ORDINANCE NO. 16-02

All fireworks are prohibited except certain “common fireworks,” or “safe and sane” fireworks.

Common fireworks are only allowed from noon on July 3rd until midnight on July 4th.

Copies of the full ordinance can be found on the website at www.rockfordwa.com or at Town Hall. It is the policy of the Town of Rockford to conform to Federal and State policies with reference to the subject matters of this ordinance. The provisions of this ordinance notwithstanding, it shall be unlawful to use, explode or detonate fireworks and cap pistols in a promiscuous, careless manner.

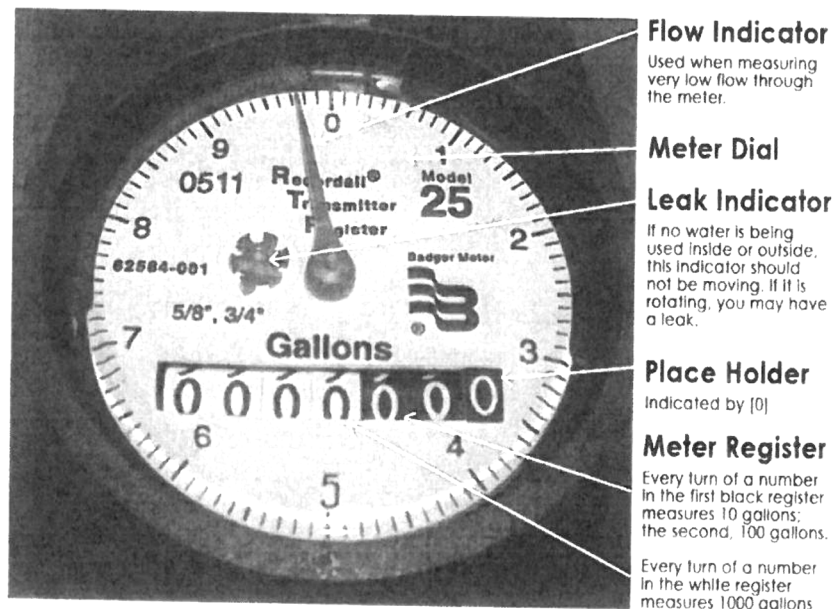

HOW TO READ YOUR WATER METER

Each month, except winter months, town staff provides the orange meter reading slips with your utility bill. While it is very helpful to Public Works when residents read their own outside water meters, it is NOT required. If you choose to read your own outside water meter, or if you own a home with an inside water meter, below is a diagram showing how to do so. Where meters are installed indoors, the resident or owner is responsible for providing monthly meter readings to the town with their monthly payment, on or before the 20th of each month.

- All meters have one or two place holder zero's, depending on the size. Some remote readers have three place holder zero's.
- When you read your meter, please right down all the numbers including the place holder number and underline it.
Example for the picture shown: 0,000,000
