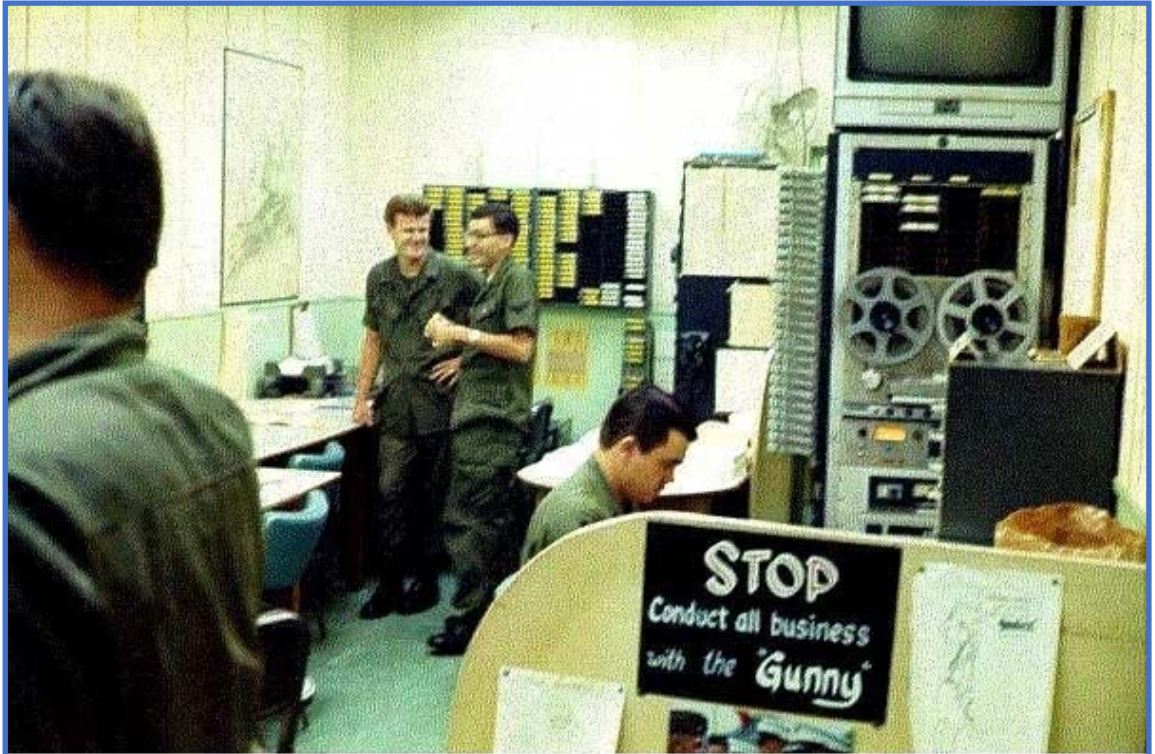

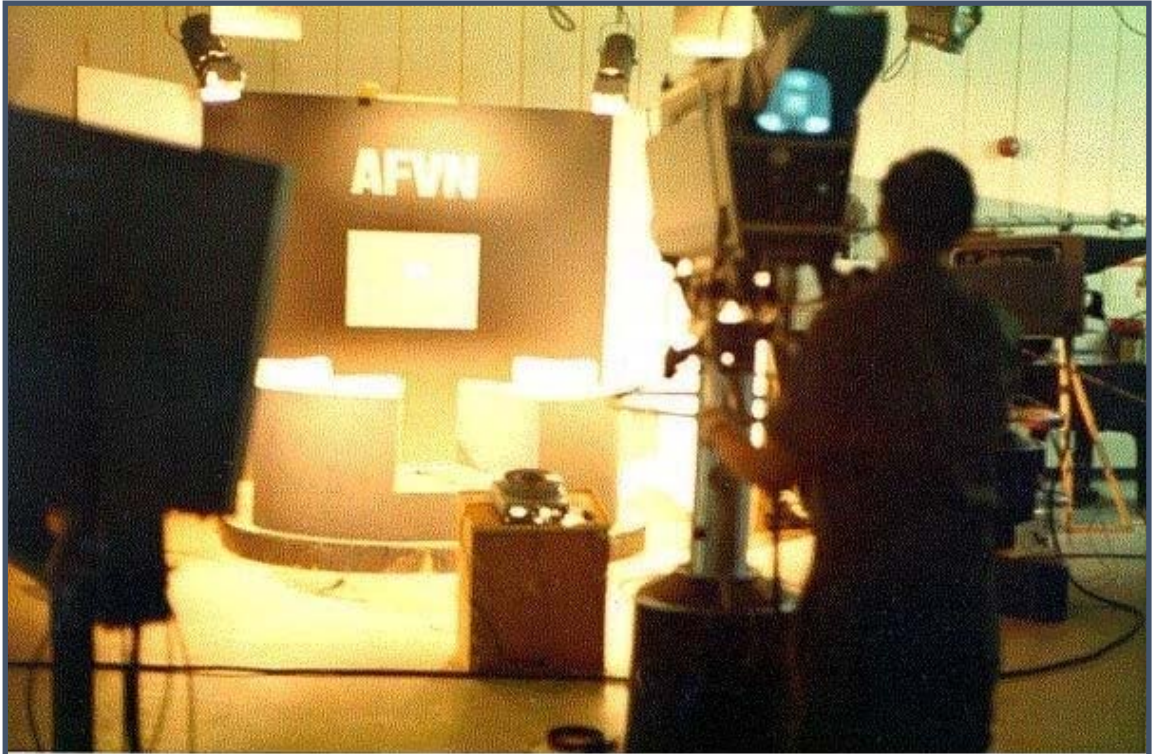

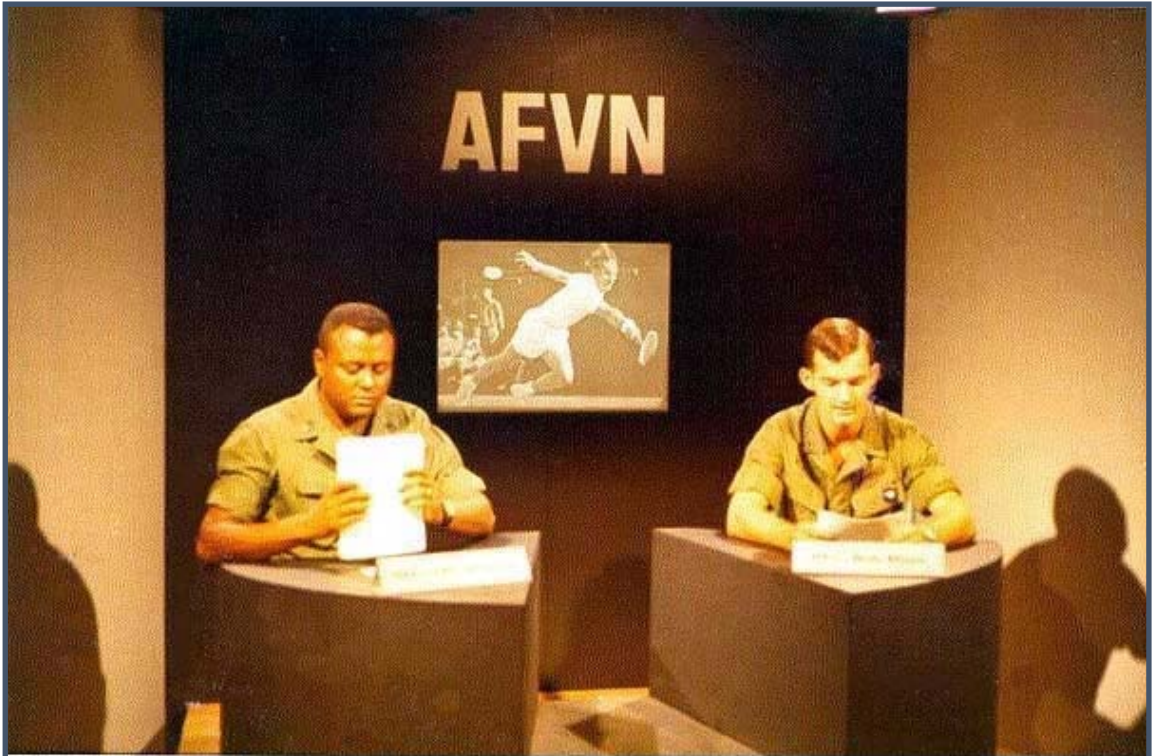

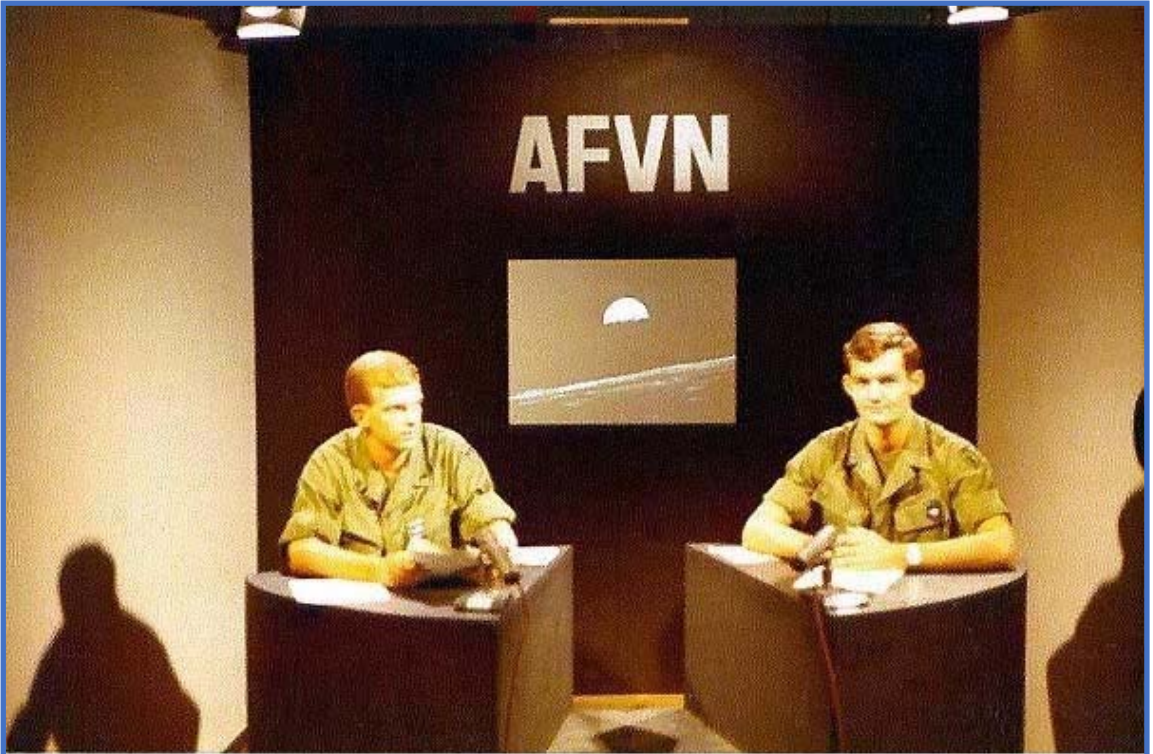

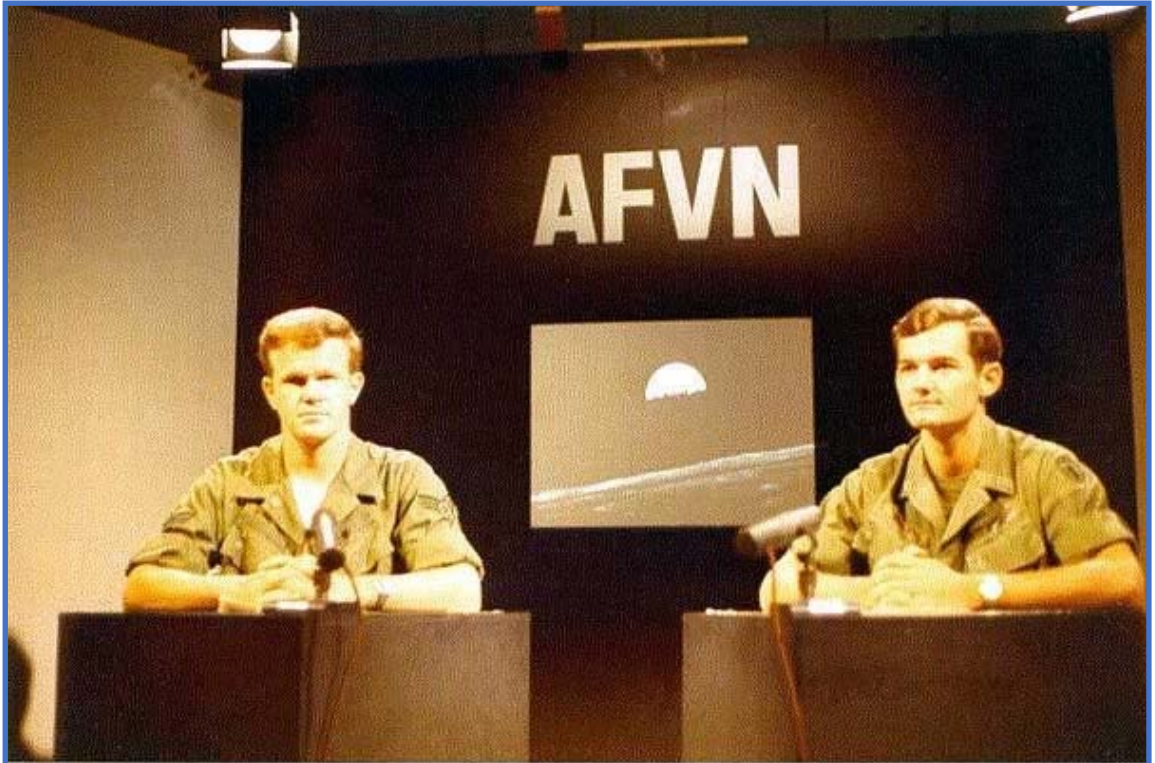

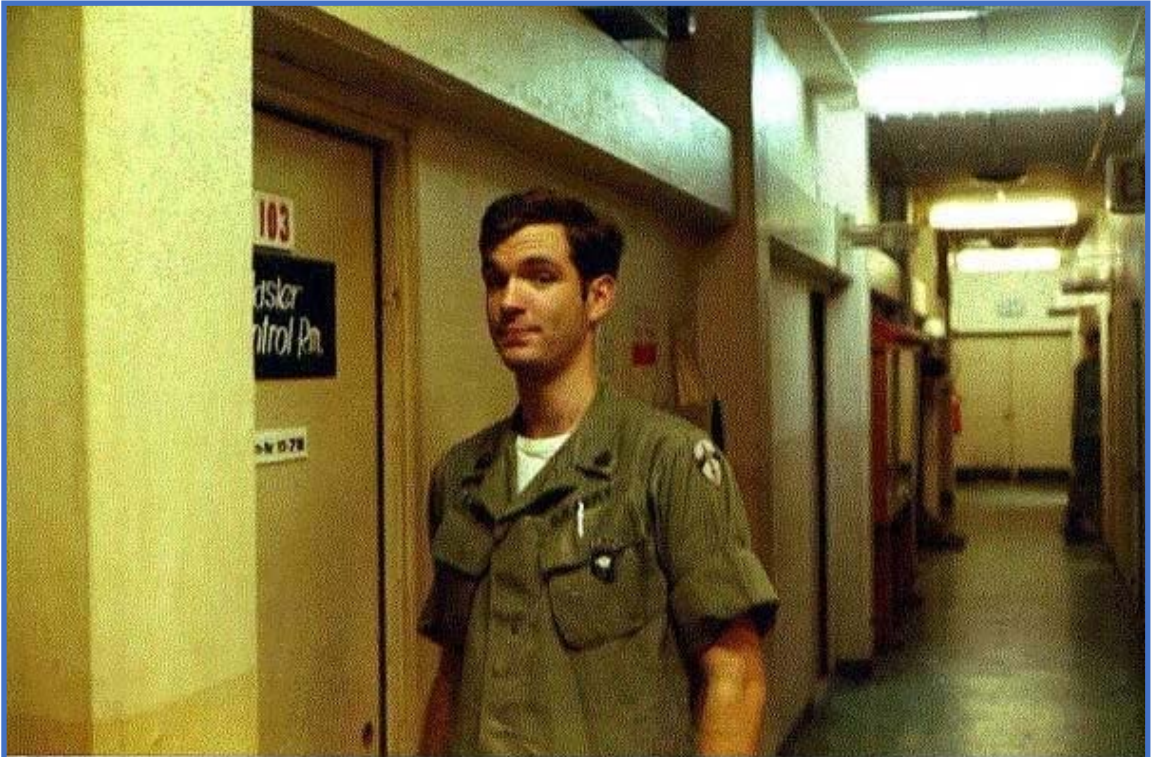

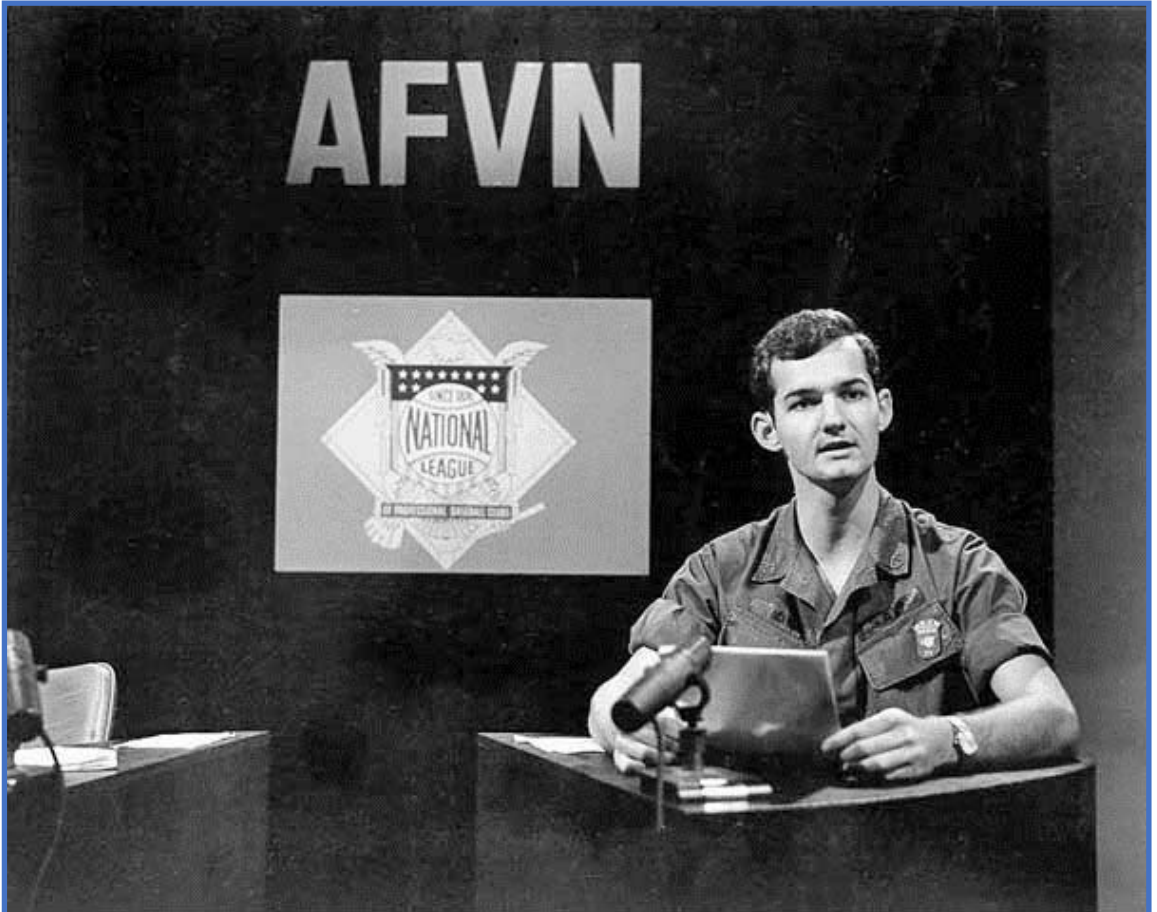


This is a picture of the AM Master Control, where the DJ's put on their shows. This is where all AM program material is put on the air.

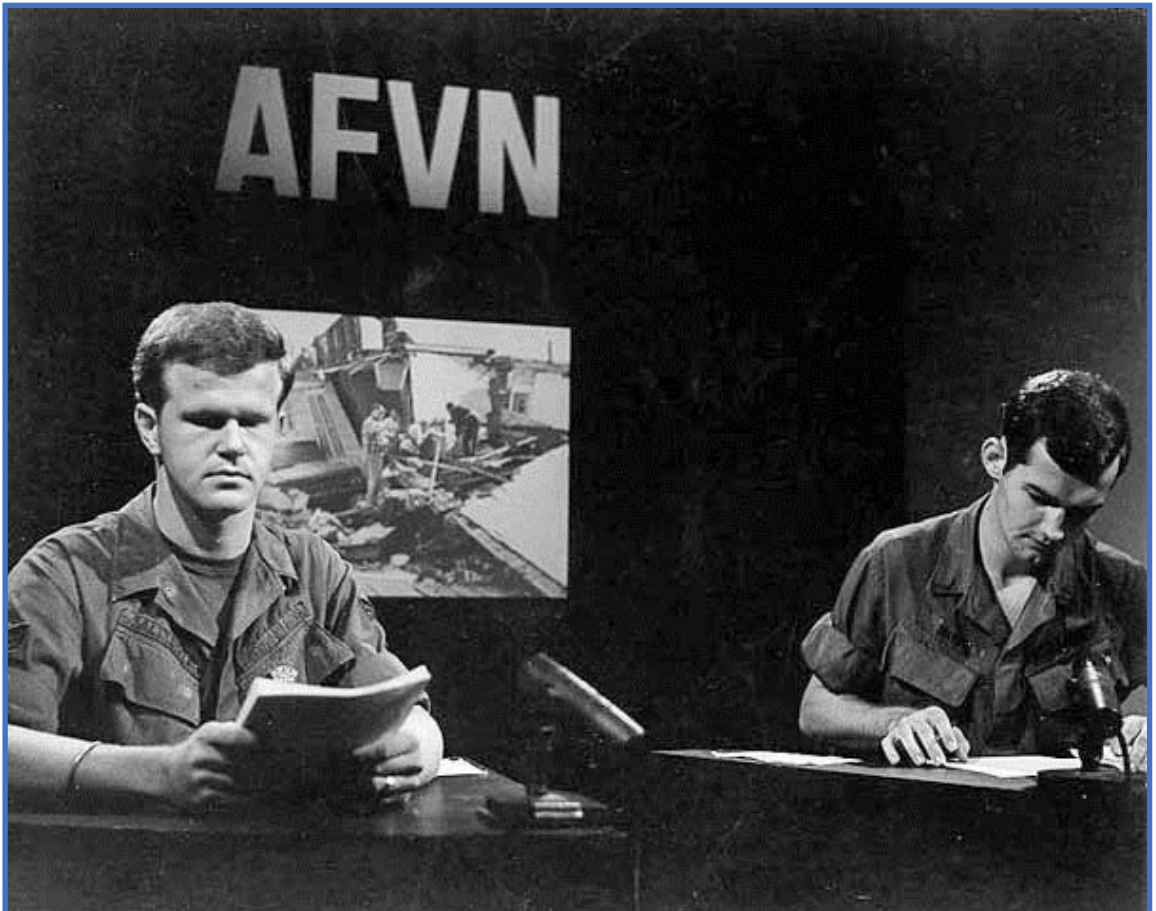

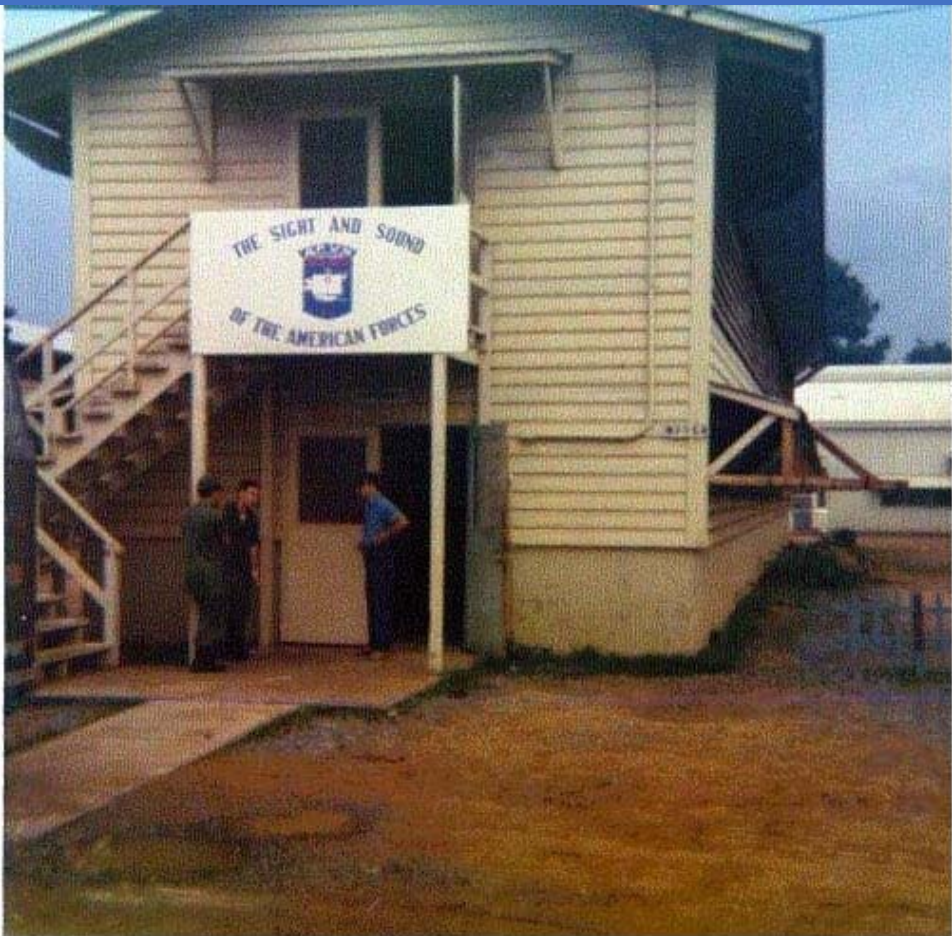

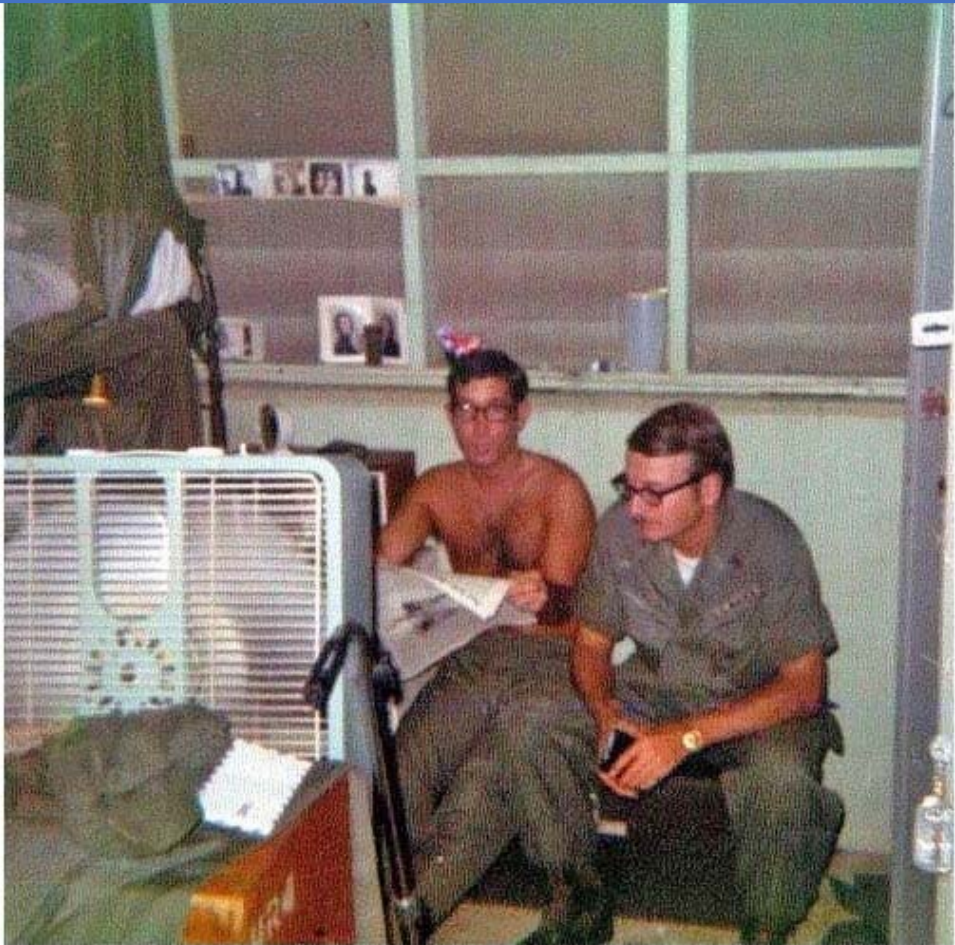

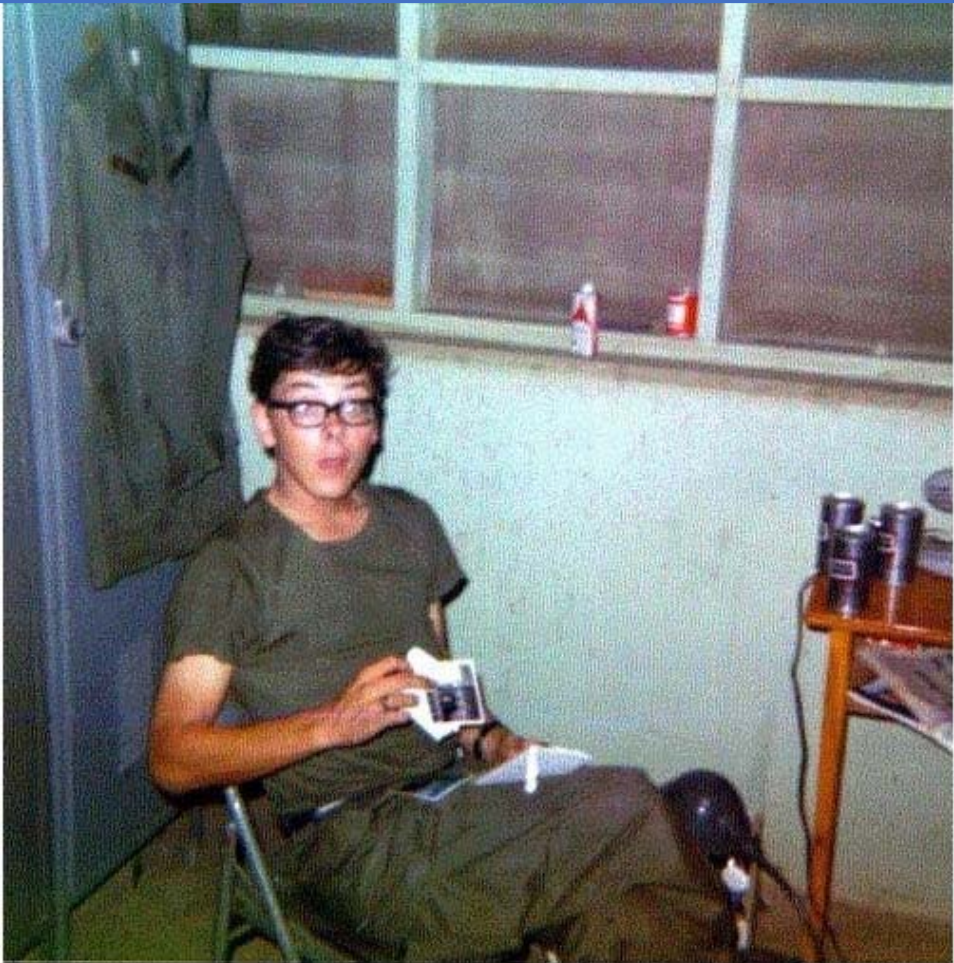

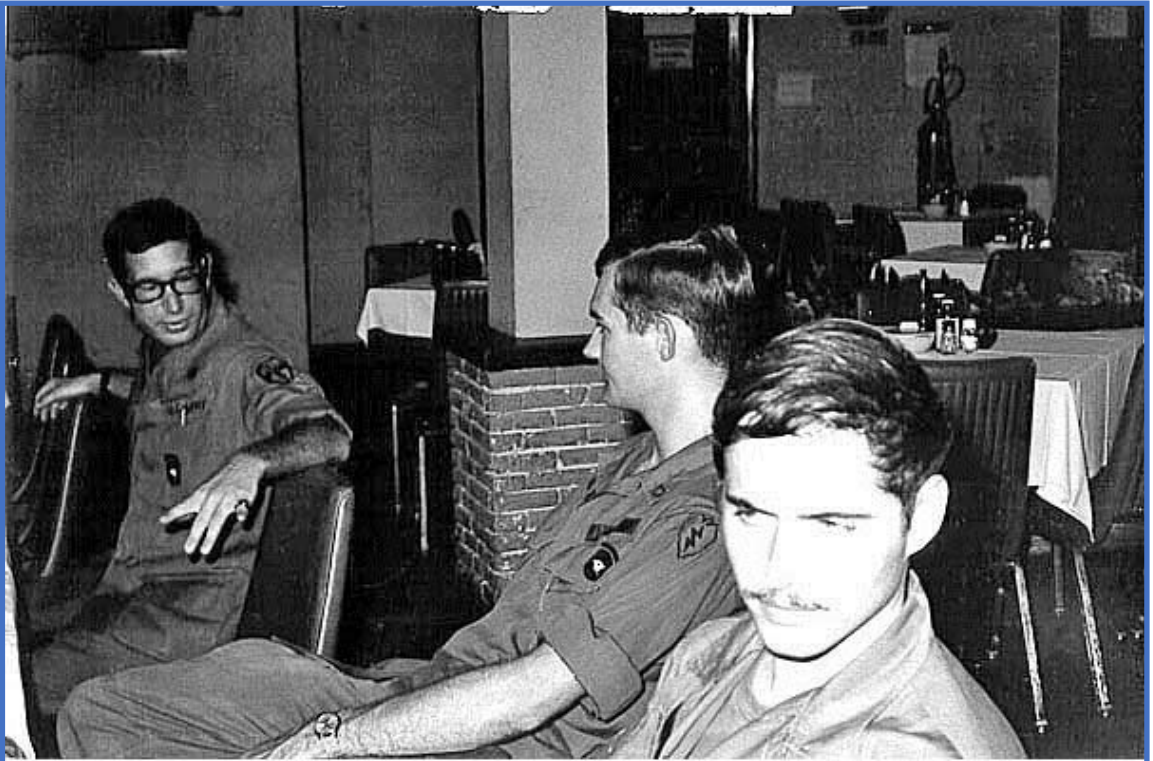
