The Queen is NOT a key card.

Hint: Use the bidding box for help. Go from right to left: "14-30-2 without-2 with"

Back to our hand: Our partner has responded to our 4NT bid with 5 spades. This shows 2 key cards with the Queen of trumps.
We have 2 key cards in our hand so our side has a total of 4 key cards and the Queen of our trump suit. Can we play slam?

## Key Card Requirements for Slam:

- When we have all 5 key cards we can bid at least a small slam.
- When we have 4 key cards and the Queen of trumps we can bid a small slam (6 Level).
- We should NOT bid slams without at least 4 key cards and the Queen.


So with 4 key cards and the Queen of trumps we can play our small slam by bidding 6 Spades.

Here is the full deal:
We have bid a nice small slam with an excellent chance of success.

We can see how important the Queen of trumps is on this hand. If we take that card away from the North hand our chances of success drop dramatically.


Our partner's response of 5 Spades was very helpful because we were able to find out about her key cards and her Queen of trumps. A 5 Heart response from partner would have kept us out of slam. (as we would have 4 key cards but no Queen). So, how do we find the Queen of trumps after a 5 Club or 5 Diamond response from partner?

## FINDING THE QUEEN OF TRUMPS

Finding the Queen of trumps is very simple when partner responds 5 Hearts or 5 Spades to our 4NT bid. Both 5 H and 5 S include the location of the Queen of trumps.

What happens when partner responds 5 Clubs or 5 Diamonds?

On the hand to the right our partner has shown I keycard (5C $=1$ or 4 but we know it can't be 4 because we are looking at 3 keycards in our hand). We can not play slam with only 4 keycards, but we can play slam if we have 4 keycards and the Queen of trumps.


So how do we ask partner about the Queen of trumps?

After a 5 Club or 5 Diamond we ask for the Queen of trumps by bidding the next available suit (that is not the trump suit).

So in our hand, after partner's 5C response we would ask for the Queen by bidding 5D. This bid is called the "Queen Ask"

Simple Responses are:

- Without the Queen we signoff in our major.
- With the Queen we bid 6 of our major.

Note: Don't worry we will complicate these responses further when we talk about PLAYING GRAND SLAM in a later episode.


LearnBridge.nyc reminder:
We only need to ask for the Queen when we have at least 4 keycards.

Here is the full deal: Partner bid 6 Spades! Which is the correct response
to our Queen asking bid of 5D
Way to go Partner!!
Another fine slam for our side!

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
