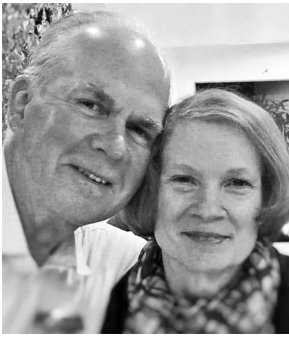

Hi Friends,

Linda & I are delighted to host a tour to biblical sites in the lands of Greece and Turkey. "In the Steps of Paul and John in Greece and Turkey" is scheduled for April 27 - May 8, 2020. We want to take this means to invite you to travel with us!

Upon our arrival in Athens, Greece, our itinerary is packed with biblical sites, starting with Athens, Corinth and on up to Delphi. We continue northward through what was Macedonia, but today is Grecian territory, visiting biblical sites of Berea, Thessalonica, and Philippi. Then on to Amphipolis and then to Neapolis, thus seeing all the sites mentioned in connection with Paul's 2nd and 3rd Journeys in biblical Achaia and Macedonia!

We are then to cross the Aegean Sea, and in western Turkey visit Troas and Assos. Then we will begin our visit of the cities of the Seven Churches of Asia, to whom Jesus wrote specific letters through the apostle John (Rev. 2-3). Jesus referred to Pergamum as the place where Satan had his throne, but God had his people there also! While at Laodicea, we will also see Colossae and Hierapolis (Col. 4:13). Ephesus is where Paul labored 3 years (Acts 20:31), and it was his teaching here that resulted in the establishment of many of the churches of Asia (Acts 19:10).

The tour will conclude in historic Istanbul. The archaeological museum will be a high point of interest as will be the world's largest bazaar, 4,000 shops under one roof!

Our USA point of departure and return is Atlanta. We have some excellent prices: \$3,699.00 per person roundtrip. Here is a breakdown of pricing: air/land tour price is only \$3,219; government taxes/airline fuel surcharges are currently \$480, making the total \$3,699.00. Additionally I will collect \$150 per passenger for tips which I will distribute among our guides, drivers, hotel staff & porters, etc.

Value of touring Greece/Turkey. When folks think of the Bible lands, most of us first think of Israel, and for good reason! YOUR DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

MON, APR 27 – ATLANTA/ACROSS THE ATLANTIC

Depart from Atlanta International Airport today on board your overnight transatlantic jet flight. Your adventure begins!

TUE, APR 28 – ARRIVE ATHENS

Arrive in Athens where you will be met and escorted to your motor coach for transfer to your hotel. (D)

WED, APR 29 – ATHENS – CORINTH

Early this morning, depart for Corinth, where Paul was centrally located for his ministry. The vigorous Gentile Church that he founded here in 50 AD prompted him to write at least two letters to them. Visit the ancient ruins of the city where Paul worked with Priscilla and Aquila. See the remains of the first century shops, the agora where Paul's trial by Gallio took place, the Fountain of Peirene, the Temple of Apollo, and the Bema.

This afternoon, return to Athens and see the Royal Palace, the Stadium and Temple of Zeus, the Theatre of Dionysius and the Agora (marketplace) where Paul spoke and Socrates' prison. Visit Mars Hill and the Acropolis with the famous Parthenon. (B,D)

THU, APR 30 – ATHENS/DELPHI/KALAMBAKA

Depart Athens this morning and drive on the national highway through Thebes, Levadia and the picturesque village of Arachova to Delphi. Visit the archeological site in Delphi which has the Temple of Apollo, the Tholos, the theater, the stadium, the Treasuries of the Athenians and the Syphnias. Also visit the Castalian Spring and the Delphi Museum to see the famous Bronze Charioteer and other statues. Drive to Kalambaka for the night. (B,D)

FRI, MAY 1 – KALAMBAKA/VERIA/THESSALONIKI

This morning, depart for Meteora to view the "Hanging Monasteries". These impressive ancient monasteries are suspended between earth and sky, atop huge granite rocks. Drive through the beautiful countryside of Northern Greece

and visit Veria (Ancient Berea). Continue on to Thessaloniki for the night. Paul preached in Thessaloniki during the winters of 50-49 AD and wrote epistles to the ancient Thessalonians. See the ramparts of the city, the triumphal Arch of Galerius starting the Via Egnatia, once a strategic artery of the Roman Empire, and the seafront promenade with the White Tower. We spend the night in Thessaloniki. (B,D)

SAT, MAY 2 – THESSALONIKI/PHILIPPI/KAVALA

Today, continue your tour of Thessaloniki with a visit to the Roman Market, Theater, *Museum at Thessaloniki* and Baths. Jason's House is now called the Church of Agios Nikolaos Orfanos. The site where the monastery of Vlatadon was built is believed to be the location where Jason's house once stood and where Paul was accommodated during his visit to Thessaloniki. Next, drive to Philippi where Paul delivered his first sermon in Europe, sowing the seeds of Christianity. *We will make a brief stop at Amphipolis to view the location of the newly discovered tomb and visit the archaeological museum there.* We will then continue onto Philippi, where Paul baptized Lydia as the first Christian convert in Europe. The Roman forum, completely excavated, is from after Paul's time. Among the ruins, located on the rocky ledge above the town's main road is the prison where Paul and Silas were confined. Continue into the modern port city of Kavala, ancient Neapolis, where Paul first set foot in Europe accompanied by Silas, Luke, and Timothy. Overnight in Kavala. (B,D)

SUN, MAY 3 – KAVALA/TROAS/ASSOS

This morning cross into Turkey and drive through the First World War Battlefields of Gallipoli. Cross by ferry to the Asia Minor side. Continue to Troas, where Paul met with disciples on the 1st day of the week to break bread. Then we will continue on to Assos, the seaside town also visited by Paul, where we will visit the Temple of Athena. Overnight in Assos. (B,D)

MON, MAY 4 – ASSOS/PERGAMUM/IZMIR

Today, drive to Pergamum (modern day Bergama) and visit one of the Seven Churches of Revelation. Here, view the ancient ruins of the famous temples dedicated to the healing gods of Asklepios and Serapis, along with the Acropolis, the Temple of Athens, and the Trojan Temple. This city was considered diabolical by early Christians because of the many pagan temples located here. Next we will visit the museum at Bergama. From Pergamum continue to Thyatira (Akhisar) for a brief stop. Then continue to Izmir, ancient Smyrna, and one of the Seven Churches of Revelation. Smyrna is hidden under modern Izmir, but you will view the archeological remains of the Agora. (B,D)

TUE, MAY 5 – IZMIR/SARDIS/PHILADELPHIA/ LAODICEA/COLOSSAE/PAMUKKALE

This morning drive to Sardis, site of a third Church of Revelation. Visit the Temple of Artemis, the recently constructed gymnasium and the largest Synagogue in Asia Minor. Continue to ancient Philadelphia, also one of the Seven Churches of Revelation and see the remaining walls. On to Laodicea, another one of the Seven Churches of Revelation and then to Colossae. End in Pamukkale. (B,D)

WED, MAY 6 – PAMUKKALE/HIERAPOLIS/ EPHESUS/ISTANBUL

This morning, visit the ruins of Hierapolis and the natural pools. Next, drive through the meandering Valley to Ephesus, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World and the First Church of Revelation. Ephesus was the capital of Roman Asia Minor and Paul preached and taught here for over two years. View the magnificent harbor and the great amphitheatre which seated nearly 25,000 people. See Marble Street, the Library of Celsius, a gymnasium and the Temple of Hadrian. You will also see the Temple of Diana, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World and the site of the scene of religious riots. St. Paul founded the Church here and was also imprisoned in Ephesus. Also visit the Basilica of St. John, whose later life and death are associated *with Ephesus and the museum of Ephesus in the nearby city of Selcuk.* Following this tour, transfer to the Izmir airport for an early evening flight to Istanbul. Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel for the night. (B,D)

THU, MAY 7 – ISTANBUL

Today, your sightseeing of Istanbul today will include a visit to the Topkapi Palace, home of the Ottoman Sultans with visits to the Treasury containing jewel encrusted thrones, the world's largest emerald and the famous Topkapi Dagger. Then, on to St. Sophia, originally a Christian Basilica conceived by Constantine and rebuilt by Justinian, turned into a Mosque in 1453, and in 1920 made into a museum by Ataturk for all to enjoy regardless of creed. You will also see the legendary Blue Mosque with its six minarets and dome of 109 feet. Next, visit the Archaeological Museum which houses the sarcophagus of Alexander the Great and other Biblical artifacts. Finally, stop at the Grand Bazaar, a labyrinth of over 4,000 shops displaying everything from souvenirs in copper and onyx to precious jewelry, antiques and Oriental carpets. End the day with a relaxing boat ride on the Bosphorus. Overnight in Istanbul. (B,D)

FRI, MAY 8 – ISTANBUL/ATLANTA

This morning, transfer to the airport for your flight to Atlanta, arriving home with memories of a fantastic journey! (B)

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

Credit cards will only be accepted prior to the final payment due date. Credit card charges cannot be accepted over the telephone. Tour members who want to use a credit card for final payment should contact Nawas at the time final payment is due for further information.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A U.S.A. passport valid for at least 6 months after the return date of the trip is required to travel. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to check their passport's expiration date. U.S.A. and non-U.S.A. citizens may require visas in addition to a valid passport. It is the sole responsibility of non-U.S.A. citizens (including green card holders) to ensure they have the required visas/travel documents for each country to be visited on their tour and for re-entry into the U.S.A. Visa fees (if any) are not included in the tour price.

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

AIR TRANSPORTATION: By any IATA/ARC air carrier or other scheduled jet carrier in standard economy class. Flights and air routings are at the discretion of air carriers and are subject to change without notice. Air arrangements are based on non-refundable bulk group airfares and cannot be upgraded. Cancellations made after air tickets have been issued are subject to full cancellation penalties as imposed by the airlines. Per TSA regulations, airline tickets must bear your first, middle, and last name as it appears on your passport and passengers are responsible to bear any name-change fees should they not provide Nawas with accurate passport information.

AIRLINE SEATING: Nawas contracts non-refundable bulk group airfares in standard economy class. **Airlines no longer provide seat assignments for groups and Nawas does not guarantee specific seat assignments.** Seat assignments for groups are made at the discretion of the airline and are typically allocated by automated airline computer systems in alphabetical order. Seat assignments will not be advised until check in at the airport. Nawas cannot request and does not guarantee specific seat assignments.

TAXES/AIRLINE SURCHARGES: U.S. departure taxes, overseas airport taxes, overseas local government taxes, airline security fees and airline imposed international surcharges are included (taxes/surcharges current estimate as of March 25, 2019 is \$480 per person). Future price increases may be applied due to additional costs as imposed by a supplier or governments.

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION: By deluxe motorcoach.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Accommodations at first class/select hotels based on two persons sharing a twin bedded room with private bath. Nawas cannot guarantee roommates. A person taking a single room (subject to availability) must pay a supplement of \$900. Single rooms are limited and may be small.
