We had 96 players for the Pinehurst tournament. That's a little lower than last month - I hope it's because of the heat and something we're not doing! The format is always fun for players with complimentary games. 54 players took home \$4,000 in winnings,

If you guessed B flight, you are correct. In the past two tournaments, we have had not paid all the closest pots because players recorded their name in the wrong flight. When that happens, the player or team does not get paid. Maybe worse, somewhere in the flight where the erroneously name is written, there is a player or team that lost out, through no fault of their own. We printed new closest cards to clearly separate the flight lists, and we print the flight in jumbo size on the scorecard, so I'm not sure what else we can do. When you compete in a tournament, there are several things you are responsible for, and knowing your flight is one of them.

Next month is the Club Championship on September 9-11. It is individual stroke play, with several things going on. In addition to our tournament, 2-4 players may be eligible to represent us in some of the SCGA Tournaments of Club Champions (TOCC) this fall. Net Flights – 4 flights playing Saturday and Sunday only. The flight winner with the lowest net score may play in the Net TOCC.

Club Champion – Low gross score playing Friday, Saturday, and Sunday; blue tees only. May play in the Champ TOCC if index is 2.4 or less, otherwise may play in the Net TOCC.

Senior Club Champion – Low gross score playing Friday, Saturday, and Sunday; blue tees only; age 55 & above. May play in the Senior TOCC if index is 5.4 or less.

To be eligible, you must have been a member June 30th, played in 3 tournaments and/or 9 skins games, or be a former club champion from the last 5 years.

Entry fee is \$150, and includes Saturday and Sunday golf, lunch, skins and closests. Those playing Friday will pay for that separately.

After golf on Sunday, we will have our annual meeting, including a raffle with thousands of dollars' worth of merchandise. All of your 50/50 tickets for the year will be in the barrel, as well as extra raffle tickets sold that day. Even if you don't play in the tournament, please come out for the meeting and raffle!

Signups for a guaranteed spot in the tournament close Saturday September 2, Tuesday September 5 if we have room. Remember, once we commit our tee times with the course, the rest of the tee sheet sells out, so no more adding tee times later in the week. Please sign up EARLY by emailing Doug at dbenc@ap.org. We will publish the roster of signed up players on the Wednesday before the tournament, and release pairings by Friday.
