

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

3rd Sunday of Advent

Matthew 11:2-11

"Nothing but praise for you...." Yes, that is the title of an old Dallas Holm album (1970's Gospel Singer, who had the inspiriting hit 'Joy Comes in the Morning'). But in today's gospel Jesus reflects a similar 'nothing but praise' sentiment toward John the Baptist saying, "of those born of women, no one is greater" (Mt 3:11). Jesus will go on to identify John as a contemporary version of the great 'Elijah' (Mt 3:14). Yet even aside from Jesus' recognition of him, it is clear that John the Baptist had quite 'the following'. A sign of him being a very poplar prophet, is reflected in the fact that John even had "disciples", too! We hear about them today in this reading of Matt 11:2, and they are referred to additionally in Matt 9:14 when John's disciples ask Jesus about fasting. Over in Luke 11:1, Jesus will not seem to measure up to John, when Jesus' own disciples ask him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." Some of the disciples of Jesus were once John's followers - we know by name, one of them, Andrew (John 1:35, 37 & 40). And later in Matthew 14:12 we will hear about John's disciples lovingly preparing and burying John's body after his execution. Recalling that John's job was to point out Messiah when he at last He came (Luke 1:76), John does perform that duty singling Jesus out as the Saving One to follow (Matt 3:11, John 1:29, 36). However, if some of John's disciples had an inordinate attachment to him, they may have needed extra urging to move on over and become disciples of Jesus. So, a problem arises of how to properly transfer John's disciples over to Jesus' discipleship. John had some 'hangers-on' who hadn't moved on to following Jesus yet. That could explain here, why John seems not to know if Jesus is the one or not (Matt 11:3 asking 'should we look for another?') But we know that John knows that Jesus is the One! So, John sends these still-faithful disciples of his, on a mission to ask Jesus more details about His ministry. John knows that once he makes such a personal introduction of them to Jesus, they will encounter Christ for themselves and realize that yes, Jesus is the One! John only needs to set up the meeting and Jesus will touch their hearts, convincing them that He is the promised savior who was to come. Just being personally in the presence of Jesu, then they will know what to do! And that is what happens! Personally encountering Jesus makes the difference!

Yet, while Jesus does give the highest praise to John as a prophetic vessel of God's grace, I like how Jesus goes on to add an important check against any possible 'spiritual pride' that may arise in such a recipient of divine praise (in this case for John, but it goes for any servant of God, too)! Jesus adds that as great as John is for his successful ministry on earth, John is still only another child of God alongside everyone else in the kingdom! John had unparalleled charismatic gifts of prophecy, but John is only an instrument like every other servant of God. Jesus adds about John that as good a propjet as he is, "yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he" (Matt 11:11). This is a common reminder of Jesus to everyone, that we must all acknowledge God as the source of any/all good that we may perform. John may do great things, but it is God working in John that is accomplishing the good (not John, but God to be glorified!) What do people say but that, "Jesus is the carpenter, and his disciple is only the tool in his hand!" John knows this and will readily admit his humble servant status. In Matthew 3:11, John will say, "I am not worthy to carry his sandals", before going on to say his own baptism is as common as water, compared to Jesus' baptism by the Holy Spirit and Fire. John, as a meek servant, deflects all praise to God as the source of any good in him. Related to Jesus, John will even say, "He must increase, and I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). Always the properly humble instrument of God, John the Baptist models perfectly the disposition that Jesus will later praise in Luke 17:10, "We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." Peter also models this meek humility. One time when Cornelius, after receiving a miracle from Peter, Cornelius bows in worship of Peter. And Peter quickly refuses such praise, scolding him, saying, "Stand up, I am only a human being" (Acts 10:26) But we also find this lowly attitude in the Blessed Mother, as she offers a great example of this humble, servant of God disposition too, when praying, "I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word"-Luke 1:38) May we always be as humble and helpful to God! Peace. Fr brian


