Dear Friends, these past six months have brought change, but the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse has never been more alive! In February, Br. Regis retired after 53 years of tireless work; loving the poor in the missions across the world. And this June, Sr. Dora has also retired from the warehouse after 23 years. Their names will always be synonymous with the warehouse and we have celebrated their work with a commemoration at the warehouse, but more importantly, we will honor them by continuing Br Regis's and Sr. Dora's efforts for the next 50 years!

My name is David Holton and I am the new director of the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse. I have been part of the Salvatorian family for more than five years as the associate vocations director. I have been guided by the Holy Spirit to follow in Br. Regis's footsteps and create new "steps" to lead a warehouse full of unbelievably dedicated volunteers who help send needed goods across the world, while also striving to increase donations of supplies from local vendors and improve our global reach through the financial assistance of our donors.

As demonstrated by the enclosed pictures and letters, the Salvatorian Mission indeed is alive and strong! Since January 2015, we have sent 21 containers to eight missions worldwide at an average cost of \$6000 per container. As Fr. Francis Jordan has said, we must continue to *believe, trust, hope, love* and *work* to lead all to Jesus Christ. This has been our call since baptism. Greetings from Guatemala. After talking with you today and hearing your news that you will soon be retiring I want to take this opportunity to give thanks to God and to you for your many years of faithful service to us and to so many others around the globe. As the shipments came in over the years I always wished that you could see the joy and anticipation on the part of those who received all you sent. The ohs and ahs expressed as we uncovered the multiple Items all of which have been of so very much use to so very many. Everywhere we go we see folks walking around in Lands End clothes and hear their comments about how sturdy they are. Since clothes here are washed by hand on rocks in the river, most clothes

don't last for more than a half a dozen washes. But these are sturdier and therefore last longer. The paper goods are always a huge hit, not to mention the sweets which are in high demand. Need I mention the toys, which always but even more especially at this time of the year are grabbed up almost before we can unpack them. We try to see that at least every family gets one. The hats, carrying bags and bed clothes are also very special especially when you barely make enough money to keep tortillas and beans on the table. It was really special when you had medicines and nutritional supplements available but since you say donations are way down again, we can only pray that corporate America isn't throwing them into land-fills instead of getting them out to where they are really needed.
