Bloomfield Police Department Monthly Report for November 2019

This is the monthly report for the Month of November 2019 from the Bloomfield Police Department. It is the police department's goal to keep the citizens of Bloomfield Township/Village informed as to the police department's activities, statistics, and community projects. It is very important that the citizens be aware of the various concerns that have and are occurring within our community.

On Sunday, November 3rd at approximately 7:15pm officers responded to the 1000 block of Tombeau Road for a disorderly conduct complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 39-year-old male was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. Charges of battery and disorderly conduct have been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Tuesday, November 5th at approximately 5:05pm officers responded to the 600 block of N2020 Hwy H for a disorderly conduct complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 43-year-old male was issued a non-traffic citation for possession of drug paraphernalia. Additionally, a referral for disorderly conduct has been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Friday, November 15th at approximately 2:24am officers responded to the 800 block of Roman Ln. for a disorderly conduct complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 22-year-old male was issued a non-traffic citation for possession of marijuana. Additionally, a referral for disorderly conduct has been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Sunday, November 17th at approximately 2:30am officers responded to the area of S. Lakeshore Dr. and Thistle Rd. for a disorderly conduct complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 34-year-old male and a 21-year-old male were each issued a non-traffic citation for disorderly conduct.

On Sunday, November 17th at approximately 3:06pm officers responded to the 1900 block of Schiatel Rd. for an illegal dumping complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 58-year-old male was issued non-traffic citations for trespass to land and littering.

On Friday, November 22nd at approximately 12:50pm officers responded to a personal injury crash at the intersection of Pell Lake Dr. and Hwy U. At the conclusion of the investigation one driver, a 64-year-old female was issued a traffic citation for operating a motor vehicle without insurance. The second driver was issued traffic citations for operating a motor vehicle without insurance and following too closely.

On Wednesday, November 27th at approximately 4:32pm officers responded to the area of Hwy 50 and Eastside Rd. for a two vehicle crash. At the conclusion of the investigation a 62-year-old male was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. The victim, a 40-year-old female reported that someone had broken the drivers side widow of her vehicle \sim this complaint remains under investigation.

During the month of November 2019, the Bloomfield Police Department responded to 816 calls for service compared to 794 calls for service during the month of November 2018. During the month of November 2019, the police department affected 141 arrests for various violations of Bloomfield Municipal Ordinances and Wisconsin State Statutes compared 140 arrests during the month of November 2018.
